16	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
17	
18	Section 1. Environmental Findings.
19	The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this
20	ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources
21	Code Sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of
22	Supervisors in File No and is incorporated herein by reference. The Board affirms this
23	determination.
24

Section 2. Article 12 of the Park Code is hereby amended by revising Section 12.01, revising and consolidating Sections 12.02 and 12.03 as Section 12.02; deleting Sections 12.15, 12.27, 12.29, 12.30, 12.39, and 12.48; and revising Sections 12.40, 12.44, and 12.45, to read as follows:

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SEC. 12.01. CAMP MATHER <u>- OVERNIGHT GUESTS CABIN AND TENT SITE</u> <u>USAGE FEES</u>.

(a) Fees for cabins and tent sites at Camp Mather, and meal fees for overnight guests, shall be set under Section 12.44. The following use fees, which reflect a discount from the standard fee for nonresidential usage, shall be charged to San Francisco residents for use of cabin and tent sites at Camp Mather. 9	Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
10	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
11	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
12	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
13	
14	Section 4. Scope of Ordinance.
15	(a) In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors intends to amend only
16	those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers, punctuation
17	marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal Code that are
18	explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions, and
19	Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official title
20	of the ordinance.

(b) The various codified fees presented as existing Code text in Section 2 of this ordinance do not necessarily reflect the fees that are currently applicable. Pursuant to Park Code Section 12.20, the Controller adjusts those fees on an annual basis to reflect changes in the Consumer Price Index. This ordinance is not intended to invalidate any adjustments under Section 12.20 that the Controller has previously approved.

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1	(c) The current fees (including any Controller adjustments to those fees) 20 shall
2	continue to apply, until a cost recovery fee is set with approval of the Recreation and Park
3	Commission under the proposed Section 12.44. Further, the deletion of sections of the Park
4	Code referencing specific program fees in Section 2 of this ordinance does not mean that the
5	Department is prohibited from charging a fee for those programs. The intent of this ordinance
6	is to allow the Department to set fees for those programs under the proposed Section 12.44
7	instead.
8	
9	Section 5. Severability.
10	If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this ordinance, or any
11	application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a
12	decision of a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the
13	remaining portions or applications of the ordinance. The Board of Supervisors hereby
14	declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each and every section, subsection,
15	sentence, clause, phrase, and word not declared invalid or unconstitutional without regard to
16	whether any other portion of this ordinance or application thereof would be subsequently
17	declared invalid or unconstitutional.
