COMMENDING SENATOR WELLSTONE FOR HIS ATTEMPTS TO EXPAND

EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR WELFARE RECIPIENTS AND URGING THE

CALIFORNIA LEGISLATURE TO DETERMINE THE SIZE OF THE STATE'S CASELOAD

REDUCTION CREDIT IN ORDER TO ALLOW WELFARE RECIPIENTS TO COUNT TWO

YEARS OF HIGHER EDUCATION AS A WORK ACTIVITY

WHEREAS, The Higher Education Amendments of 1998 amend provisions of the federal Higher Education Act of 1965 and reauthorize programs included in the Act for five years; and,

WHEREAS, Senator Paul Wellstone (D-MN) introduced an amendment to the Higher Education Act to make two years of higher education count as a work activity under the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program; and,

WHEREAS, Senator Wellstone's amendment was stripped in a conference committee last week; and,

WHEREAS, The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program currently limits the amount of post-secondary education training that a state can count towards meeting its work requirement to 12 months; and,

WHEREAS, The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program will penalize states if they do not meet federal work participation rates; and,

WHEREAS, Studies show that short-term training programs raise the income of workers only marginally, while completion of a two-year associate degree provides greater potential to break the cycle of poverty for recipients of public assistance; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco commends Senator Wellstone for his amendment to the Higher Education Act and his attempts to expand educational opportunities for welfare recipients; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the California Legislature to determine the size of California's caseload reduction credit in order to allow welfare recipients to count two years of higher education as work activity; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to his Honor, the Mayor, with a request that he transmit copies to the delegation from San Francisco in the State Legislature, as well as Governor Pete Wilson, with a request they all take action necessary to achieve the objectives of this resolution.
