8	F.3d 950, the Tenth Circuit Court of Appeals recognized in February 2003 that disparities in
	private markets in the region provide a strong indicator of the extent to which minorities and
10 11	women would be used in a public entity's contracting program absent any remedial affirmative
	action programs; and,
12	WHEREAS, This Board recently passed legislation extending the
13	Minority/Women/Local Business Utilization Ordinance ("MBE/WBE Ordinance") to June 30,
14	2008 to continue to remedy identified discrimination against MBE and WBE prime contractors
15	and subcontractors in city contracting; and,
16	WHEREAS, The evidence on which this Board relied to reauthorize the MBE/WBE
17	Ordinance included, among other things, compelling statistical and anecdotal evidence
18	obtained by the San Francisco Human Rights Commission that establishes the ongoing
19	discrimination against minority and women owned businesses in the Bay Area private sector;
20	and,
21	WHEREAS, By continuing to obtain evidence regarding discrimination against minority
22	and women owned businesses in the Bay Area private sector, as well as other evidence of
23	discrimination against MBEs and WBEs, the Board will continue to ensure that the MBE/WBE
