Resolution appointing Elizabeth Aguilar-Tarchi, term ending October 1, 2003, and Duru-Earnest Chidi, Nick Roomel, Cedric Akbar, and Vanessa Padilla, terms ending October 1, 2004, to the Drug Abuse Advisory Board, residency requirement waived.

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does hereby appoint the hereinafter designated persons to serve as members of the Drug Abuse Advisory Board, pursuant to the provisions of the San Francisco Administrative Code, Section 15.9, for the term specified:

Elizabeth Aguilar-Tarchi, succeeding Vernon Grigg, seat 1, must represent law enforcement, for the unexpired portion of a three-year term ending October 1, 2003;

— Duru Earnest Chidi, succeeding Leon Winston, term expired, seat 3, must represent \*\*the public at large, for a new three year term ending October 1, 2004;

Nick Roomel, succeeding Mary Louise Adlo-Robi, term expired, seat 8, must represent the public at large, for a new three-year term ending October 1, 2004;

Cedric Akbar, succeeding himself, term expired, seat 10, must represent the public at large or a service provider, for a new three-year term ending October 1, 2004;

Vanessa Padilla (residency requirement waived), succeeding herself, term expired, seat 11, must represent the public at large, for a new three-year term ending October 1, 2004; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

1. The membership of the Drug Abuse Advisory Board has a goal to be representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.

- 2. Applicant Vanessa Padilla, a new appointee, who is not a resident of San Francisco, is a person with experience that uniquely qualifies him/her to serve on the Drug Abuse Advisory Board.
- 3. The Drug Abuse Advisory Board has attempted to fill the position, for which Vanessa Padilla was nominated, with an individual who is a City resident and who has the specific experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable to do so at this time. The Rules Committee has certified that Vanessa Padilla is qualified to serve on the Drug Abuse Advisory Board.
- 4. After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors concludes that there is no other possible representative, who is a resident of San Francisco and who has the specific experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by this applicant, and who is willing to serve on the Drug Abuse Advisory Board at this time; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the residency requirement for Vanessa Padilla, as allowed in cases where no qualified City resident, willing to serve, can be found, pursuant to Section 4.101 of the City Charter that requires person(s) appointed to boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by legislative act of the Board of Supervisors to be resident(s) of the City and County of San Francisco.
