3	Ordinance waiving payment of police and fire services incurred by the San Francisco
4	Juneteenth Committee for the production of the 2004 Juneteenth Festival.

8	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
9	Section 1. Findings. The Board of Supervisors hereby finds that June 19 <sup>th</sup> is the oldest
10	known celebration of the ending of slavery, and that the Juneteenth Festival has become a
11	worldwide celebration since its inception 54 years ago. The Juneteenth Festival provides an
12	opportunity for all Americans to learn more about our common past and to better understand
13	the experiences that have shaped our nation.
14	The Board further finds that the Juneteenth Festival represents the joy of freedom and
15	the chance for a new beginning, and that San Francisco had never had a publicly organized
16	Juneteenth Festival until June 2002.
17	The Board further finds that the San Francisco Juneteenth Committee organized the
18	Juneteenth Festival of 2004 and has paid most of the incurred fees, however, the Committee
19	is seeking a waiver of the remaining fees.
20	Section 2. The Board of Supervisors hereby waives the additional police fees incurred
21	by the San Francisco Juneteenth Committee pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code
22	Section 10B in connection with the 2004 Juneteenth Festival that have not been paid as of
23	May 24, 2005, in an amount up to two thousand five hundred and ninety seven dollars and no
24	cent (\$2,597.00). The Police Department shall not collect any additional sums due as of May
25	24, 2005, but need not refund any payment already received by the City.

1	Section 3. The Board of Supervisors hereby waives the fees incurred by the San
2	Francisco Juneteenth Committee for services provided by the San Francisco Fire Department
3	in connection with the 2004 Juneteenth Festival that have not been paid as of May 24, 2005,
4	in an amount up to six hundred and nineteen dollars and no cents (\$619.00). The Fire
5	Department shall not collect any additional sums due as of May 24, 2005, but need not refund
6	any payment already received by the City.
