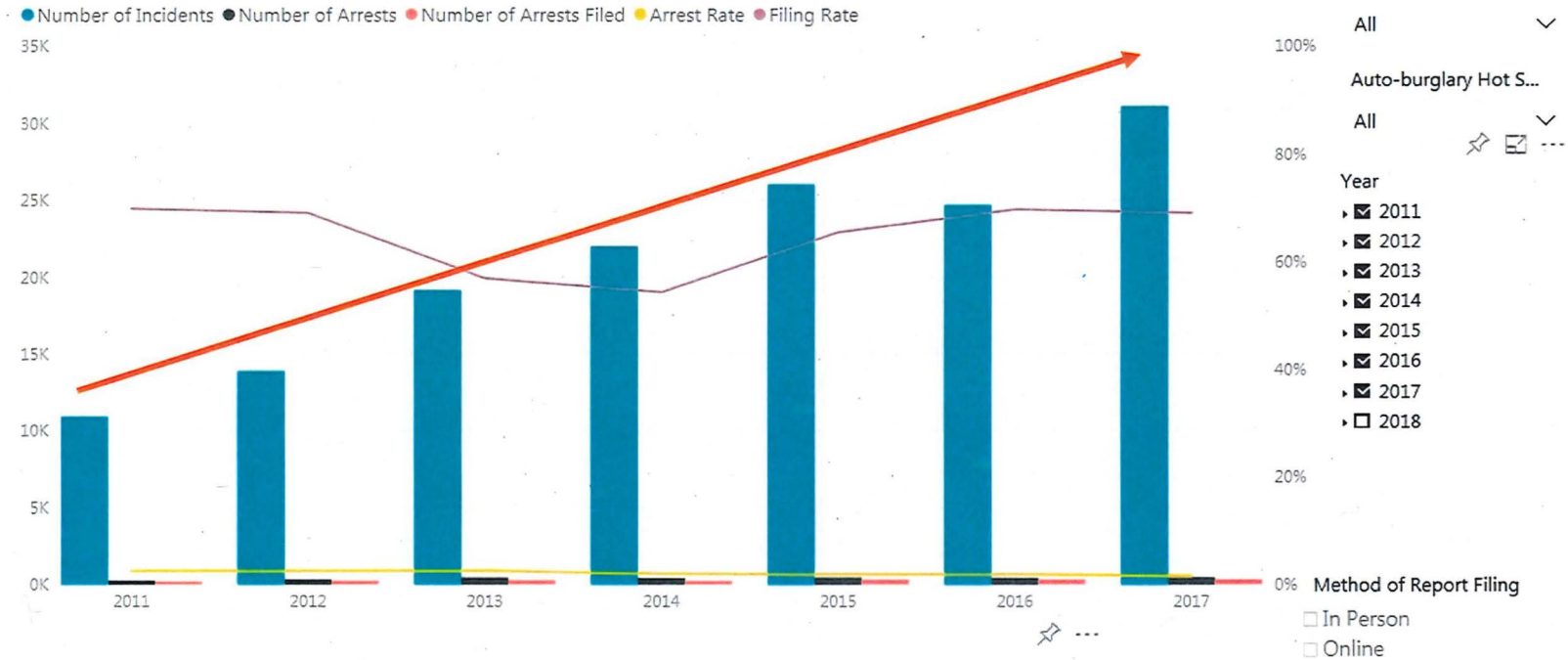

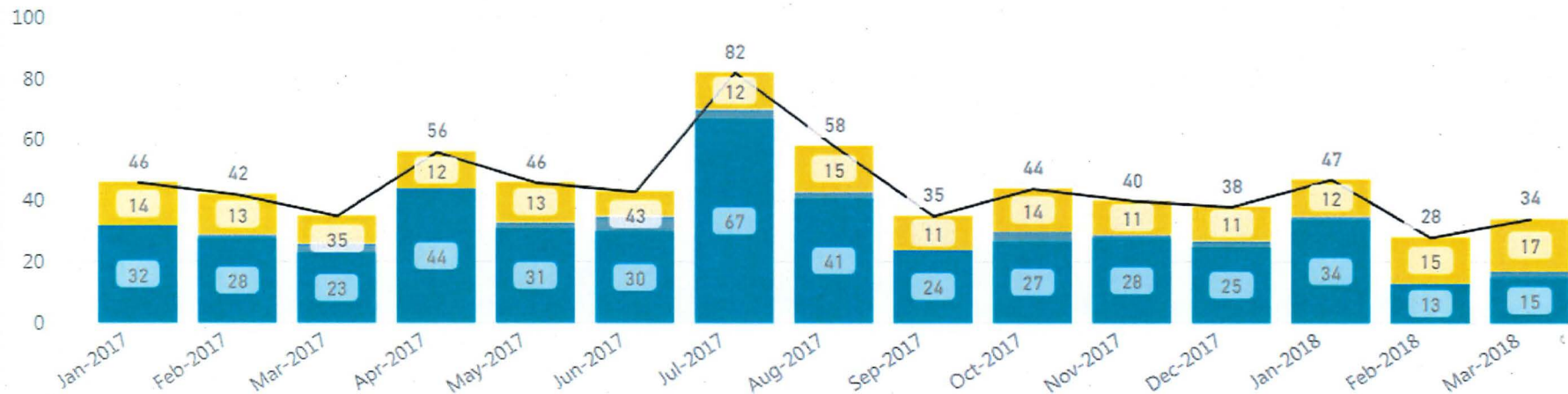

Auto Burglary Solutions



THE SOLUTION



1. INVESTIGATE

Police should respond to the scene of auto burglary incidents to conduct follow-up investigations and collect fingerprints, surveillance, and other evidence.



