10 WHEREAS, Among other things, House Bill 1658 establishes notice protections  
11 and compensation for property damage in seizure cases; now, therefore, be it

12 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors supports H.R. 1658; and, be it

13 FURTHER MOVED, That copies of this resolution be sent to our federal  
14 representatives.


