I am a formerly homeless teen and mother. I grew up in San Francisco. I live in BMR housing, but before that I was homeless from fifteen as an unaccompanied minor to twenty-one years old as a mother. I lived on the streets, between friend's houses, and then at Star Community Home which is the Benioff funded shelter in 2011/12 with my oldest daughter. I used local community resources and services to get to where I am today. My family (my two daughters and I) are products of what positive investments in the community can make. Currently I attend the Haas School of Business at UC Berkeley after working as a Peer Organizer at the Coalition on Homelessness and then becoming a Shelter Client Advocate under Eviction Defense Collaborative. I have worked closely with City and County of San Francisco government and employees, community organizations, shelter staff and clients, the homeless community, and SFHA, and because of that have an incredibly unique broad system view that encompasses the various perspectives from the bottom to the top. I have the professional and personal experience necessary to be on the oversight committee, as I hold extensive knowledge of the San Francisco homeless service system, it's barriers, successes, challenges and unmet needs. I feel an overwhelming sense of responsibility to be on this committee. I want to ensure the needs of San Franciscans are met with these funds. Such as, but not limited to: housing creation through acquiring property, substantial investments in homeless families and senior/disabled single adults, mental health services, hygiene services, and outreach and support for homeless or precariously housed youth.

I am committed to a struggle to end mass homelessness by addressing the structural causes and crafting permanent fixes. My work is about developing consensus on solutions to the homeless crisis centered on the experience and expertise of those who have survived or are still living without housing. I am always learning from the brilliance around me and know how to stay positive.

I am a white female parent of two children, who is a Bay Area native. I have been a resident of SF for over 30 years, and have worked in Tenderloin for just under 25 years.

Business and/or professional experience:

I have excellent meeting facilitation, policy development, messaging expertise and unsticking ambivalence and entrenched mindsets. I am also adept at moving controversy to collective problem solving. I believe I can bring these skills to the OCOH oversight body and help ensure a positive outcome in terms of work product that not only brings fresh and effective perspective to solving homelessness, but has buy in from the various stakeholders that are critical to our success with implementing this measure.

Previous to coming to San Francisco, I was Director of the Hunger and Homeless Action Coalition of San Mateo County. I have a long history of community organizing, and have worked on a range of poverty-related issues including welfare rights, housing, homeless prevention, health care, disability, and human and civil rights. During my tenure, I have achieved several significant victories alongside homeless people including most recently crafting and leading a winning campaign for Our City Our Home, Prop C which appeared on the November 2018 ballot, and will double San Francisco's current efforts to solve homelessness. Other accomplishments include the creation of a local housing subsidy serving hundreds of homeless families, the addition of thousands of housing exits for homeless people, the major expansion of prevention efforts resulting in the halting of displacement of more than a 1,000 households, expansion of substance abuse treatment resulting in decreased fatal overdoses and shorter waits, spearheaded numerous legislative reforms protecting the rights of homeless people, and garnered funding for programs that have saved countless lives. I have co-authored several reports for the Coalition on Homelessness including The Runaround, Shelter Shock, Housing First for Families, Locked Out, Five Year Roadmap and more. I am also a tireless advocate for a fair city budget, as founding member of the People's Budget Collaborative, and later Budget Justice, a group dedicated to redirecting city funding towards ending poverty in San Francisco. I have also been the recipient of several awards including " Woman of the Year " by the California State Assembly in 2014, San Francisco Board of Supervisors in 2008, and Democratic Women in 2012.



The University of California San Francisco, California Preterm Birth Initiative (PTBI-CA), through funding from Marc and Lynne Benloff, launched in 2016 as a multi-year initiative conducting and funding research and community capacity building programs across the reproductive life course with the core objective of reducing racial disparities among Black and Latinx women in preterm birth outcomes. PTBI-CA is committed to ensuring our research moves from the lab to the community and translates into real life. By working across disciplines and sectors, engaging Black and Latinx communities most impacted by preterm birth, our work is directly relevant to our populations of focus.
PTBI-CA seeks to illuminate racism as a root cause of preterm birth disparities by honoring the unique lived experiences of people of color within a local context. We are committed to building capacity within these communities to collectively explore the social, structural, environmental, and biological drivers of premature birth. The four aims of our work are: Discovery, Interventions, Collective Impact, and Knowledge Transfer and Exchange (KTE).
Our 35 staff which includes leadership conduct work across three geographies in California known as hot spots for preterm birth: San Francisco, Oakland and Fresno. Our work resides at the intersection of research, community partnerships and the cultivation of self-determination to co-create meaningful change for 347,103 Black and Latinx women and their families. We are starting at the root of the issue by redefining the crisis of premature birth through both a reproductive justice and equity lens. Our work is informed by population- and community-level data, a Strategic Advisory Board, a Community Advisory Board, and all of our key stakeholders including the women and families we serve. We are proud to benefit from some of the brightest minds in systems and policy change, research, collective impact, racial equity, human rights and social justice, reproductive and healthcare rights, social service delivery, and community engagement.

