
Statement of interest, explaining why you want to serve and what your qualifications.

The nine-member San Francisco Redistricting Task Force took its first step toward naming its members when the Elections Commission accepted applications on April 29 for the three appointments that fall under its auspices.

A May 4 Election Commission meeting clarified the eligible list, making it 25 applicants, and set a May 19 date to begin its selection process. Three applicants earlier reported on *CitiReport* as among those being considered were found to have submitted their applications shortly after the 5 p.m. deadline; a fourth applicant, former Redevelopment Agency director Ed Helfeld, was inadvertently omitted from *CitiReport*'s earlier post.

The Board of Supervisors indicates it will post its process for applying for appointment on May 9 for the three seats the Board appoints. Some of post-deadline Election applicants or those not selected could well resubmit themselves as potential Board appointments.

The Mayor's office has yet to respond to questions about its process for making appointments, and whether citizens will have the opportunity to nominate themselves.

The Election Commission applicants came from diverse backgrounds, but many did not include information on which part of the city is their home or their ethnic background. Those factors could be decisive in a final selection process as appointing officials seek to ensure that the city is well represented on the Redistricting Task Force.

Downtown groups showed their strong interest in the outcome of redrawn lines for electing supervisors for the next ten years. Among the applicants is Ken Cleaveland, government relations director and lobbyist for the Building Owners and Managers Association, Daniel Scherotter, past president of the Golden Gate Restaurant Association, Ted Lowenberg, a leader in the "Civil Sidewalks" ballot measure, and Melissa Tidwell, Google's corporate counsel.

Several applicants previously sought election to the Board of Supervisors. They are Ron Dudum, Steven Moss, Owen O'Donnell and Kat Anderson.

If the list of applicants tilts in any direction – perhaps more to the moderate than reform –minded side of city politics – it is also dense with serious-minded residents with a record of accomplishments. Several are published authors of professional papers on voting and political engagement as well as authoring books and professionally lecturing. Several are experienced professionals in computer analysis of data.

The candidates include Asian Pacific Islanders, African Americans, LGBT members, Jewish community leaders, and retired white males. Only a handful of the applications



Statement of Interest and Qualifications

I am a professor of law at the University of California, Davis, where I have taught since 2004 (with tenure since 2007). I specialize in election law. I have a growing interest in the problems of and possibilities for democracy at the local-government level. I have also written on the federal Voting Rights Act, which establishes important constraints on the work of local redistricting bodies. In short, I would bring to the redistricting task force a considerable amount of pertinent legal expertise, as well as familiarity with much of the relevant political science literature.

My desire to serve on the redistricting task force grows out of my professional and intellectual interest in the task force's assignment, and my desire to give back to my community--my city--at this stage in my career.

If appointed to the task force, I would take very seriously the duty of impartiality that I understand to inhere in this position. I have worked in other positions that require the setting aside of one's personal ideological views--for example, as a law clerk to a federal judge. As a professor, I pride myself on challenging students rather than imparting a particular worldview. I have no affiliation with any interest group with a stake in the redistricting process, and I have never worked and do not intend to work for a candidate for elective office in San Francisco.

I have lived in San Francisco since 2005, when my now-wife moved from New York to join me in California. We live in the Mission District, with our two young children (ages 3 and 1). I commute by train to Davis on days that I teach (usually three days/week during the fall and spring semesters), and I work from home otherwise. During the fall of 2011, I will be a visiting professor at U.C. Hastings College of Law and will not be commuting to Davis.



For the past three years, I have served as president of the Raoul Wallenberg Jewish Democratic Club—a city-wide club with members in each supervisorial district. I have gained a nuanced understanding the City's neighborhoods and communities of interest. I have also learned a great deal about the importance of having an advocate at City Hall who knows her or his constituents well. A representative democracy depends on it.

Serving on this Taskforce would provide me with the ability to couple my knowledge of the City's neighborhoods and communities with my background in the law to ultimately create fair and representative supervisorial districts within the City.

- 4. I am not currently a direct-hire of an elected official of CCSF.
- 5. I have strong general and specific knowledge of San Francisco's neighborhoods and geography. In my 23 years of residency here, I have lived in Districts 5, 10, 4, 3 and 2. I am a director of a neighborhood organization, on the Auxiliary to the Foundation of City College of San Francisco, and am a board member of 2 other civic organizations in San Francisco.
- 6. My flexible schedule will allow me to attend the task force meetings.
- 7. I do not have a conflict of interest related to this appointment.

STATEMENT OF INTEREST AND QUALIFICATIONS:

I love our city, San Francisco, and am passionate about our government working well for its residents. It is important that *all* are represented; that no one is marginalized or left with no voice in City Hall. Therefore, I wish to work on the Redistricting Task Force to help ensure that San Franciscans are represented fairly in the electoral process and that they are encouraged and empowered to do so.



In my capacity as a political blogger, and after 15 years of electoral campaign work, I have extensive experience studying political demographics and basic voting trends. I would come to this job with a solid familiarity with the mechanics such a task entails.

Specifically, I was involved in re-districting efforts ten years ago in Berkeley – when I participated in citizen efforts to draw new City Council districts after the 2000 census. And while I did not play an active role, I also followed San Francisco's own process then.

As a District 6 resident, and as someone with deep professional ties with that community for over a decade, I am especially concerned about this year's Redistricting Task Force. District 6 will see more changes to its boundaries than anywhere else in the City, and it will be extremely important for District 6 stakeholders to be represented this time around.

I have spent a lifetime traveling through the various neighborhoods of San Francisco and am intimately familiar with our City's diversity and geography. I have the time to dedicate to the work of the Task Force and the flexibility to attend meetings. Finally, I am not aware of any conflict of interest that prohibits me from serving on this Task Force.

Statement:

I have been a candidate for the Board of Supervisors four times over the past eleven years. I am intimately aware with the grass-root nature of district elections, the constituent expectations, and demands of public service. I testified before the Redistricting Task Force at its inception and have significant knowledge regarding campaign financing, run-off, and IRV elections. I have no personal agenda, am not representing any special interest, and only want to serve my City. The work of this Task Force is very important and I would strive to make sure that the process is both fair and impartial. I would be honored to serve. Thank you for your consideration.

Ronald A. Dudum

(brief biography)

Ron was born in San Francisco in 1956. Ever since, he has lived at the intersection of American confusion on race. His mother's parents emigrated from Palestine to the United States in the 1930s and settled on the East Coast, where his mother was born. At the age of 18, in 1947, his father emigrated from Palestine to the United States and settled in San Francisco. Since then, there has never been a time when the United States has not been at war with Ron's ancestry.

Legally, the federal government identifies people from the Middle East and North Africa as "white." This means that black Egyptians are technically white, despite the color of their skin! But, as former San Francisco Mayor Willie Brown once told Ron, "White people *know* you're not white." In other words, Middle Easterners are an unrecognized minority for whom there are no discrimination protections and no affirmative action advantages. For this reason, Ron identifies with Ralph Ellison's Invisible Man.

By religion, Ron is an Eastern Orthodox Christian in a country that defines Christianity as Western and recognizes Buddhism, Hinduism, Confucianism, and Taoism as Eastern. So, once again, Ron falls between the cracks.

In the political arena, Ron has to some extent beaten the odds. In 2006, when he ran for the San Francisco Board of Supervisors, he was defeated by only 53 votes out of more than 20,000 cast, even though his neighbors are primarily Asian and Irish Americans, and there is no Arab-American vote of any consequence.

Ron's life has been an unending struggle to reconcile such contradictions.
