UP TO \$6,000,000 FROM THE STATE BOARD OF CORRECTIONS UNDER THE
JUVENILE CRIME ENFORCEMENT ACCOUNTABILITY CHALLENGE GRANT II
(JCE&ACG) PROGRAM TO IMPLEMENT A LOCAL ACTION PLAN THAT
ADDRESSES THE NEEDS OF YOUTH WHO ARE INVOLVED IN THE JUVENILE
JUSTICE SYSTEM,
WHEREAS, the 1998-99 Budget Act (Chapter 324, Statues of 1998)

AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR'S CRIMINAL JUSTICE COUNCIL TO APPLY FOR

[Juvenile Crime Enforcement and Accountability Challenge Grant II]

provides \$10 million for implementation and SB 2108 provides an additional \$50 million to the Juvenile Crime Enforcement & Accountability Challenge Grant (JCE&ACG) amending the existing JCE&CG Program currently administered by the State Board of Corrections; and,

WHEREAS, the JCE&ACG program directs the Board of Corrections to award up to \$54.5 million for county grant projects on a competitive basis that develop and implement strategies that provide an effective continuum of responses for the prevention, intervention, supervision, treatment, and incarceration of juvenile offenders that are directed to male and female offenders and requires consideration of strategies to develop and implement locally or regionally based out-of-home placement options for youths described in Section 602 of the Welfare and Institution Code; and,

WHEREAS, the City and County of San Francisco, in adherence to Board of Corrections requirements, has established the San Francisco Juvenile Justice

Supervisor, Yaki, Katz, Bierman

Coordinating Council whose members include representatives from each of the following organizations: the Adult Probation Department, the District Attorney; the Police; the Public Defender; the Sheriff; the Board of Supervisors; the Department of Human Services, the Department of Public Health (including the Mental Health Division), the San Francisco Unified School District, the Recreation and Parks Department, a parent, a youth, a community based agency and the Mayor, on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 214-96-4.1; and,

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco, in adherence to the Board of Corrections requirements, has authorized the Chief Probation Officer, Jesse E. Williams Jr., as chair of the San Francisco Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council; and,

WHEREAS, The Director of the Mayor's Criminal Justice Council is authorized to sign the City and County of San Francisco's application for State JCEACG program funding as well as related contracts, amendments, or extensions with the State of California; and,

WHEREAS, the City and County of San Francisco has previously developed and adopted a Juvenile Justice Local Action Plan for implementation which identified strategies that provide an effective continuum of responses for the prevention, intervention, supervision, treatment, and incarceration of juvenile offenders in File No. 68-97-7; and

WHEREAS, under the JCE&ACG II Program, the City and County of San Francisco is applying for up to \$6,000,000 in State Funds to implement its revised Local Action Plan to further address juvenile crime and delinquency; and now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the City and County of San Francisco hereby authorizes the Mayor's Criminal Justice Council to apply for up to \$6,000,000 in grant funds from the State Board of Corrections under the JCE&CG II Program; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City and county of San Francisco intends to enter into an agreement with the State, relative to the expenditure of funds, and program implementation and evaluation should a grant award be forthcoming by no later than July 1, 1999; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco will adhere to the requirements of the Board of Corrections and all conditions specified in the grant contract with the State of California in the expenditure of State funds received pursuant to said application; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco will participate in the collection of research data, and participate in program evaluation activities associated with the grant award; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco will invoice the Board of Corrections for all costs approved in the grant on a quarterly basis beginning July 1, 1999 and not later than October 15, 2002; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to his

Honor, the Mayor, with a request that he transmit a copy to the Board of Corrections with
an application for a demonstration project grant for the implementation of a local action
plan to provide a continuum of responses to juvenile crime and delinquency.
