It is no secret that four of the seven BOS-appointed commissioners espouse anti-law enforcement biases with ideological beliefs about criminal justice reform that border on the fanatical and that their behavior has contributed significantly to the Commission's decline in effectiveness and reputation.

Commissioner Walker has reliably worked to avoid the complete demoralization of our police force. Thankfully, she and two other commissioners have been insistent on remaining true to the mission and spirit of this Commission. Debra Walker has been judicious, fair, and ethical in her approach to her job. She challenges shoddy data, calls investigations when ethical violations arise, and listens attentively to every person who takes time out of their evening to step up to the podium to address the Commission.
