[Expend Grant - Adopting California Environmental Quality Act Findings and Authorizing Grant Expenditure for Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement Project - \$477,900]

Resolution adopting findings under the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"), CEQA Guidelines, and San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 31, including the adoption of a mitigation monitoring and reporting program, related to the funding of Project No. CENMSCIC11, Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement, directing the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors to notify the Controller of this action, and authorizing the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission to expend a grant in the amount of \$477,900 from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency through the Department of the Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies Appropriation Act of 2006.

WHEREAS, the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) developed a project description for Project No. CENMSCIC11, Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement, (the "Project"), and

WHEREAS, The United States Government, acting by and through EPA, is authorized to award Federal Grant Funds under the Department of the Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act of 2006; and

WHEREAS, The FY 2006 United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)

Appropriation included \$500,000 of Federal Grant Funds to the San Francisco Public Utilities

Commission (SFPUC) for water and wastewater infrastructure improvement projects in

California; and,

WHEREAS, The final amount of Federal Grant Funds available to the SFPUC was \$477,900, after reduction for administrative cost of managing the grant and for Congressionally mandated cut to EPA budget; and

WHEREAS, The SFPUC requested \$477,900 in Federal Grant Funds to support construction of a combined sewer/stormwater system along Cesar Chavez Street, as part of the Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement Project; and

WHEREAS, EPA notified the SFPUC on August 9, 2006 that it had approved a grant award of \$477,000 in Federal Funds; and

WHEREAS, Matching funds of 45% of the total project costs (or \$391,009) are required according to the Appropriations Act which authorized the project; and

WHEREAS, Funding for the required project is available from SFPUC Wastewater Enterprise Capital Improvement Program (CIP); and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors on December 18, 2006 adopted Resolution no. 711-06 authorizing the General Manager of the SFPUC to accept \$477,900 in grant funds through the Department of the Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act of 2006, as administered by the EPA; and

WHEREAS, The grant budget does not allow for indirect costs; and
WHEREAS, The grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance (ASO)
Amendment; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 711-06 required completion of environmental review prior to authorizing the expenditure of grant funds; and

WHEREAS, a Draft Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND) for the Cesar Chavez Street Sewer System Improvement Project was prepared and published for public review on December 2, 2009; and

WHEREAS, the Draft IS/MND was available for public comment until January 4, 2010; and

WHEREAS, on January 13, 2010, the Environmental Review Officer (ERO), San Francisco Planning Department, Major Environmental Analysis Division, reviewed and considered the Final Mitigated Negative Declaration (FMND) and found that the contents of said report and the procedures through which the FMND was prepared, publicized, and reviewed complied with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.) ("CEQA"), 14 California Code of Regulations Sections 15000 et seq. (the "CEQA Guidelines") and Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code ("Chapter 31"); and

WHEREAS, the ERO, San Francisco Planning Department, found the FMND was adequate, accurate and objective, and reflected the independent analysis and judgment of the San Francisco Planning Department, and approved the FMND for the Project in compliance with CEQA, the CEQA Guidelines and Chapter 31; and

WHEREAS, the San Francisco Planning Department, is the custodian of records, located in File No.2009.0276E, at 1650 Mission Street, Fourth Floor, San Francisco, California; and

WHEREAS, No appeals were filed with the City and County of San Francisco regarding the Project's MND; the January 13, 2010, MND is final, complete, and in accordance with CEQA, the CEQA Guidelines, and Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code (Final IS/MND); and

WHEREAS, The SFPUC reviewed and considered the information contained in the Final IS/MND, all written and oral information provided by the Planning Department, the public, relevant public agencies, SFPUC and other experts and the administrative files for the Project and the Final IS/MND; and

