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10 WHEREAS, the 1998-99 Budget Act (Chapter 324, Statutes of 1998)  
11 provides \$10 million for implementation and SB 2108 provides an additional \$50 million  
12 to the Juvenile Crime Enforcement & Accountability Challenge Grant (JCE&ACG)  
13 amending the existing JCE&CG Program currently administered by the State Board of  
14 Corrections; and,  
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16 WHEREAS, the JCE&ACG program directs the Board of Corrections to award  
17 up to \$54.5 million for county grant projects on a competitive basis that develop and  
18 implement strategies that provide an effective continuum of responses for the prevention,  
19 intervention, supervision, treatment, and incarceration of juvenile offenders that are  
20 directed to male and female offenders and requires consideration of strategies to develop  
21 and implement locally or regionally based out-of-home placement options for youths  
22 described in Section 602 of the Welfare and Institution Code; and,  
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24 WHEREAS, the City and County of San Francisco, in adherence to Board of  
25 Corrections requirements, has established the San Francisco Juvenile Justice

1 Coordinating Council whose members include representatives from each of the following  
2 organizations: the Adult Probation Department, the District Attorney; the Police; the  
3 Public Defender; the Sheriff; the Board of Supervisors; the Department of Human  
4 Services, the Department of Public Health (including the Mental Health Division), the  
5 San Francisco Unified School District, the Recreation and Parks Department, a parent, a  
6 youth, a community based agency and the Mayor, on file with the Clerk of the Board of  
7 Supervisors in File No. 214-96-4.1; and,

8 WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco, in adherence to the Board of  
9 Corrections requirements, has authorized the Chief Probation Officer, Jesse E. Williams  
10 Jr., as chair of the San Francisco Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council; and,

11 WHEREAS, The Director of the Mayor's Criminal Justice Council is authorized  
12 to sign the City and County of San Francisco's application for State JCEACG program  
13 funding as well as related contracts, amendments, or extensions with the State of  
14 California; and,

15 WHEREAS, the City and County of San Francisco has previously developed and  
16 adopted a Juvenile Justice Local Action Plan for implementation which identified  
17 strategies that provide an effective continuum of responses for the prevention,  
18 intervention, supervision, treatment, and incarceration of juvenile offenders in File No.  
19 68-97-7; and  
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21  
22 WHEREAS, under the JCE&ACG II Program, the City and County of San  
23 Francisco is applying for up to \$6,000,000 in State Funds to implement its revised Local  
24 Action Plan to further address juvenile crime and delinquency; and now, therefore, be it

1 RESOLVED, that the City and County of San Francisco hereby authorizes the  
2 Mayor's Criminal Justice Council to apply for up to \$6,000,000 in grant funds from the  
3 State Board of Corrections under the JCE&CG II Program; and, be it

4 FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City and county of San Francisco intends to  
5 enter into an agreement with the State, relative to the expenditure of funds, and program  
6 implementation and evaluation should a grant award be forthcoming by no later than July  
7 1, 1999; and, be it


8 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco will adhere  
9 to the requirements of the Board of Corrections and all conditions specified in the grant  
10 contract with the State of California in the expenditure of State funds received pursuant to  
11 said application; and, be it


12 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco will

20 an application for a demonstration project grant for the implementation of a local action


