13	the United States Army Reserve and is a veteran of the Korean War; and
14	WHEREAS, Upon returning to the United States, Carl began his esteemed sixty-
15	two-year career at the San Francisco Chronicle on June 13, 1961; and
16	WHEREAS, During his time at the Chronicle, Carl has served as a journalist and
17	an editor, and spent time as a war correspondent, writing about the Gulf War, the
18	invasion of Iraq and the SS Jeremiah O'Brien; and
19	WHEREAS, Carl has won several awards for his work in journalism, including a
20	distinguished career award from the Society of Professional Journalists, a maritime
21	heritage award from the San Francisco Maritime Park Association, and holds honorary
22	degrees from the University of San Francisco and the California State University
23	Maritime Academy; and
24	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby commends Carl Nolte for his
25	decades of service at the San Francisco Chronicle and his unwavering dedication to the

1	field of journalism that has left an indelible mark on both the profession and the