WHEREAS, On February 23, 2010, the SFPUC (1) adopted Resolution No. 10-0034, approving Project No. CENMSCIC11, Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement, adopting the FMND, the CEQA Findings, and a Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP), which SFPUC Resolution and Attachments are incorporated herein as part of this Resolution by this reference thereto, and (2) approved the Project and authorized staff to proceed with actions necessary to implement the Project. SFPUC Resolution No. 10-0034, which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 270630, including its findings, is incorporated herein by reference as though fully set forth; and

WHEREAS, The SFPUC CEQA Findings reflected the SFPUC's independent review and consideration of the relevant environmental information contained in the Final IS/MND, and the administrative record; and

WHEREAS, In August 2009, this Board of Supervisors adopted Ordinance No. 201-09, approving a supplemental appropriation of \$119,800,000, including funds for the Project, subject to Controller's reserve; and

WHEREAS, On June 8, 2010, the SFPUC adopted Resolution No. 10-0093, authorizing the General Manager of the SFPUC to request permission from the Board of Supervisors to expend the grant funds; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes and adopts the findings set forth in San Francisco Public Utilities Commission's Resolution No. 10-0034 for the Project which reflects this Board's independent review and consideration of the relevant environmental information contained in the Final IS/MND, and the administrative record; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors adopts the Final IS/MND. including the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors directs the Clerk of the Board to forward this Resolution to the Controller, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the General Manager of the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission is authorized to expend \$477,900 in grant funds through the Department of the Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act of 2006, as administered by the EPA, for the aforementioned project; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Board hereby waives inclusion of indirect costs in the grant budget.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

#### Legislative Objective

Resolution (a) adopting findings under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) for the Public
Utilities Commission's (PUC) Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement Project, and (b) authorizing the
PUC to expend \$477,900 in grant funds from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for the Cesar
Chavez Sewer System Improvement Project.

#### **Key Points**

- The PUC's Cesar Chavez Sewer System transports wastewater and stormwater from the lower Bernal Heights area to the Southeast Water Treatment Plant. According to PUC Project Manager Ms. Bessie Tam, the Cesar Chavez Sewer System has inadequate capacity to meet drainage needs during significant storms, such that temporary flooding occurs along Cesar Chavez Street. The PUC's Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement Project (CCSSIP) is a \$25,900,000 project which would provide an additional 6,000 feet of sewer pipeline to increase the capacity of the Cesar Chavez Sewer System, such that flooding would be prevented or minimized.
- The Board of Supervisors previously appropriated a total of \$25,900,000 from Wastewater Revenue Bond proceeds for the PUC's Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement Project, with \$11,650,000 of the previously appropriated amount placed on Controller's reserve (File 10-0339), pending completion of the environmental review required by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). Environmental review was completed on January 13, 2010, and the PUC is now requesting adoption of the CEQA findings, such that the Controller can release the \$11,650,000 of funds on reserve.
- The PUC has received two grants from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) totaling \$1,146,900 to pay for a portion of the CCSSIP's construction costs, including (a) the subject grant of \$477,900 which the PUC is now requesting authority to expend, and (b) a separate \$669,000 grant which the PUC will request authority to expend in separate future legislation. According to Ms. Tam, these grants are reimbursement grants, such that the EPA will provide funds only after the PUC has expended the funds for the Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement Project and submitted reimbursement requests to the grantor.

#### Fiscal Impacts

- The EPA requires that the subject reimbursement grants represent no more than 55 percent of the 'project's costs. Ms. Tam noted that the grants totaling \$1,146,900 represent only 4.4 percent of the total project costs of \$25,900,000.
- The proposed resolution to approve the expenditure of a \$477,900 grant would reimburse the PUC for the expenditure of \$477,900 in Wastewater Revenue Bonds, which were previously appropriated by the Board of Supervisors.

#### Recommendation

Approve the proposed resolution.

#### MANDATE STATEMENT AND BACKGROUND

#### **Mandate Statement**

According to Section 1.170-1 of the City's Administrative Code, the acceptance and expenditure of Federal, State, or other grant funds is subject to approval by resolution of the Board of Supervisors.

