2 URGING THE CALIFORNIA ASSEMBLY TO PASS AB25 THE EQUAL BENEFITS
3 ORDINANCE

4 WHEREAS, AB25 if passed would increase the legal rights,
5 economic benefits and responsibilities of domestic partners in
6 California; and,

7 WHEREAS, AB25 would allow employees to use sick leave to attend
8 the illness of their domestic partner or domestic partner's child;
9 and,

10 WHEREAS, AB25 would authorize domestic partners to make medical
11 decisions for their partners under certain circumstances and it would
12 also amend the existing statutory will form to provide for the
13 inclusion of a domestic partner among the list of beneficiaries to
14 whom the testator may indicate a desire to leave his or her estate;
15 and,

16 WHEREAS, San Francisco has been at the forefront of the fight
17 for equal benefits with our own equal benefits ordinance; and,

18 Whereas, San Franciscans and all Californians deserve to share
19 equality at the work place; now, therefore, be it

20 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County
21 of San Francisco hereby urges the California Assembly to pass AB25,
22 the Equal Benefits Ordinance.