2. USE CAMERAS

If you have a private camera, register it at <http://sfdistrictattorney.org/register-your-cam>. Studies have shown that cameras are a significant deterrent to property crime in San Francisco.



3. COMMUNICATE

Expand public education to remind the public and visitors not to leave valuables in their vehicles, to report suspicious behavior and to report auto burglary incidents when they occur.



4. LEGISLATE

Close the "locked" loophole in the law. By adding "forced entry" to the auto burglary statute, **SB 916** sponsored by DA Gascón will ensure more auto burglars are prosecuted as felons.

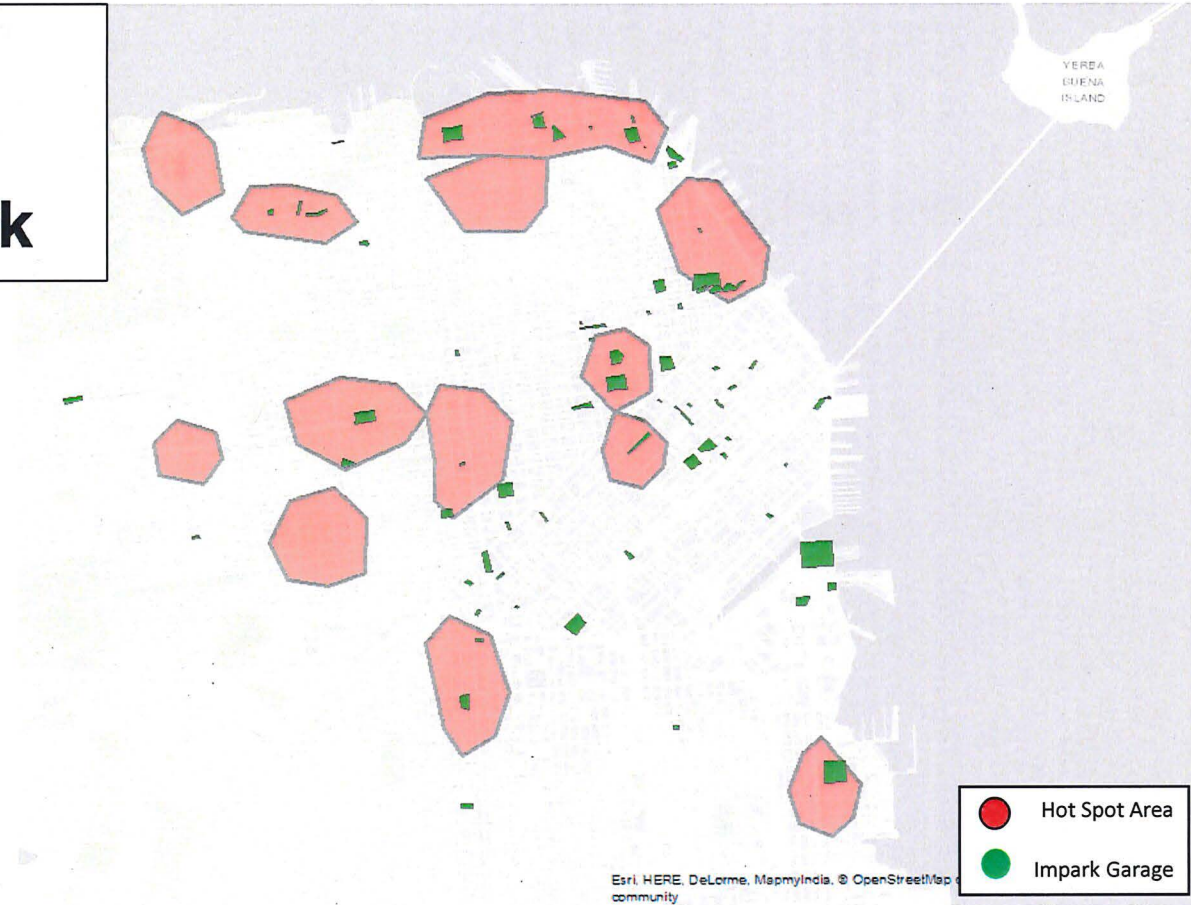

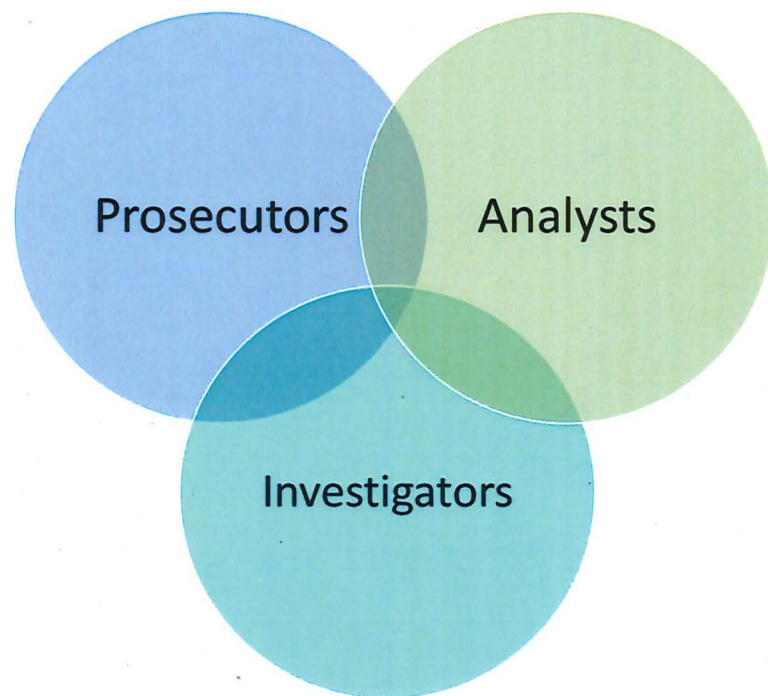

Grand Jury Indictment: Deshawn Patton

- Serial Auto Burglar **20 counts**, including 8 counts of auto burglary
- Victims from as far away as **China & Germany**
- Data and technology driven approach to investigation and prosecution.

CSU Operations



Drug Store Robberies

