Dear Director Olivet:

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20 WHEREAS, The ALL INside Initiative builds a partnership between the U.S.  
21 Interagency Council on Homelessness (USICH) and 19 federal member agencies to  
22 accelerate local efforts to move people off of the streets and into homes; and

23 WHEREAS, The ALL INside Initiative specifically targets five cities across the United  
24 States, Chicago, Dallas, Los Angeles, Phoenix Metro, and Seattle as well as the State of  
25 California; and



1           WHEREAS, The strategy of the ALL INside Initiative includes embedding a dedicated  
2 federal official in each participating community to offer knowledge and resources and provide  
3 “tailored support” to accelerate locally-driven strategies and enact system-level changes to  
4 reduce unsheltered homelessness; and

5           WHEREAS, The ALL INside Initiative seeks to reduce barriers to housing, health care,  
6 and other support for people experiencing unsheltered homelessness by deploying resources  
7 across federal agencies including identifying opportunities to navigate federal funding  
8 streams, leverage data-sharing, and breakdown layers of regulations; and

9           WHEREAS, The ALL INside Initiative draws on a \$486 million package of grants  
10 administered by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development which sets  
11 aside \$36 million for communities across California; and

12           WHEREAS, On May 17, 2023, San Francisco Mayor London N. Breed joined the  
13 California Big City Mayors coalition to call on State leaders to continue funding to address the  
14 statewide homelessness crisis; and

15           WHEREAS, The California Big City Mayors coalition requested \$2 billion a year in  
16 ongoing funding through the Homelessness Housing, Assistance, and Prevention (HHAP)  
17 grant program which can be used to build new housing, providing operating costs for shelter  
18 beds, supporting youth drop-in centers, delivering enhanced services at shelters, and other  
19 urgent needs; and

20           WHEREAS, The Big City Mayors coalition also advocated for an additional \$1.5 billion  
21 in funding for Project Homekey to help cities purchase more buildings to provide housing for  
22 formerly homeless individuals; and

23           WHEREAS, To date, San Francisco has acquired six properties totaling 799 units  
24 using Homekey funding; and  
25

1           WHEREAS, The San Francisco Department on Homelessness and Supportive  
2 Housing has a singular focus on preventing and ending homelessness for people in San  
3 Francisco; and

4           WHEREAS, San Francisco recently launched “Home by the Bay”, a strategic plan to  
5 cut homelessness in half over the next five years through increased investment in housing,  
6 shelter, and prevention services; and

7           WHEREAS, Homelessness in the San Francisco Bay Area does not have city or  
8 county limits; and

9           WHEREAS, San Francisco offers services and support to more individuals  
10 experiencing homelessness than its neighboring counties; and

11           WHEREAS, In order to combat the regional crisis of homelessness in the Bay Area,  
12 there should be a strategic regional response, including shared county resources, shared  
13 county data, and coordination with local health care systems, including but not limited to  
14 providing shelter and health care facilities beyond city boundaries; and

15           WHEREAS, Due to San Francisco’s high cost of living, we must continue to ensure that  
16 residents are not getting priced out of their homes and put onto the streets; and

17           WHEREAS, Increased assistance from the Biden Administration and the State of  
18 California can help the City and County of San Francisco expedite the process of getting  
19 individuals into long term housing; now, therefore, be it

20           RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the Biden  
21 Administration to specifically direct funding and resources through the ALL INside Initiative to  
22 San Francisco to develop a tailored plan to addressing unsheltered homelessness; and, be it

23           FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors reaffirms Mayor  
24 London Breed’s request for increased state funding and urges the Newsom Administration to  
25

1 allocate funding from the Homelessness Housing, Assistance and Prevention (HHAP) grant  
2 program and Project Homekey; and, be it

3 FURTHER RESOLVED, That San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the San  
4 Francisco Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing to develop a regional  
5 strategic response across the nine Bay Area Counties to share resources including access to  
6 data, services, and coordinated responses in responding to the regional homeless crisis; and,  
7 be it

8 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San  
9 Francisco directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a copy of this Resolution to President Joe  
10 Biden, Governor Gavin Newsom, the San Francisco Federal Legislative Delegation, San  
11 Francisco's State Legislative Delegation, the City and County of San Francisco State  
12 Lobbyist, the USICH Director of National Initiatives, Beverley Ebersold, and the San Francisco  
13 Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing.
