1 [Juvenile and Adult Local Detention Facility Construction Grant]

4 AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR'S CRIMINAL JUSTICE COUNCIL (MCJC) TO
5 APPLY FOR UP TO \$40,000,000 IN STATE (Chapter 499, Statutes of 1998) AND
6 FEDERAL (Chapter 282, Statutes of 1997) FUNDS AVAILABLE THROUGH THE
7 STATE BOARD OF CORRECTIONS UNDER THE JUVENILE AND ADULT
8 LOCAL DETENTION FACILITY CONSTRUCTION GRANT PROGRAM TO
9 CONSTRUCT A LOCAL YOUTH DETENTION FACILITY TO REPLACE THE
10 EXISTING JUVENILE HALL FACILITY,

11 WHEREAS, San Francisco's existing juvenile hall is one of the most outmoded
12 and obsolete in the state (according to a California Youth Authority-sponsored study
13 from 1989) and is in need of substantial capital upgrades and improvements totaling
14 \$22,513,300 as is described in the Juvenile Probation Department's Capital Improvement
15 Projects Budget Submittal, fiscal year 1999 - 2000; and

17 WHEREAS, the current design of the Juvenile Hall is inadequate for the type and
18 amount of service delivery to youths and their families that is required by the policies of
19 the City and County of San Francisco in its Juvenile Justice Local Action Plan; and

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21 WHEREAS; on November 12, 1998 the State Board of Corrections made
22 available on a competitive basis, \$98,500,000 in State General Funds and \$78,937,630 in
23 Federal funds for local juvenile facility construction; and

24 WHEREAS; to be eligible for Federal funds counties must increase bed space in
25 county juvenile facilities; and

WHEREAS; proposals from eligible counties are due by March 17, 1999; and

1 WHEREAS; for the purposes of this grant the County Construction Administrator
2 is Mark Primeau, Director of the Department of Public Works; and

3 WHEREAS; for the purposes of this grant the Project Financial Officer is Eugene
4 Clendinen; and

5 WHEREAS; for the purposes of this grant the Project Contact Person is Kimiko
6 Burton-Cruz; and

7 WHEREAS; for the purposes of this grant, Kimiko Burton-Cruz, Director of the
8 Mayor's Criminal Justice Council, is authorized as the appropriate County Official
9 designated to sign the assurance statement and submit the application for funding; and
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11 WHEREAS; in regard to the expenditures of all grant and match funds, it is
12 assured that the City and County of San Francisco will adhere to state and federal
13 requirements and terms of contract; and

14 WHEREAS; the grant requires the city to provide 25% match, the City & County
15 of San Francisco assures that up to \$10,000,000 in General Funds will be appropriated as
16 hard match after the grant award but before the contract is signed; and

18 WHEREAS; when such match is appropriated, the City and County assures that
19 grant and match funds do not supplant funds otherwise dedicated for construction
20 activities; and

21 WHEREAS; should there be a need for additional staff and operating costs as a
22 result of the project for which funds are being requested, the Board of Supervisors
23 certifies that they will review, approve, and commit to fully funding the operation of the
24 project; and

1 WHEREAS; within 90 days after project completion, the City and County agrees
2 to fully and safely staff and operate the facility subject to construction (consistent with
3 Title 15, California Code of Regulations); and

4 WHEREAS; the City and County of San Francisco assures that owns the site of
5 the project and that rights of access are sufficient to assure undisturbed use and
6 possession of the site, and

7 WHEREAS; the City and County of San Francisco assures it will not dispose of,
8 modify use of, or change the terms of the real property title, or other interest in the site of
9 facility subject to construction, or lease the facility for operation by other entities, without
10 permission and instructions from the state Board of Corrections or the Office of Justice
11 Programs; and, be it

12 RESOLVED, that the City and County of San Francisco hereby authorizes the
13 Mayor's Criminal Justice Council to apply for up to \$40,000,000 in grant funds from the
14 State Board of Corrections under the Juvenile and Adult Local Detention Facility
15 Construction Grant Program; and, be it

16 FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to his honor,
17 the Mayor, with a request that he transmit a copy to the Board of Corrections with an
18 application for a grant funding from the state Board of Corrections for juvenile facility
19 construction.


