[Accept and Expend Grant - Medical Monitoring Project - \$401,770]

Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of Public Health to accept and expend retroactively a grant from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in the amount of \$401,770 to support a project entitled, "Medical Monitoring Project" for the period of June 1, 2010, through May 31, 2011.

WHEREAS, DPH was awarded a grant from the CDC in the amount of \$401,770 to fund the second year of a five year project entitled Medical Monitoring Project; for the period of June 1, 2010 through May 31, 2011; and,

WHEREAS, The CDC is allocating funds annually but intends to fund the project for five years if the grantee's progress is satisfactory, in which case DPH will get a total of \$2,008,850 for five years; and,

WHEREAS, The Medical Monitoring Project is a comprehensive population-based project to gather detailed information on HIV-infected patients receiving care in the United States; and,

WHEREAS, The grant does not require an ASO amendment and reimburses DPH for two existing positions: one Manager I (Job Class# 0922) at 0.10 FTE and one Health Program Coordinator III (Job Class# 2593) at 0.15 FTE, for the period of June 1, 2010 through May 31, 2011; and,

WHEREAS, DPH will subcontract with the Public Health Foundation Enterprises, Inc., in the amount of \$362,168 for the period of June 1, 2010 through May 31, 2011; and,

WHEREAS, The grant budget includes a provision for indirect costs in the amount of \$6,184; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That DPH is hereby authorized to retroactively accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$401,770 from the CDC; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That DPH is hereby authorized to retroactively accept and expend the grant funds pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code section 10.170-1; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Controller is directed to designate the positions funded under this agreement as a "G" or grant-funded position which would terminate when the agreement expires; and, be it


