I had a police officer once tell me that I would not amount to nothing and end up the CA women's Prison, Chowchilla. Many years later I would prove him wrong in becoming the first in my family to graduate from a 4 year university (SFSU) in Health Education. I was born and raised in the Mission by a single mom who immigrated from Mexico in 1979 to the Mission District.
I had my first experience with the criminal Justice system at the age of 14. From that age until about 27, I spend several stint in and out of Woodside Learning Center and SF County Jail. I finally was able to get off probation in 2010 and have not re-offended. The longest term I did was 8 months. I am very familiar with the system and the resources available to individuals who are re-entering our communities. At the age of 18 I was a victim of a violent crime (gang violence) and was stabbed in the face, I have also been shot at in the Mission. I am a 37, Latina part of the LGBTQ+ community, female identified, born and raised in SF (Mission and SOMA), and I currently live in Treasure Island. I have also struggled and overcame homelessness, addiction, and domestic violence. I would like the opportunity to serve my community in a way I have never done before. I believe that it is important for us folk who have directly impacted be able to inform the process on how we help our people exiting the criminal justice system and back into our community. I would like to have that opportunity and would gladly serve with intelligence and heart.

I also have extensively organized around anti displacement in the Mission, tasers in SF, against police brutality (Justice for Luis Gongora Pat), Immigration, public health (tobacco density) and have been a part of many meetings and hearings at City Hall such as the planning commission, Board Of Supervisors, police commission meetings, public and safety. I have also advocated and lobbied at the state level. I have spoken at press conferences, most recently in regards to bail reform and organize with the Justice for Luis Gongora Pat to stop police violence and for more police accountability. Most recently a large group of us travelled to Sacramento to the Senate Public and safety hearing to voice our support for AB 931 the police accountability and safety act. I have met with several legislators at the state and city level along the years and have confidence that I am able to fulfill my duties as part of the reentry council.

I understand the direct struggles of men and women in the reentry community as they return home from periods of incarceration -- I have experienced it directly myself.

Currently, I am a Senior Organizer & Advocate for the Ella Baker Center for Human Rights. In my capacity, I empower directly impacted men and women to advocate and organize around criminal justice reform. As the senior organizer, I am responsible for the Alameda county work.

I have previously worked as program manager for the SF Tenderloin based non-profit, Hospitality House. There, I was charged with overseeing a men's homeless shelter program. The program saw an average of 700 homeless men a year. I supervised case management services and ensured effective programming for shelter residents and staff.

I am 2015 graduate of Stanford University, Project Remade. An intensive business program aimed at empowering formerly incarcerated men and women.

My daily methamphetamine use culminated in me losing my legal job and then selling drugs to support myself, my family, and my habit. Once the Federal government indicted me on drug charges, they sent me to residential drug treatment while I was on pre-trial. Before being convicted and sentenced, I was able to complete the 6-month program and begin aftercare before having to go to prison.
My qualifications as required by each Seat that I qualify for:
Seat #1 -- I am a survivor of sexual abuse (incest) and domestic violence
Seat #2 -- I am the Director of Programs and Operations at Code Tenderloin, a nonprofit which does workforce development for people who have employment barriers. Many of the people we serve are justice involved. We provide job readiness training, wrap around services, and job placement assistance.
Seat #3 -- I was released from Federal Prison to the halfway house at 111 Taylor Street, San Francisco 94102 on September 6, 2016. On March 1, 2017, I left the halfway house and began Federal probation. I am currently still on Federal probation.

Business and/or professional experience:

I graduated from the Georgia Institute of Technology with degree in Industrial Engineering. I have worked in both for profit (private) companies and nonprofit companies in various managerial positions. I have negotiated and managed outsourced service contracts, including establishing performance metrics, developing the Service Level Agreement, and managing contractual compliance and budgets. I worked for big Technology companies, such as Sybase and Siebel. I also worked for a nonprofit named the California Communications Access Foundation (CCAF), who managed the State mandated program for the CPUC called the Deaf and Disabled Telecommunication s Program.

My first job out of prison was as a host and food runner at Joe's Crab Shack. I then began working part time as the Programs Associate with Code Tenderloin. On May 1, 2017, I began working full time for Code Tenderloin as the Director of Programs and Operations.

