SUPPORTING SAN FRANCISCO'S FIRST-EVER PEDESTRIAN SAFETY SUMMIT AND
DECLARING MAY 26, 2000, "PEDESTRIAN SAFETY SUMMIT DAY".

WHEREAS, May is National Safety Month and a time for all of us to focus on making our City's streets safer; and,

WHEREAS, On May 26, 2000, San Francisco will host its first-ever Pedestrian Safety Summit at the Hiram Johnson State Office Building Auditorium located at 455 Golden Gate Avenue; and,

WHEREAS, The Pedestrian Safety Summit will bring together City officials, advocates, and the entire San Francisco community to begin developing a comprehensive plan of action for pedestrian safety; and,

WHEREAS, Topics of the Summit will include the City's progress in retiming the lights to allow pedestrians more time to cross the street safely, an inventory of the number of signalized intersections still lacking pedestrian signals, pilot projects focusing on pedestrian safety measures — such as the "pedestrian scramble" signals, educational outreach, and enforcement of pedestrian safety violations; and,

WHEREAS, The results of a survey released this month by the Controller's Office demonstrate that one in three San Franciscans feel unsafe when crossing the street in our City; and,

WHEREAS, The Pedestrian Safety Summit is co-sponsored by the Office of Assembly Majority Leader Kevin Shelley, the San Francisco Police Department, the Department of Parking and Traffic, the

Department of Public Health, the District Attorney's Office, Caltrans, and the Transportation Authority; and,

WHEREAS, Pedestrian safety advocates are active participants in the planning of the Summit, and these groups include Walk San Francisco, the Pedestrian Safety Task Force, Senior Action Network, and San Francisco Bike Coalition; now therefore be it,

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby supports San Francisco's first-ever Pedestrian Safety Summit; and be it,

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby declares May 26, 2000, to be "Pedestrian Safety Summit Day" in the City and County of San Francisco.
