 2 AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES TO ACCEPT Retroactively
 3 AND EXPEND \$1,986,000 FROM THE BAY AREA AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT
 4 DISTRICT'S TRANSPORTATION FUND FOR CLEAN AIR FOR VARIOUS
 5 PROJECTS INCLUDING ONE TO BE DEVELOPED BY THE SAN FRANCISCO
 6 MUNICIPAL RAILWAY, AND AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTORS OF
 7 ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES AND SAN FRANCISCO MUNICIPAL RAILWAY
 8 TO EXECUTE AGREEMENTS WITH THE BAY AREA AIR QUALITY
 9 MANAGEMENT DISTRICT, WHEREBY, THE CITY WOULD INDEMNIFY THE
 10 DISTRICT FROM CLAIMS RESULTING FROM THE CITY'S PERFORMANCE OF
 SAID AGREEMENTS.

11 WHEREAS, The Bay Area Air Quality Management District ("District") has
 12 approved \$1,986,000 from the Transportation Fund for Clean Air, for the Department of
 13 Administrative Services and San Francisco Municipal Railway to implement the
 following clean air vehicle projects:

14 1) SF Municipal Railway Alternative Fuel Bus Demonstration Project-To fund
 15 \$1,006,000 for the development of 2 compressed natural gas (CNG) buses and 2 hybrid
 16 electric/diesel buses.

17 2) Department of Administrative Services/Norcal Transfer Truck Project-To fund
 18 the incremental costs of 14 liquefied natural gas transfer trucks in the amount of
 \$980,000.

19 WHEREAS, the District requires that the City enter into funding agreements in
 20 order to receive the funds to be used for these projects; and

21 WHEREAS, the District requires that the City shall indemnify and hold harmless
 22 the Air District, its officers, employees, agents, representatives, and successors-in-interest
 23 against any and all claims, suits, or actions resulting from the performance by the City of
 24 its duties under the agreements; and





9 provide for the City to indemnify and hold harmless the District, its officers, employees,
10 agents, representatives, and successors-in-interest against any and all claims, suits, or
11 actions resulting from the performance by the City of its duties under the agreements.




