AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR'S CRIMINAL JUSTICE COUNCIL (MCJC) TO APPLY FOR UP TO \$40,000,000 IN STATE (Chapter 499, Statutes of 1998) AND FEDERAL (Chapter 282, Statutes of 1997) FUNDS AVAILABLE THROUGH THE STATE BOARD OF CORRECTIONS UNDER THE JUVENILE AND ADULT LOCAL DETENTION FACILITY CONSTRUCTION GRANT PROGRAM TO CONSTRUCT A LOCAL YOUTH DETENTION FACILITY TO REPLACE THE EXISTING JUVENILE HALL FACILITY,

WHEREAS, San Francisco's existing juvenile hall is one of the most outmoded and obsolete in the state (according to a California Youth Authority-sponsored study from 1989) and is in need of substantial capital upgrades and improvements totaling \$22,513,300 as is described in the Juvenile Probation Department's Capital Improvement Projects Budget Submittal, fiscal year 1999 - 2000; and

WHEREAS, the current design of the Juvenile Hall is inadequate for the type and amount of service delivery to youths and their families that is required by the policies of the City and County of San Francisco in its Juvenile Justice Local Action Plan; and

WHEREAS; on November 12, 1998 the State Board of Corrections made available on a competitive basis, \$98,500,000 in State General Funds and \$78,937,630 in Federal funds for local juvenile facility construction; and

WHEREAS; to be eligible for Federal funds counties must increase bed space in county juvenile facilities; and

Supervisors Yaki, Becerril, Katz, Bierman

WHEREAS; proposals from eligible counties are due by March 17, 1999; and WHEREAS; for the purposes of this grant the County Construction Administrator is Mark Primeau, Director of the Department of Public Works; and

WHEREAS; for the purposes of this grant the Project Financial Officer is Eugene Clendinen; and

WHEREAS; for the purposes of this grant the Project Contact Person is Kimiko Burton-Cruz; and

WHEREAS; for the purposes of this grant, Kimiko Burton-Cruz, Director of the Mayor's Criminal Justice Council, is authorized as the appropriate County Official designated to sign the assurance statement and submit the application for funding; and

WHEREAS; in regard to the expenditures of all grant and match funds, it is assured that the City and County of San Francisco will adhere to state and federal requirements and terms of contract; and

WHEREAS; the grant requires the city to provide 25% match, the City & County of San Francisco assures that up to \$10,000,000 in General Funds will be appropriated as hard match after the grant award but before the contract is signed; and

WHEREAS; when such match is appropriated, the City and County assures that grant and match funds do not supplant funds otherwise dedicated for construction activities; and

WHEREAS; should there be a need for additional staff and operating costs as a result of the project for which funds are being requested, the Board of Supervisors certifies that they will review, approve, and commit to fully funding the operation of the project; and

WHEREAS; within 90 days after project completion, the City and County agrees to fully and safely staff and operate the facility subject to construction (consistent with Title 15, California Code of Regulations); and

WHEREAS; the City and County of San Francisco assures that owns the site of the project and that rights of access are sufficient to assure undisturbed use and possession of the site, and

WHEREAS; the City and County of San Francisco assures it will not dispose of, modify use of, or change the terms of the real property title, or other interest in the site of facility subject to construction, or lease the facility for operation by other entities, without permission and instructions from the state Board of Corrections or the Office of Justice Programs; and, be it

RESOLVED, that the City and County of San Francisco hereby authorizes the Mayor's Criminal Justice Council to apply for up to \$40,000,000 in grant funds from the State Board of Corrections under the Juvenile and Adult Local Detention Facility Construction Grant Program; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to his honor, the Mayor, with a request that he transmit a copy to the Board of Corrections with an application for a grant funding from the state Board of Corrections for juvenile facility construction.