I currently have 3 years clean and sober. I have been incarcerated in the past (1991, 1992, 1993, 1994, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2002-2004 and 2 prison terms - 2002-2004 and 2006-2008), but currently I am not on parole or probation. I graduated in May 2018 from City College of San Francisco with degrees in Liberal Arts and Social Behavior & Health Education. I also have certificates in Drug and Alcohol counseling and as a Community Mental Health Worker. I am a firm advocate of change and believe in helping others as I have been helped.



I am a San Francisco native raised for most of my life. I have lived in the Bayview, Fillmore and Sunnydale Communities. As an African American woman who is formerly incarcerated, I represent African Americans who are disproportionately impacted by incarceration and reentry barriers. I work at Glide in social services in the Tenderloin neighborhood with a large post-release population of men and women. I work with people that come here to live post-release that are on parole or probation. I once served 22 months in prison and 8 months in county jail and am 13 years in recovery. I graduated from Walden House in 2005, and am now a graduate from City College as a Drug Counselor. In addition to Board Appointee of this Council I am a member on the subcommittee for Direct Services, and a member of the Policy Committee for SFLead.

Business and/or professional experience:

I've been with Glide 13 years and have held many staffing positions: Safety Team Monitor, Church and Meals Program, Client Advocate, Family Case Manager, Speak Out Host, Co-facilitator of the Women's Center support groups and facilitated Emotional Emancipation Circles for people of African descent. I am currently a Case Manager in Glide's Walk In Center and specifically focus on supporting the reentry population to stabilize and thrive. As Case Manager I serve a diverse population which assist with goal planning, treatment options, assessments, housing assistance, basic needs, and connecting with primary care and mental health services. The Walk In Center served 1,609 unduplicated clients with 14,678 units of service in the fiscal year 2016-2017. In addition In addition to my role in the Walk In Center, I facilitate Recovery Circles twice weekly for men and women who struggle with addiction and provide them with individual counseling as needed. I have jail clearance, and support the women in county jail #2 with reentry information every Monday. I often correspond with incarcerated individuals who send letters inquiring about reentry services and support from prison, and many connect with me upon release.



My full name is Shannon Latrice Wise. I am a 48-year African American female born 1970 in San Franciscan native born in 1970. I lived in the Fillmore district until the age of nine. My mom, brother and I then moved to Oakland. This is where brother and I attended grade school at Lakeview Elementary. Our single mother led family then moved to Albany CA to complete Albany middle & Albany high schools. I graduated in 1988.

I am a returning citizen. Like many young folks in their 20's do, I became addicted to drugs during the 1990's, which subsequently landed me in the San Francisco county jail more times than I'd like to remember. In 1998, I was convicted of a felony for marijuana sales and a misdemeanor for having a controlled substance & paraphernalia. I was then placed on felony probation and became a product of recidivism. During one of my many probation violation trips into custody, I completed the in-custody S.I.S.T.E.R.S program. However, I was still not ready to change my life. I would always get out and continue using.

After one to many probation violations, in 1998 I decided to try a residential program and went into Walden House, now HealthRight360, in San Francisco. After completing 15 months of residential treatment I soon relapsed. However, thanks to the San Francisco Police Department, I got arrested one last time in February 2000. The judge gave me two options, prison or re-complete the program, I chose the latter. I was re-sentenced to HealthRight360 in 2000. I successfully completed the program. With further assistance and support from the San Francisco public defender's office, in 2003 I expunged my San Francisco convictions.

Having served & worked for nonprofit agencies that serve individuals exiting the criminal justice system, low to moderate income earners, people of color, formerly homeless families, coupled with a background in recovery and deliverance, my focus has been to assist returning citizens, particularly women, and teach them the life skills necessary to transition to a positive and self-fulfilling life. And because it took other strong, positive women to advocate and show me how to change my life for the better, I'm here to show our newer returning citizen women that same way.

I am a Restorative Justice Activist whose calling in life is to help those who have been incarcerated get second chances with other companies. I speak at various events and share my story hoping to break stigmas and open people's eyes to the truth about why hiring people with criminal histories will benefit them and our communities.

