WHEREAS, The original "Three Strikes" law under Penal Code section 667.7 mandated a 20 year sentence for a third violent conviction and a life sentence for a fourth violent conviction and,

WHEREAS, The new version of the "Three Strikes" law passed by California voters in 1994 broadened the qualifications for the first two "strikes" to include not just violent offenses but also offenses deemed "serious," and it allows any type of felony conviction to constitute a third strike and,

WHEREAS, With these new qualifications defendants like Santos Reyes are serving a life sentence for giving false information on a Department of Motor Vehicles driver's license test to help his cousin and,

WHEREAS, The first of Santos Reyes' "strikes" was for burglary committed as a juvenile and the second, a robbery, which occurred 10 years before the third strike and,

WHEREAS, The crimes committed by Santos Reyes do not appear to have resulted in physical harm to another person, have sentenced him to life in jail under the new "Three Strikes" law and,

WHEREAS, There are 4,200 nonviolent offenders like Reyes that are currently in prison under "Three Strikes" serving terms that were previously reserved for individuals who have been convicted of murder, mayhem, and serious sex offenses and

RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors requests the Governor of California to revisit the "Three Strikes" law and commute the sentence of Santos Reyes to time already served and release him immediately.