#### Background

The PUC's Cesar Chavez Sewer System transports wastewater and stormwater from the lower Bernal Heights area to the Southeast Water Treatment Plant, in the Bayview District. According to PUC Project Manager Ms. Bessie Tam, the Cesar Chavez Sewer System has inadequate capacity to meet drainage needs during significant storms, such that temporary flooding occurs along Cesar Chavez Street. The PUC's Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement Project (CCSSIP) is a \$25,900,000 project which would provide an additional 6,000 feet of sewer pipeline to increase the capacity of the Cesar Chavez Sewer System, such that flooding would be prevented or minimized.

Construction of the Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement Project is estimated to begin in November of 2010 and be completed in February of 2012. Table 1 below shows the estimated project cost of \$25,900,000.

#### DETAILS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

The proposed resolution would (a) adopt findings under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) for the Public Utilities Commission's (PUC) Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement Project, and (b) authorize the PUC to expend \$477,900 in grant funds from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for the Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement Project, in order for such monies to be reimbursed to the PUC for previously expended Wastewater Revenue Bond monies.

#### **CEQA Findings**

The proposed resolution would adopt findings under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) for the Public Utilities Commission's (PUC) Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement Project.

The Board of Supervisors previously appropriated a total of \$25,900,000 for the PUC's Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement Project, including (a) \$14,250,000 on August 18, 2009 (File 09-0546) in Wastewater Revenue Bond proceeds, and (b) \$11,650,000 on April 27, 2010 (File 10-0339) from Wastewater Revenue Bond proceeds and State of California grant proceeds<sup>1</sup>, with the entire \$11,650,000 appropriation placed on Controller's reserve pending completion of the environmental review required by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

Environmental review was completed by the Planning Department on January 13, 2010. According to Ms. Tam, the mitigation measures required by the Planning Department's environmental findings are included in an amount of \$870,000 out of the \$25,900,000 budget shown in Table 1 above. The proposed resolution would approve the findings of that environmental review, and notify the Controller of the authorization to allow the Controller to release the \$11,650,000 of funds on reserve.

#### **EPA Grant Expenditure**

The proposed resolution would also authorize the PUC to expend \$477,900 in grant funds from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency in order to fund a portion of the \$20,900,000 estimated construction costs (see Table 1 above) of the total cost of the \$25,900,000 Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement Project.

In addition to the State of California grants previously appropriated by the Board of Supervisors and discussed above, the PUC has received two grants from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for the Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement Project totaling \$1,146,900, including (a) the subject grant of \$477,900 which the PUC is now requesting authority to expend, and (b) a separate \$669,000 grant which the PUC will request authority from the Board of Supervisors to expend in separate future legislation. According to Ms. Tam, these grants are reimbursement grants, such that the EPA will provide the \$477,900 in funds only after the PUC has expended these funds and submitted reimbursement documentation to the EPA.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> File 10-0339 appropriated a total of \$348,064,054 to various categories of wastewater capital improvement projects. The subject Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement Project was one project included in the Sewer/Collection System category of projects, with that category being appropriated a total of \$69,019,400, including (a) \$30,000,000 in State of California grants, and (b) \$39,019,400 in Wastewater Revenue Bond proceeds. Because File 10-0339 appropriated funds by category, not by individual project, according to PUC Budget Manager Mr. Carlos Jacobo, it is not possible to determine the amount of the \$30,000,000 in grant funds, if any, which were allocated to the Cesar Chavez Sewer System Improvement Project.

#### FISCAL IMPACTS

According to Ms. Tam, the Federal EPA grants totaling \$1,146,900, including (a) the subject grant of \$477,900 which the PUC is now requesting authority to expend, and (b) a separate \$669,000 grant which the PUC will request authority from the Board of Supervisors to expend in separate future legislation, require that the grant represent no more than 55 percent of the project's costs. Ms. Tam noted that the grants totaling \$1,146,900 represent only 4.4 percent of the total project costs of \$25,900,000. The remaining 95.6 percent of project costs, or \$24,753,100 (\$25,900,000 less \$1,146,900) out of the total project costs of \$25,900,000, would be funded from Wastewater Revenue Bond proceeds, the debt service on which is paid from fees paid by wastewater customers, and grants.

