The Budget and Finance Committee met in regular session on October 29, 2025, with Chair Connie Chan presiding. Chair Chan called the meeting to order at 10:00 am.

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to create the Small Business Rezoning Construction Relief Program ("Program") to provide financial support, including grants and loans, to businesses impacted by construction relating to the City residential rezoning program adopted in 2025-2026; establishing the Small Business Rezoning Construction Relief Fund ("Fund") to receive monies for the Program; designating the Office of Small Business and Office of Economic and Workforce Development to administer the Fund and the Program and promulgate rules and regulations in furtherance of the Program; and amending the Business and Tax Regulations Code to allow taxpayers to designate a portion of their gross receipts taxes for deposit in the Fund.

A business or nonprofit organization with 100 or fewer full-time employees and an annual gross revenue of \$5 million or less for the 2025 calendar year, and adjusted annually each year thereafter in accordance with the increase in the Consumer Price Index: All Urban Consumers for the San Francisco/Oakland/Hayward Area for All Items as reported by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics, or any successor to that index, as of December 31 of the year two years prior to the calendar year, beginning with calendar year 2026, and rounded to the nearest \$10,000; or 2. If the business is an Eating and Drinking Use establishment as defined in Section 102 of the Planning Code with 100 or fewer full-time employees or with an annual gross revenue of \$7 million or less for the 2025 calendar year, and adjusted annually each year thereafter in accordance with the increase in the Consumer Price Index: All Urban Consumers for the San Francisco/Oakland/Hayward Area for All Items as reported by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics, or any successor to that index, as of December 31 of the year two years prior to the calendar year, beginning with calendar year 2026, and rounded to the nearest \$10,000.'; on Page 6, Lines 5-6, by inserting 'prioritization of assistance to impacted Small Businesses having only one location' after 'grants', and by making other clarifying and conforming changes throughout the legislation text.
