Resolution approving the selection of Jacobs Engineering; awards Water System Improvement Program-funded Agreement No. CS-914, Bay Division Regional Construction Management Services.

WHEREAS, It is necessary to procure the services of a qualified Construction Management firm to provide specialized construction management services to supplement SFPUC staff through the Agreement No. CS-914, Bay Division Regional Construction Management Services, which includes Construction Management Services for Bay Division Regional Projects, and

WHEREAS, The estimated cost of services is up to \$25,000,000 assuming that the Commission approves the proposed projects' California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) documents; and

WHEREAS, The proposal was advertised on April 4, 2008; and

WHEREAS, Services are anticipated to begin in December 2008 and, if the Commission approves the proposed projects, end in October 2013 and the duration of this agreement is up to 58 months; and

WHEREAS, SFPUC staff and HRC review of the proposals resulted in the establishment of Jacobs Engineering as the best qualified consulting firm; and

WHEREAS, An HRC sub-consulting goal of 15% LBE participation has been established and approved for this agreement by the HRC Contract Compliance Officer

1 assigned to the SFPUC, and Jacobs Engineering is committed to meet the LBE goal of 22%
2 submitted in its proposal which exceeds the HRC goal established; and

3 WHEREAS, Failure to reach successful agreement on contract terms and conditions
4 within 30 days of the date of the Commission award may result in award of the contract to the
5 next highest ranked proposer, or re-advertising and re-selecting consultants at the discretion
6 of the City; and

7 WHEREAS, The firms being awarded a contract by the SFPUC must be in compliance
8 with the Equal Benefits Provisions of Chapter 12B of the City’s Administrative Code either at
9 the time of the award, or within 2 weeks of the date of the Commission award; failure of the
10 bidder to obtain compliance certification from HRC may, in the General Manager’s sole
11 discretion, result in award of the agreement to the next highest ranked proposer, or re-
12 advertising and re-selecting consultants at the discretion of the City; and

13 WHEREAS, Funds for this agreement will be available at the time of award of the
14 agreement from Bay Division Regional Projects, including the Bay Division Reliability Upgrade
15 Project - Pipeline (CUW36802), BDPL Nos. 3 & 4 Crossover/Isolation Valves (CUW35301),
16 and SCADA System - Phase II (CUW36301), Bay Division Reliability Upgrade Project – Bay
17 Tunnel (CUW36801) ; and

18 WHEREAS, SFPUC resolution No. 08-0174 approved the selection of Jacobs
19 Engineering; awards Water Enterprise Water System Improvement Program-funded
20 Agreement No. CS-914, Bay Division Regional Construction Management Services, to
21 provide construction management services for Bay Division Regional Projects; and authorized
22 the General Manager of the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission to negotiate a
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1 professional services agreement with Jacobs Engineering for an amount not to exceed
2 \$25,000,000, and with a duration of up to 58 months, or, in the event negotiations are not
3 successful or City requirements are not satisfied, to negotiate a professional services
4 agreement with the next highest ranked proposer, provided that expenditures shall be limited
5 to pre-construction activities until such time as the Commission reviews and considers the
6 proposed Projects' CEQA documents and determines whether or not to approve the proposed
7 Projects; and authorized the General Manager to execute the agreement, subject to Board of
8 Supervisors' approval pursuant to Charter Section 9.118; now, therefore, be it

9 RESOLVED, That Board of Supervisors hereby approves the selection of Jacobs
10 Engineering; awards Water Enterprise Water System Improvement Program-funded
11 Agreement No. CS-914, Bay Division Regional Construction Management Services, to
12 provide construction management services for Bay Division Regional Projects; and authorizes
13 the General Manager of the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission to negotiate a
14 professional services agreement with Jacobs Engineering for an amount not to exceed
15 \$25,000,000, and with a duration of up to 58 months, or, in the event negotiations are not
16 successful or City requirements are not satisfied, to negotiate a professional services