The proposed resolution to approve the expenditure of a \$477,900 grant from the EPA would reimburse the PUC for the expenditure of \$477,900 in Wastewater Revenue Bond monies, which were previously appropriated by the Board of Supervisors.

#### **SUMMARY OF PROPOSED COMMISSION ACTION**

#### CONTEXT OF THIS ACTION:

In March 2006, the SFPUC received notice that the FY 2006 United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Appropriation included \$500,000 of funding to the SFPUC for water and wastewater infrastructure improvement projects in California. Congress instructed EPA to reduce each Appropriations Grant by 3% to cover the administrative cost of managing the grant. The grant amount was further reduced by an across the board, Congressionally-mandated cut to the EPA budget. The final amount of funding available to the SFPUC was \$477,900. Matching funds of 45% of the total project costs (or \$391,009) were also required according to the Appropriations Act, which authorized the project.

In May 2006, SFPUC staff submitted a grant application for Wastewater Enterprise 5-Year CIP funded project, Cesar Chavez Sewer Improvement, which focuses on collection system improvements along Cesar Chavez Blvd. The goal of the project is to improve the capability of the sewer system to collect and convey stormwater and sewage to treatment facilities.

Section 10.170 of the San Francisco Administrative Code permits the application for federal, state, or other grants upon the approval of the department head. Section of 10.170-1 of the San Francisco Administrative Code further states that the acceptance and expenditure of Federal, State or other grant funds is subject to the approval by resolution of the Board of Supervisors.

The application for this grant was submitted on May 30, 2006. On August 9, 2006, EPA notified SFPUC staff that Cesar Chavez Sewer Improvement construction work had been approved for \$477,900 in grant funds, and required local matching funds of \$391,009.

- The FY 2006 EPA appropriation provides funds to the SFPUC for water and wastewater infrastructure improvement projects in California.
- Cesar Chavez Sewer Improvement will provide significant improvements to sewage and stormwater collection capabilities in the project area.
- Grant funding will allow for the reallocation of funds to other Wastewater projects as needed.

WHEREAS, The FY 2006 United States EPA Appropriation included \$500,000 of Federal Grant Funds to the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) for water and wastewater infrastructure improvement projects in California; and,

WHEREAS, The final amount of Federal Grant Funds available to the SFPUC was \$477,900, after reduction for administrative cost of managing the grant and for Congressionally mandated cut to EPA budget; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco Public Utilities Commission staff filed a timely application, for Cesar Chavez System Improvement construction work, requesting \$477,900 in Federal Grant Funds; and

WHEREAS, EPA notified the SFPUC on August 9, 2006 that it had approved a grant award of \$477,000 in Federal Funds; and

WHEREAS, Matching funds of 45% of the total project costs (or \$391,009) are required according to the Appropriations Act which authorized the project; and,

WHEREAS, Funding for the required Wastewater Capital Improvement Program matching funding is available from Wastewater Enterprise 5-Year CIP Program, Project No. CENMSCICSR – Sewer Improvements;

WHEREAS, SFPUC staff are currently completing project planning analyses and preparing environmental review documentation; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That this Commission authorizes the General Manager of the Public Utilities to request permission from the Board of Supervisors to accept grant funds totaling \$477,900 from the Department of the Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act of 2006, as administered by the EPA, with required local matching funds of \$391,009 from the Wastewater Enterprise 5-Year Capital Improvement Program, for Cesar Chavez Sewer Improvement; and to execute all documents required therefore; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, In accepting this grant, the Commission is not approving the expenditure of any grant funds. Before the Commission determines whether to approve the expenditure of grant funds, the Commission will undertake environmental review of the proposed project pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), CEQA Guidelines and San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 31 and conduct any public review and environmental review determinations required by CEQA. The Commission retains absolute discretion to modify the proposed project as it deems necessary to mitigate any significant environmental effects, to select other feasible alternatives to the project to avoid significant effects, to balance the benefits of the project against unavoidable significant impacts, if any, and to determine not to proceed with the proposed project based upon information generated by the enviro

