3	Ordinance ordering the sale at public auction of City-owned property located at
4	1648 Pacific Avenue and 2350 19 th Avenue; adopting findings pursuant to the California
5	Environmental Quality Act; adopting findings that the sale is consistent with the City's
6	General Plan and Eight Priority Policies of City Planning Code Section 101.1; and
7	authorizing other actions in furtherance of this ordinance.

11	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
12	Section 1. In accordance with the recommendation of the San Francisco Fire
13	Commission (Fire Commission Resolution Numbers 03-9 and 04-4), Chief of the Fire
14	Department, and the Director of Property, the Board of Supervisors hereby declares that the
15	public interest or necessity will not be inconvenienced by the sale at public auction of the
16	following property owned by the City under the jurisdiction of the Fire Department, all of which
17	is located within the City and County of San Francisco and which is shown on the maps
18	marked "Exhibit A" and "Exhibit B" which are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors
19	Parcel 1. Assessor's Block 0574, Lot 011, 1648 Pacific Avenue, located on the
20	north side of Pacific Avenue, between Van Ness Avenue and Polk Street;
21	Parcel 2. Assessor's Block 2347, Lot 004G, 2350 19 th Avenue, located on the east
22	side of 19 th Avenue, between Santiago Street and Taraval Street.
23	Section 2. In a letter dated December 15, 2004 from the Director of Planning to the
24	Director of Property, the Planning Department determined that the sale of Parcel 1 is
25	(i) consistent with the City's General Plan, (ii) consistent with the Eight Priority Policies of City

2	California Environmental Quality At (California Public Resources Code Sections 21000
3	et seq.) (CEQA). A copy of the letter is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in
4	File No and is incorporated herein by reference. The Board of Supervisors
5	finds that the proposed sale is consistent with the City's General Plan and with Planning Code
6	Section 101.1(b) for the reasons set forth in said letter.
7	Section 3. On December 9, 2004, at a duly noticed public hearing, the Planning
8	Commission in Motion No. 16909, found that the sale of Parcel 2 was consistent with the
9	City's General Plan and with Planning Code Section 101.1(b). A copy of the Motion is on file
10	with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No and is incorporated
11	herein by reference. The Board finds that proposed sale is consistent with the City's General
12	Plan and with Planning Code Section 101.1(b) for the reasons set forth in said Motion. In
13	addition, the Planning Department determined that the sale of Parcel 2 is in compliance with
14	CEQA. A copy of the determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File
15	No and is incorporated herein by reference.
16	Section 4. The Board of Supervisors has previously included the estimated sale
17	proceeds of Parcels 1 and 2 as revenue in the San Francisco Fire Department's 2004-2005
18	budget to balance its budget.
19	Section 5. The Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Director of Property, on
20	behalf of the City and County of San Francisco, to request and receive bids at public auction
21	for the sale of Parcels 1 and 2. Notwithstanding Section 23.3 of the San Francisco
22	Administrative Code, the Director of Property is hereby authorized to sell said surplus property
23	at public auction without subsequent approval or confirmation by the Board of Supervisors on
24	the condition that the sales price is equal to or greater than the fair market value as
25	determined by an independent appraisal. Subsequent to the public auction sale, the Director

Planning Code Section 101.1, and (iii) categorically exempt from environmental review under

1	of Property shall report to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors the results of the public
2	auction sale. The provisions of San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 23A, the Surplus
3	City Property Ordinance, shall not apply to the sale of Parcels 1 and 2 as set forth above.
4	Section 6. The Mayor, Clerk of the Board, Controller, and Director of Property are
5	hereby authorized and directed to take any and all actions which they or the City Attorney may
6	deem necessary or advisable in order to effectuate the purpose and intent of this ordinance.