Seat 2, succeeding Angela Coleman, term expiring June 1, 2018, must be a former inmate in the San Francisco County Jail, a California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facility, and/or a United States Bureau of Prison facility; and also have expertise in providing services to individuals exiting the criminal justice system, for a two-year term ending June 1, 2020.

Seat 3, succeeding James Lowden, term expiring June 1, 2018, must be a former inmate in the San Francisco County Jail, a California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facility, and/or a United States Bureau of Prison facility; and also must have been released from custody within three years of his/her appointment, for a two-year term ending June 1, 2020.

Seat 4, succeeding Kimberli Courtney, term expiring June 1, 2018, must be a former inmate in the San Francisco County Jail, a California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facility, and/or a United States Bureau of Prison facility; and also must have served multiple terms of incarceration, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending June 1, 2020.



Board Qualifications:

The Reentry Council was created to coordinate local efforts to support adults exiting San Francisco county jail, San Francisco juvenile justice system out-of-home placements, the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facilities, and the United States Federal Bureau of Prison facilities.

The Council shall provide the Mayor, Board of Supervisors, the public, and any other appropriate agency with accurate and comprehensive information about programs that serve this population, barriers faced by this population, best practices to meet the needs of this population, and funding sources for programs and practices that address the needs of this population. The Council shall coordinate information sharing, planning, and engagement among all interested private and public stakeholders to the extent permissible under federal and state law.

The Council shall consist of 24 members, seven (7) of whom shall be former inmates in the San Francisco County Jail, a California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facility, and/or a United States Bureau of Prison facility.

The Mayor, or his designee, shall serve as one (1) member, and shall also appoint three (3) of the members. One (1) of the three (3) members shall be between the ages of 18 and 24 at the time of appointment, and one (1) shall have expertise in providing services to individuals exiting the criminal justice system.

"R Board Description" (Screen Print)

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The Board of Supervisors shall designate one (1) of its members to serve as a member of the Council, and shall appoint four (4) of the seven (7) members who are former inmates (added and revised by Ordinance No. 44-11). Of these four (4) members:

- > One (1) shall have expertise in providing services to individuals exiting the criminal justice system;
- > One (1) must have been released from custody within three years of his/her appointment;
- > One (1) must have served multiple terms of incarceration; and
- > One (1) must self-identify as a survivor of violence or crime.

All members of the Council shall be exempt from the Charter requirement that they be electors of the City and County of San Francisco (added by Ordinance No. 26-09).

The following City departments or agencies shall appoint one (1) member each to the Council: Public Defender's Office; District Attorney's Office; Sheriff's Department; Police Department; Adult Probation Department; Juvenile Probation Department; Department of Economic and Workforce Development; Human Services Agency; Department of Children, Youth and Families; Department of Public Health; and Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing (11 total).

In addition, co-chairs shall invite the San Francisco Superior Court, Department of Child Support Services, California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation Division of Adult Parole Operations, and United States Probation and Pretrial Services System to appoint one (1) member each to the Council. If any of these agencies do not appoint a representative, the co-chairs shall appoint an additional member (4 total).

Members shall serve two-year terms and shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. Members may serve multiple terms. If any member misses two regularly scheduled meetings in a twelve-month period without prior notice, the Council shall certify that fact in writing to appointing authority and the member shall be deemed to have resigned.

Twelve members of the Council shall constitute a quorum and the Council shall have the authority to act on the vote of the majority of the quorum.

The four members appointed by the Adult Probation Department, District Attorney's Office, Public Defender's Office and Sheriff's Department, respectively, as well as the Mayor or the Mayor's representative, shall co-chair the Council. The Council may establish subcommittees. The Council shall meet in full at least three times per year.

Reports: At least once a year, the Council shall prepare and submit a report that shall include,

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but not be limited to, information identifying funding streams; programs serving individuals exiting the criminal justice system; needs of reentry population; and barriers to safe and successful reentry. City departments shall respond within 30 days, if mentioned in report. Reports shall be provided to the Mayor, Board of Supervisors, City departments identified in the report, and the public.

The Council shall be staffed, subject to fiscal and budgetary provisions of the Charter, by the Public Defender's Office, District Attorney's Office, Adult Probation Department, and Mayor's Office who shall designate one staff member each.

Sunset: June 1, 2019, unless the Board of Supervisors adopts an ordinance continuing its existence.