#### Administrative Conditions

- 1. An interim Financial Status Report (FSR), Standard Form 269A (Rev. 7/97), covering the period from "project/budget period start date" to September 30 of each calendar year shall be submitted to the Grants Management Office, MTS-7, no later than December 31 of the same calendar year. The initial FSR is due December 31, 2007. The final FSR covering the entire project period shall be submitted to the U.S. EPA Las Vegas Finance Center, PO Box 98515, Las Vegas, NV 89193-8515, within 90 days after the end of the project period according to the recipient's respective Code of Federal Regulations Part 31.23(b) or Part 30.52(a)(1)(iv)).
- 2. The recipient shall comply with the Single Audit Act and the reporting requirements set forth in OMB Circular A-133.
- 3. The recipient agrees to complete and submit to the Grants Management Office, MTS-7, a MBE/WBE Utilization Report (EPA Form 5700-52A), within 30 days after the end of the Federal fiscal year, i.e., by October 30 of each calendar year. Negative reports are required.
- 4. In accordance with EPA's Program for Utilization of Small, Minority and Women's Business Enterprises in procurement under Federal assistance programs, the recipient agrees to:
  - a) Accept the applicable "fair share" goals negotiated with EPA by the CA State Water Resources Control Board, as follows:

If the recipient does not want to rely on the applicable State's MBE/WBE "fair share" goals, the recipient agrees to submit proposed MBE/WBE "fair share" goals based on availability of qualified minority and women-owned businesses to do work in the relevant market for construction, services, supplies, and equipment.

"Fair share" objectives must be submitted to Joe Ochab, MTS-1, within 30 days of award and approved by EPA no later than 30 days thereafter.

- b) Ensure to the fullest extent possible that at least the applicable "fair share" objective (see a) above) of Federal funds for prime contracts for supplies, construction, equipment or services are made available to organizations owned or controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals, women and historically black colleges and universities.
- c) Include in its bid documents applicable "fair share" objectives (see a) above) and require all of its prime contractors to include in their bid documents for subcontracts the negotiated fair share percentages.
- d) Follow the six affirmative steps stated in 40 CFR Section 30.44(b), Section 31.36(e), Section 35.3145(d), or Section 35.6580(a), as appropriate.
- e) In the event race and/or gender neutral efforts prove to be inadequate to achieve

a fair share objective for MBE/WBEs, the recipient agrees to notify EPA in advance of any race and/or geter conscious action it plans to take to note closely achieve the fair share objective.

- f) Until the recipient has completed its fair share negotiations with EPA, it agrees to apply the main State agency's fair share objectives. Once the recipient has completed its fair share negotiations with EPA, it will apply those objectives. The recipient also agrees to include in its bid documents the applicable "fair share" objectives and require all of its prime contractors to include in their bid documents for subcontracts the applicable "fair share" percentages and to comply with paragraphs (c) through (e) above.
- 5. The cost principles of OMB Circular A-87 are applicable to this award. Since there are no indirect costs included in the assistance budget, they are not allowable under this Assistance Agreement.
- 6. When procuring services, equipment, and/or supplies under this assistance agreement, the recipient will follow the same policies and procedures it uses for procurements from its non-Federal funds. The recipient will follow their own procurement policies and procedures provided that the policies and procedures conform with EPA regulations 40 CFR Part 31.36 or 30.44 (as applicable) which state that all procurement transactions will be conducted in a manner providing full and open competition.
- 7. The recipient agrees to comply with Title 40 CFR Part 34, New Restrictions on Lobbying. The recipient shall include the language of this provision in award documents for all subawards exceeding \$100,000, and require that subrecipients submit certification and disclosure forms accordingly.

