WHEREAS, The INS's current definition of family excludes same-sex partners; and,

WHEREAS, The Permanent Partner Immigration Act seeks to recognize the reality that lesbian and gay couples are deserving of the same basic immigration rights as heterosexuals; and,

WHEREAS, Thirteen other countries currently allow the gay partners of their citizens to become permanent residents, including Australia, Belgium, Canada, Denmark, Finland, France, Iceland, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, South Africa, Sweden and the United Kingdom; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco has taken the important step of proclaiming itself a "City of Refuge" for dual-passport gay couples; and,

WHEREAS, In the spring of 2000, the Board of Supervisors voted to instruct city workers not to alert immigration

officials to partnered gay and lesbian foreigners living on expired Visas; and,

WHEREAS, U.S. immigration law should be changed to make such subterfuge unnecessary to mirror San Francisco's compassionate approach; and,

WHEREAS, The Permanent Partner Immigration Act is an appropriate next step toward establishing equality in immigration standards for gay men and lesbians; now, therefore, be it,