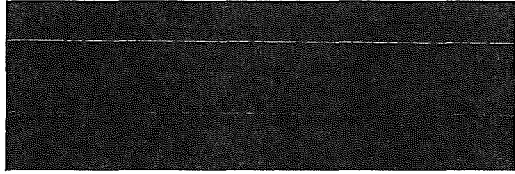

I have focused my work on designing and advocating for culturally and linguistically tailored programs for people living on the streets and marginally housed in shelters, SROs, doubled up, immigrant communities, LGBTQ, and communities of color, disabled, active drug users, women and transgender people. In my current role as Director of Systems Coordination at EveryOne Home, I design policy to meet the needs of subpopulations most impacted by homelessness in Clark and Alameda County, including historically African American communities, growing population of families living in vehicles, and the aging senior population.

Personally, I am the sister of a disabled, home care mother with six children. My family has been actively caring for her and her family for over 35 years, interacting with systems of care and the generosity and mutual support of communities, churches, and neighbors who have helped her survive while in and out of repeated housing and healthcare crises.

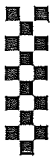

Our City, Our Home Oversight Committee.

(1) By February 28, 2019, the Board of Supervisors shall establish by ordinance the Our City, Our Home Oversight Committee (“Oversight Committee”) to make recommendations to the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors to ensure that the Our City, Our Home Fund is administered in a manner consistent with the provisions of this Section 2810.

(2) The purpose of the Oversight Committee shall be to monitor and make recommendations in the administration of the Our City, Our Home Fund, to take steps to ensure that the fund is administered in a manner accountable to the community and consistent with the law, and to advise the Board of Supervisors on appropriations from the Our City, Our Home Fund. As part of this purpose, the Oversight Committee shall:

(A) Develop recommendations for prioritizing the use of funds appropriated from the Our City, Our Home Fund;

(B) By December 31, 2019, and every three years thereafter, conduct a needs assessment with respect to homelessness and Homeless populations, including but not limited to an assessment of available data on subpopulations with regard to race, family composition, sexual orientation, age, and gender served by the programs and expenditures described in Section 2810(b)(3), and make annual recommendations about appropriations from the Our City, Our Home Fund to the Board of Supervisors consistent with that needs assessment;

(C) Promote and facilitate transparency in the administration of the Our City, Our Home Fund.

(D) Promote implementation of the programs funded by the Our City, Our Home Fund in a culturally sensitive manner.

(3) Voting Members.

(A) The Oversight Committee shall have nine voting members.

(i) Seats one, three, five, and seven shall be appointed by the Mayor under Charter Section 3.100(18).

(ii) Seats two, four, six, and eight shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors.

(iii) Seat nine shall be appointed by the Controller.

(B) Eligibility.

(i) Seat one shall be an individual with experience with Homeless housing development or supportive housing services.

(ii) Seat two shall be an individual representing families with minor children residing in SRO Units or a family member residing in a SRO Unit.

(iii) Seat three shall be an individual with experience providing Homeless services.

(iv) Seat four shall be an individual who has experienced homelessness and also has experience advocating for Homeless people.

(iv)1 Seat five shall be an individual with mental health service and/or substance abuse expertise.

(v) Seats six and seven shall be individuals who have personally experienced homelessness.

(vi) Seat eight shall be an individual who has experience advocating on Homeless or mental health issues.

(vii) Seat nine shall be an at large seat.

(C) **Term.** The terms of the initial appointees to the Oversight Committee shall commence on the date of the first meeting of the committee, which shall occur when at least six members have been appointed and are present, but no later than February 28, 2019. The initial

terms of odd numbered seats shall be three years, and two years following the initial three-year term. Even numbered seats shall have two-year terms.

(4) The City shall provide adequate dedicated staffing to the Oversight Committee.

(5) The Oversight Committee shall meet at least six times during each fiscal year, except for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019, during which the Oversight Committee shall meet at least twice.

(g)¹ Nothing in this Section 2810 shall limit the authority of the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors to propose, amend, and adopt a budget under Article IX of the Charter.

(h) For purposes of this Section 2810:

(1) “Homeless” means an individual or family that lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, and whose primary nighttime residence is one or more of the following: a shelter; a sidewalk or street; outdoors; a vehicle; a structure not certified or fit for human residence, such as an abandoned building; a couch used for sleeping in accommodations that are inadequate or overly crowded; a SRO Unit in which one or more family members are under the age of 18; a transitional housing program; or in such other location that is unsafe or unstable.

(2) “Single Room Occupancy (SRO) Unit” or “SRO Unit” means a dwelling unit or group housing room consisting of no more than one occupied room with a maximum gross floor area of 350 square feet and meeting the Housing Code’s minimum floor area standards. The unit may have a bathroom in addition to the occupied room. As a dwelling unit, it would have a cooking facility and bathroom. As a group housing room, it would share a kitchen with one or more other single room occupancy unit(s) in the same building and may also share a bathroom. A Single Room Occupancy Building (or “SRO Building”) is one in which at least 50% of the units are SRO Units.

(3) “Rental Assistance” means rental subsidies or nonprofit housing operating subsidies that help Homeless people find housing and stabilize in housing in which they are the leaseholders.
