[Acceptance of Gift for Building Bocce Courts in Justin Herman Plaza]

Resolution authorizing the Recreation and Park Department to accept a gift of labor and construction materials with a value of \$61,000 from the Laborers Local 261 Community and Training Foundation to build two bocce courts on the lawn in Justin Herman Plaza.

WHEREAS, The lawn to the south of the Market Street streetbed in Justin Herman Plaza is an underutilized area of an otherwise active plaza; and

WHEREAS, The Mayor's Office, in conjunction with the Recreation and Park Department, desires to activate the plaza to create a vibrant, beautiful place for San Franciscans to relax and recreate; and

WHEREAS, The Laborers Local 261 Community and Training Foundation (Donor) has offered the City a gift of labor and construction materials to create bocce courts on the lawn; and

WHEREAS, A conceptual site plan for the proposed project is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein; and

WHEREAS, This construction work requires no additional funds or work from the City; and

WHEREAS, In the future, the City may decide to use this space in a different manner that will require the removal of the bocce ball courts and Donor agrees to remove the courts and restore the lawn to its original condition at its own expense; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Recreation and Park Department is authorized to accept this gift on behalf of the City on the condition that Donor will remove the courts and restore the lawn to

its original condition at its own expense if, in the future, the City decides to use the space in a different manner; and, be it

LETTER OF AGREEMENT FOR THE GIFT OF JUSTIN HERMAN PLAZA BOCCE COURTS TO THE RECREATION AND PARK DEPARTMENT FROM THE LABORERS COMMUNITY & TRAINING FOUNDATION, LIUNA, LOCAL 261

This letter of agreement is made and entered into as of September 8, 2010 (the "Reference Date"), by and between the Laborers Community & Training Foundation, Local 261 ("LL261") and the Recreation and Park Commission") of the City and County of San Francisco (the "City"), acting through its Recreation and Park Department ("RPD").

The LLZ61 and RPD hereby agree to the following terms of this gift agreement for the installation of two regulation size Bocce Courts to be located on the South Lawn of justin Herman Plaza:

Recitals

- A. RPD operates and maintains certain real property commonly referred to as the "Justin Herman Plaza Lawn" (the "Lawn") located on Steuart Street in the City, as more particularly described in Exhibit A attached hereto (the "Property"). The Property is under the jurisdiction of the Commission.
- B. LL261 proposes to make an in-place donation to the City of construction labor and materials, with such donation having a minimum value of \$61,000, including all directly gifted funds, gifts of services and materials, and associated administrative costs of and incurred by LL261 (the "Gift"), effective upon the Acceptance Date.
- C. On August 5, 2010, the Commission voted to recommend to the Board of Supervisors of the City (the "Board") that the City accept such Gift, effective upon the Acceptance Date.

Agreement

Subject to, and effective upon, the Board's acceptance of the Gift (the "Acceptance Date"), the parties hereto agree as follows:

- Scope of the Project: The "Project" shall include the Site Preparation, Site Cleaning, the construction
 of the Bocce Courts, and any future removal of the Bocce Courts should the City decide to pursue a
 different use for the plaza.
- <u>Definitions</u>: For the purposes of this agreement, the following capitalized terms shall be defined as follows;

"Improvements" shall mean the Site Preparation, and construction and installation of the Bocce Courts,

"Bocce Courts" shall mean the new court surfaces and lirings constructed in accordance with the Conceptual Plan and the Construction Documents.

"Site Proparation" shall mean the removal of the existing turf.

- 3. LL261 Responsibilities. LL261 will provide the following:
 - (a) Construction Documents. Detailed construction drawings and specifications as required for the planned improvements.
 - (b) <u>Construction Management.</u> Professional construction administration and construction management services necessary for the construction of the Improvements.

- (c) Equipment. Construction materials necessary to produce two regulation size bocce courts.
- (d) Possible Future Removal of Court. Removal of the Bocce Courts at the City's sole discretion at some point in the future, complete with replacement of grass to return the site to its previous state.
- (e) Insurance. LL261 will indemnify the City for its activities on the Project, provide proof of insurance, and name the City as an additional insured for the duration of time that on-site construction is being performed on the designated City-owned land
- (f) Wages. LL261 agrees to pay prevailing wage to all non-apprentice workers as legally required of all construction projects occurring on City-owned land.
- 4. RPD Responsibilities. RPD will provide the following:
 - (a) <u>Coordination</u>. Coordination of all city approvals and reviews, including but not limited to City ADA Coordinator, Recreation and Park staffand Commission reviews.
 - (b) Public Meetings. Pacilitation of community meetings and public notification process.
- 5. Gift. Following the Acceptance Date LLZ61 shall give the Gift to the City.
- Maintenance. The site will continue to be maintained as per the existing agreement between Boston Properties, RPD, and DPW.
- 7. Time. Both parties agree that time is of the essence. Therefore, RPD agrees to seek Board approval to accept the Gift immediately, and contingent upon the Board's acceptance, LL261 agrees to give the Gift to the City by October 15, 2010.
- 8. <u>Termination</u>. At any time prior to the Acceptance Date, either party shall have the right to terminate this agreement. Any such termination shall be effective upon delivery of written notice of same to the other party.
- 9. Miscellaneous.
 - (a) Notices. All notices, demands, requests or other communications given under this agreement shall be in writing and be given by personal delivery. United States Postal Service, or nationally recognized overnight courier service to the address set forth below or as may subsequently in writing be requested. Any party may change the notice addresses set forth below at any time by written notice of same to the other party.

- (b) <u>Entire Agreement: Amendments.</u> All recitals set forth above are hereby incorporated into the body of this letter of gift agreement. This letter of gift agreement, including all exhibits attached, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior agreements, promises and understandings, whether oral or written. This gift agreement shall not be modified, amended, supplemented or revised, except by a written document signed by both parties.
- (c) <u>Counterparts</u>. This agreement may be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.



