Timeline

Formed SFAPD Recovery Working Group

Working Group made up of recovering addicts, family members impacted by other's use, and service providers. It was formed to combine lived experience with data in order to make recommendations to DPH and other depts.

Analyzed Data from Survey - 2020

Over 500 people completed the survey. From the data collected and the experiences of members, the Working Group developed 7 recommendations.

SFAPD Recovery Summit 2018

The 2018 Recovery Summit explores the various treatment modalities used in San Francisco, celebrates the successes of individuals in recovery, and strives to *Inspire Change*.

Launched Survey - 2019

Two surveys were developed: one for current or former drug users, and another for loved ones affected by someone else's drug use.

Presented Findings and Recommendations to the Reentry Council - 2020

Reentry Council voted unanimously to support the recommendations of the Recovery Summit Working Group to the City.

SFAPD housing participants completed 1,505 housing applications