In accordance with the Byrd Anti-Lobbying Amendment, any recipient who makes a prohibited expenditure under Title 40 CFR Part 34 or fails to file the required certification or lobbying forms shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000 and not more than \$100,000 for each such expenditure.

8. Pursuant to EPA's annual Appropriations Act, the chief executive officer of this recipient agency shall require that no grant funds have been used to engage in Jobbying of the Federal Government or in litigation against the United States unless authorized under existing law. The Lobbying and Litigation certification and final Financial Status Report shall be submitted within 90 days after the end of project period.

Recipient shall abide by its respective OMB Circular (A-21, A-87, or A-122), which prohibits the use of federal grant funds for litigation against the United States. Any Part 30 recipient shall abide by its respective OMB Circular (A-21 or A-122), which prohibits the use of Federal grant funds to participate in various forms of lobbying or other political activities.

9. Pursuant to EPA Order 1000.25 and Executive Order 13101, the recipient agrees to use recycled paper for all reports which are prepared as a part of this agreement and delivered to EPA. This requirement does not apply to Standard Forms. These forms are printed on recycled paper as available through the General Services Administration. Recipient shall comply with the requirements set forth in Section 6002 of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) (42 U.S.C. 6962). Regulations issued under RCRA Section 6002 apply to any acquisition of an item where the purchase price

exceeds \$10,000 or what he quantity of such items acquired the course of the preceding fiscal year was \$10,000 or more. RCRA Section  $60 \lor \angle$  requires that preference be given in procurement programs to the purchase of specific products containing recycled materials identified in guidelines developed by EPA. These guidelines are listed in 40 CFR 247.

- 10. Effective October 1, 1994, the recipient agrees to ensure that all conference, meeting, convention, or training space funded in whole or in part with Federal funds complies with the Hotel and Motel Fire Safety Act of 1990.
- 11. Payment to consultants. Per 40 CFR Part 31.36(j), EPA's participation in the salary rate (excluding overhead and travel) paid to individual consultants retained by recipients or by a recipient's contractors or subcontractors shall be limited to the maximum daily rate for a Level IV of the Executive Schedule, to be adjusted annually. This limit applies to consultation services of designated individuals with specialized skills and if the terms of the contract provide the recipient with responsibility for the selection, direction, and control of the individuals who will be providing services under the contract at an hourly or daily rate of compensation. As of January 1, 2006, the rate is \$548.08 per day and \$68.51 per hour. This rate does not include overhead or travel costs and the recipient may pay these in accordance with its normal travel practices.

Subagreements with firms or individuals for services which are awarded using the procurement requirements in 40 CFR Parts 30 or 31, as applicable, are not affected by this limitation unless the terms of the contract provide the recipient with responsibility for the selection, direction, and control of the individuals who will be providing services under the contract at an hourly or daily rate of compensation. See 40 CFR Part 31.36(j)(2) or Part 30.27(b).

12. The recipient shall fully comply with Subpart C of 40 CFR Part 32, entitled "Responsibilities of Participants Regarding Transactions." The recipient is responsible for ensuring that any lower tier covered transaction, as described in Subpart B of 40 CFR Part 32, entitled "Covered Transactions," includes a term or condition requiring compliance with Subpart C. The recipient is responsible for further requiring the inclusion of a similar term or condition in any subsequent lower tier covered transactions. The recipient acknowledges that failing to disclose the information required under 40 CFR 32.335 may result in the delay or negation of this assistance agreement, or pursuance of legal remedies, including suspension and debarment.

The recipient may access the Excluded Parties List System at <a href="http://epis.arnet.gov">http://epis.arnet.gov</a>. This term and condition supersedes EPA Form 5700-49, "Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, and Other Responsibility Matters."

