Resolution urging Governor Gavin Newsom and the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control to delay implementation of the Responsible Beverage Service Training Program.

WHEREAS, California State Assembly Bill No. 1221 (AB 1221) established the Responsible Beverage Service (RBS) Training Program Act of 2017, and required the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) to develop, implement, and administer a curriculum for an RBS training program; and

WHEREAS, The RBS requires alcohol servers to complete a training course offered or authorized by ABC focused on laws governing alcoholic beverages and the impact of alcohol on the body in order to promote safer consumption of alcoholic drinks; and

WHEREAS, Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the RBS training requirement was delayed for a year to July 1, 2022, with mandatory training to be completed by August 31, 2022; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco businesses were provided this information in May 2022, with information only available in English and Spanish; and

WHEREAS, While other languages including Chinese, Filipino, and Vietnamese will be available for businesses by July 1, 2022, the delay to offer additional languages shortens the window in which small, immigrant-owned businesses can come into compliance; and

WHEREAS, As of May 9, 2022, approximately 22,000 alcohol servers have been successfully certified out of an estimated one million servers in California; and

WHEREAS, ABC has approved only 35 trainers to educate the remaining hundreds of thousands of servers, with an overwhelming majority in English and only a few in Spanish; and

WHEREAS, Requiring businesses to be in compliance with this new program by August 31, 2022 is not nearly enough time to conduct outreach and education to non-native and limited English proficient speakers; and

WHEREAS, Servers who are not in compliance with the training requirements could subject businesses to disciplinary action, including revocation of their liquor license; and

WHEREAS, While ABC has stated that the department will take an education-first approach to enforcement, they have not provided a timeline for when enforcement measures will be enacted, disproportionately impacting non-native and limited English-speaking servers and immigrant-owned small businesses; and

WHEREAS, Immigrant-owned small businesses that disproportionately struggled through the pandemic, facing racism and prejudice, are now being faced with a tight timeline to come into compliance with the RBS, which represents an additional barrier to recovery; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges Governor Gavin Newsom and the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control to delay implementation of the Responsible Beverage Service Training Program; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges Governor Newsom and the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control to create a robust outreach plan to non-native and limited English proficient servers and businesses, and expedite hiring of non-English speaking trainers; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit this resolution to Governor Newsom and the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control.