- **48 Incidents** in Oakland, Berkeley, San Francisco, San Pablo, El Cerrito, San Leandro, Alameda, Bay Point and as far away as Stockton
- **25 Stores**; One Store Hit 11 Times
 - **\$120,000** Loss
- 4 defendants charged for drugstore robberies, and 1 charged for fencing operation.
 - Over **\$500,000** worth of stolen merchandise recovered.

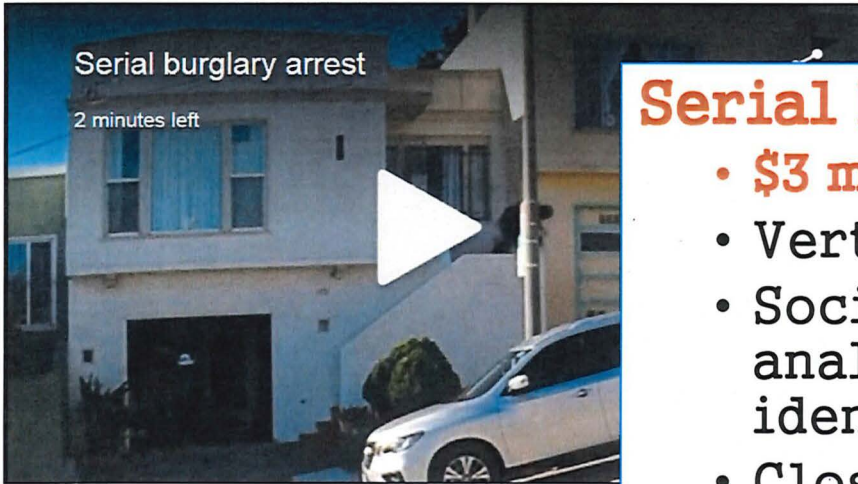

Serial Residential Burglaries

- **\$3 million** in stolen property
- Vertically prosecuting **12 cases**
- Social network analysis, social media analysis, cell phone analysis helped to identify serial burglary crews
- Close collaboration with SFPD Burglary Unit

Human Trafficking

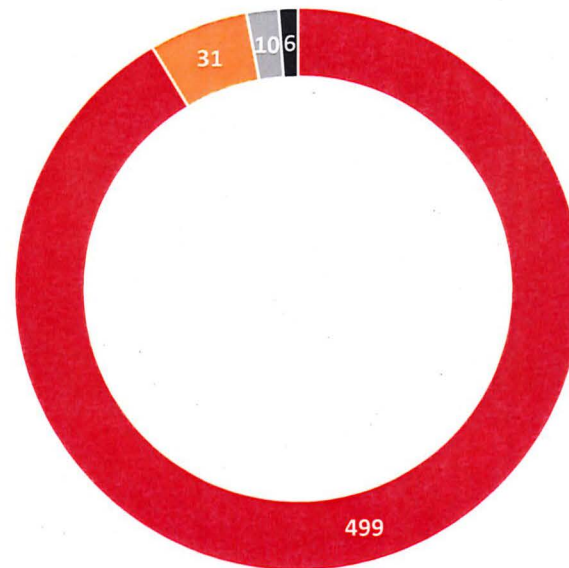
- SF is one of **top 3** human trafficking entry points in US

Human Trafficking Unit



The District Attorney's Office proposes the establishment of a Human Trafficking Unit to effectively identify and prosecute labor and sex traffickers, and disrupt criminal organizations that drive trafficking.

This proactive, multi-disciplinary model is victim-centered and data-driven.