#### **Programmatic Conditions**

P1. In accordance with 40 C.F.R. §31.40, the recipient agrees to submit its quarterly reports with brief information on each of the following areas: 1) a comparison of actual accomplishments to the outputs/outcomes established in the assistance agreement workplan for the period; 2) the reasons for slippage if established outputs/outcomes were not met; and 3) additional pertinent information, including, when appropriate, analysis and formation of cost overruns or high unit costs.

In accordance with 40 C.F.R. § 31.40 (d), the recipient agrees to inform EPA as soon as problems, delays or adverse conditions become known which will materially impair the ability to meet the outputs/outcomes specified in the assistance agreement work plan.

P2. In accordance with t National Environmental Policy Act (PA), 42 U.S.C. § 4321 et seg., EPA is required to conduct an environmental review on the project funded by this grant. Accordingly, the recipient agrees to provide EPA, in a timely fashion, an environmental information document (EID) containing all the necessary information on the project including a written analysis of the alternatives and the environmental impacts of the project. The EID must be of sufficient scope and detail to enable EPA to perform an environmental review under NEPA and other Federal environmental statutes.

The recipient agrees to cooperate with the EPA project officer to establish the appropriate procedures to be followed to ensure that the NEPA environmental review process is completed in accordance with NEPA and 40 CFR Parts 6 and 1500 et seq. Completion of this review will be evidenced by the issuance of a Categorical Exclusion (CE), the conclusion of the Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) process, or the issuance of a Record of Decision (ROD). Furthermore, the recipient agrees to implement reasonable measures to mitigate the environmental impacts of the project.

EPA will not approve or fund any work beyond the conceptual design point until the NEPA requirements and other relevant authorities have been met. Additionally, EPA reserves the right to unilaterally terminate this grant in the event the recipient fails to comply with this condition, in accordance with 40 C.F.R. Section 31.43.

P3. The recipient agrees to provide to EPA Region 9 locational data (i.e. latitude and longitude) for the EPA-funded infrastructure project. The EPA Project Officer will provide further instructions at a later date on how to specifically comply with this requirement.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The project sponsor, the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC), is proposing the Cesar Chavez Street Sewer System Improvement Project (project). The San Francisco Planning Department is the lead agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The project includes improvements to existing sewer pipelines in the Mission District and lower Bernal Heights area (project area) in the City and County of San Francisco (City) to improve reliability of the combined sewer system and to minimize potential flooding in the project area. The project alignment spans Cesar Chavez Street from Hampshire Street to San Jose Avenue, Harrison Street from Cesar Chavez Street to 26th Street, Valencia Street between Cesar Chavez and Mission Streets, Mission Street at the intersection of Cesar Chavez Street and Fair Avenue, Tiffany Avenue at the intersection of Valencia Street and Duncan Street, Fair Avenue from Mission Street to Coleridge Street, Coleridge Street from Fair Avenue to Coso Avenue, and Coso Avenue from Coleridge Street halfway to Mirabel Avenue. The project would include installation of a new 72-inch to 84-inch diameter auxiliary sewer beneath Cesar Chavez Street, relining of the existing sewer under Cesar Chavez Street, and replacement of the existing sewers along other project streets with larger diameter pipelines to meet a 5-year storm design standard.

The proposed project would be located within the City's street rights-of-way which are under Department of Public Works (DPW) jurisdiction. The overall project construction schedule would be approximately 22 months, from May, 2010 through February, 2012 depending on weather. All new sewer work, with the exception of rehabilitation of existing sewers beneath Cesar Chavez Street, is anticipated to be completed in 14 to 16 months. The sewer lining work that is part of the rehabilitation of the existing brick sewer beneath Cesar Chavez Street between Hampshire Street and Valencia Street is anticipated to be completed in approximately a 4- to 5-month period towards the end of the overall construction schedule.
