6 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
7 does hereby appoint the hereinafter designated person to serve as a member of the Joint
8 Board of Education/Board of Supervisors Digital Divide Task Force, pursuant to Resolution
9 No. 0271-00 for the term specified:

10 Mel Ochoa, vacant seat, (Seat No. 4, must be a representative from the association of
11 private sector technology companies), for a new two-year term ending April 14, 2002; and, be

13 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

- 14 1. The membership of the Joint Board Of Education/Board Of Supervisors Digital
15 Divide Task Force has a goal to be representative of the diversity of the City and
16 County of San Francisco.
- 17 2. Applicant Mel Ochoa, a new appointee, who is not a resident of San Francisco, is a
18 person with experience that uniquely qualifies him/her to serve on the Joint Board
19 Of Education/Board Of Supervisors Digital Divide Task Force.
- 20 3. The Joint Board Of Education/Board Of Supervisors Digital Divide Task Force has
21 attempted to fill the position, for which Mel Ochoa was nominated, with an
22 individual who is a City resident and who has the specific experience, skills, and
23 qualifications, but has been unable to do so at this time. The Rules Committee has
24 certified that Mel Ochoa is qualified to serve on the Joint Board Of Education/Board
25 Of Supervisors Digital Divide Task Force.


