## **IIN Program & Service Implementation**

#### Program Development & **Grant Administration**

IIN manages programs based on economic development goals, this involves developing frameworks, managing funding, grant administration and project management. Program staff work closely with partners to provide services and connect with businesses.

#### Program Administration

The majority of our programs are administered by community partners that provide culturally competent services and expertise. They adhere to programmatic goals based on economic development goals and objectives, stipulated in RFPs and through grant agreements.

#### Services

Once program grant agreements are in place partners can begin provision of services. These services are delivered by partner staff, contractors or consultants.

#### **Small Business** Neighborhood

Small businesses access the services through partner outreach, marketing, referrals. Neighborhood programs are administered by partners and generally deliver a neighborhood focused benefit to stimulate, support or address an economic development priority in the area.

### **COVID Relief Prioritization Factors and Considerations**

Equity, Speed and Minimizing Barriers

#### Geography

- Opportunity Neighborhoods (TL/Mid Market, Mission, Chinatown, Lower Fillmore, Bayview, Excelsior)
- Citywide access/Supervisorial District

#### Income/Revenue

- Low Income Business Owner/Households
- Less than \$2.5M GR in 2019
- Access to other government funding (ie. PPP, Resiliency Fund, etc.)

#### **Industry/Business Type**

- Businesses who have not been able to open or opened later SIP timeline (i.e. nail salons, barber shops, etc)
- Business open to the public/storefront

#### **Application Review Process**

- First-come, first-serve
- Lottery
- Priority factors, point system
- Dedicated funding




## **COVID City Relief Grants & Loans**

(translates into over \$19.6 in direct business dollars)


## **COVID PPP & EIDL for SF (DEC)**






## City Grant and Loan Award Reach



## **Grants & Loans by Supervisorial District**


# of COVID Grants and Loans










