San Francisco Juvenile Probation Commissioner Dirk J. Beijen

Commissioner Beijen is a native San Franciscan, a veteran, a parent, a grandparent, and a retired San Francisco Police lieutenant. During a police career of more than 33 years, he worked in a variety of assignments -- most recently in the Investigations Bureau's Juvenile Section. In that capacity, he served as the officer-in-charge of the Internet Crimes Against Children Unit, as the officer-in-charge of the Youth Guidance Center Liaison, and as the liaison officer with the Community Assessment and Referral Center. Concurrent with those duties, he was in charge of the Police Department's Hostage/Crisis Negotiation Teams. He received numerous medals, awards, and commendations, and, more significantly, earned the respect of his fellow officers and the community members he served. Since the fall of 2000, he has been a teacher and mentor for students at the Life Learning Academy, a charter high school that serves "at risk" youth in San Francisco. He also serves our city's youth as a member of the San Francisco Police Activities League's Board of Directors.

It is the philosophy of this commissioner to support and encourage the Juvenile Probation Department in its efforts to deserve the public's and the youthful offender's trust by using effective, compassionate, and principle based supervision, community and educational resources, and, when appropriate, alternatives to detention that promote rehabilitation and integrate the rules of balanced and restorative justice.

Commissioner Beijen graduated at the top of his class from the San Francisco Police Academy and from the Federal Bureau of Investigation National Academy. He has an AA degree (Liberal Studies) from City College of San Francisco, a BA (major: Psychology, minor: Sociology) from San Francisco State University, a Certificate (Criminal Justice Education) from the University of Virginia, a MPA (Public Administration) from Golden Gate University, a Graduate Certificate (Applied Psychology) from Golden Gate University, and two teaching credentials.

Dear Supervisors Campos, Alioto-Pier and Mar:

Please accept this formal correspondence offered in support of Commissioner Dirk Beijen's reappointment to a second term on the Juvenile Probation Commission. It is submitted for your consideration in conjunction with your Rules Committee deliberation set for April 1, 2010.

When Commissioner Beijen was appointed to his first term of office, he brought with him years of experience in dealing with at-risk youth as a police officer, teacher, coach and mentor. His knowledge of the juvenile justice system, in particular, displayed a comprehensive understanding of rehabilitation, accountability, reconciliation and redemption. All of these concepts are cornerstone values of the Juvenile probation Department (JPD).

Commissioner Beijen's vision and leadership on the Juvenile Probation Commission has enriched the collective efforts of this body to advance the Department's commitment to pre-trial diversion, community based detention alternatives and gender specific programming. His membership on a disproportionate minority contact (DMC) work group supporting the Department's efforts to procure a California state grant that addressed DMC helped frame the need and design of the successful bid. His sense of duty and stewardship also helped forge a successful partnership between the Juvenile Probation Commission and the Juvenile Probation Department.

While commissioner Beijen will surely carry all of the above qualities with him into his second term, given your support, the greatest quality he will advance is his ability to engage and connect with at-risk youth in meaningful dialogue about the things that matter most to them – their safety, their hopes, their fears and their plans for the future. I have personally witnessed such interactions. Whether from Log Cabin Ranch, Juvenile Hall or the Life Learning Academy, the youth always respond positively to Commissioner Beijen's appreciative inquiries or supportive perspectives because of the genuine concern he displays in every encounter with them. That is precisely why we need to keep him close to JPD.

What enlightened Chief Probation Officer, Board of Supervisors or Mayor wouldn't want someone with Commissioner Beijen's demonstrated commitment, leadership and compassion for youth to remain in a position designed to help the Probation Department improve its positive impact upon youth and families?

For all of these reasons, I urge your support of Commissioner Dirk Beijen's candidacy for reappointment to the Juvenile Probation Commission.

While I will be grateful for your consideration, the true beneficiaries of your support will be the youth of San Francisco.
