Resolution urging the State of California and all state agencies including the Department of Motor Vehicles to implement Assembly Bill 60.

WHEREAS, AB 60, will promote safer roads as it provides immigrants with the opportunity to obtain adequate training, testing, and insurance to become secure drivers; and,

WHEREAS, AB 60 will benefit the state of California's workforce by facilitating the efficiency of commute for immigrants, who serve a significant role in the state's labor force; and

WHEREAS, The American Insurance Association, United Farm Workers of America International Chamber of Commerce, California Labor Federation, American Civil Liberties Union, Mexican American Legal Defense & Educational Fund, and Congress of California Seniors support the measure, recognizing that its passage helps ensure public safety as it creates a new group of qualified licensed and insured drivers; and,

WHEREAS, The measure was passed by both houses of the legislature last month; and,

WHEREAS. The bill was improperly removed from the Governor's desk prior to his signing of the measure; and,

WHEREAS. Governor Davis neither signed nor vetoed the bill therefore, it shall take effect on January 1, 2002; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges all state agencies, including the Department of Motor Vehicles, to implement AB 60 on January 1, 2002.
