

**San Francisco County: Application Responses
African American Advisory Committee**

I have fought against chronic homelessness for over 2,555 nights of my life, living out of a 2001 Dodge Neon. I know too well the plights, intricacies, and just sheer abuse homeless people, especially Black homeless folk, experience every night when seeking basic decency, shelter, and support. In being raised by a single Black mother, as well as becoming the first college graduate and lawyer in my family, I am seeking to protect, restore, and empower Black folk from the compounding legacies of enslavement, poverty, marginalizing government policy, and other intergenerational forces. Furthermore, living in public housing as a child gave me a first look into the successes and failures of how our government delivers policy and human rights. From drafting criminal justice reform legislation in the U.S. Senate to researching over 4,000 lynchings to supporting the development of the country's first national lynching memorial in Montgomery, Alabama, I seek to serve on our County's African American Reparations Advisory Committee to deliver nuanced racial and economic justice through effective policymaking. Growing up on these streets to now being an attorney gives me a unique perspective at the intersections of how law and policy entrench poverty and systemic racism. It would be an honor to facilitate, organize, and deliver the justice our communities desperately need.

Business and/or professional experience:

Prior to law school, I served as United States Senator Cory Booker's criminal justice reform and national security Legislative Fellow. There, I helped draft bills and amendments on all assigned issue areas, including the very first iterations of criminal justice reform legislation introduced in the U.S. Senate (e.g. restoring food security to those formerly incarcerated; "ban the box" on employment applications (asking whether one has been convicted of a crime), etc.). Further, I personally met with numerous constituents from every background, representing their interests through debate, compromise, and suggestions on behalf of the Senator. In this role, I aimed to impact and change the laws that marginalized my family and other Black Americans till this day. The principles of my work can be found in the [First Step Act passed by Congress in 2018](#).

Subsequently, I moved to Montgomery, Alabama to work at the Equal Justice Initiative ("EJI") under Bryan Stevenson. There, I led EJI's "Community Remembrance Project," a campaign to document and memorialize the victims of lynching by collecting soil at sites of forgotten violence throughout the American South. [By gathering soil from over 4,000 sites of terror](#), I helped transcend time and bloodied terrain to bear witness to this history. Concurrently, as a paralegal, I helped win several clients' release at parole hearings and managed over five thousand calls, letters, and in-person pleas from those in need of justice, all of who reminded me how privilege, or its absence, unjustly defines our carceral state. Today, my research and the soil I

collected can be found at the country's first lynching memorial, officially known as [National Memorial for Peace and Justice](#).

Today, I am an associate at Wilson Sonsini Goodrich & Rosati, focusing on representing historically marginalized, and particularly Black founders, and connecting them to venture capital.

Civic Activities:

- In January 2021, I formed an advocacy committee in support of the nomination of the first Black woman judge to fill one of two vacancies in the United States District Court - Central District, Southern Division. In this Division, there is currently only **one** female judge and has **never had a woman of color**. I led the committee to collect signatures from lawyers, judges, and other legal leaders across California and specifically, the Bay Area.
- I currently serve on the Human Rights Watch, Los Angeles Committee and joining the San Francisco committee later this year. As part of the L.A. team, I served on the fundraising committee that raised over 21 million dollars at our 2019 gala.
- I founded the UCLA Black Law Alumni Board and currently serve as its Inaugural Chair.
- I currently serve as a [Humanity in Action](#) Senior Fellow, promoting research, advocacy, and understanding of human rights.
- In 2019, as President of the UCLA's Black Law Students Association ("BLSA"), I raised over \$180,000 to create the first endowed scholarship to support Black law students at the law school.
- Currently, I am ChangeLawyer Scholar (State Bar of California Foundation selects rising lawyers committed to racial and social justice).

Raised in Bayview Hunters Point where "It Takes a Village" was more than a slogan- but a way of live. I partied on 3rd Street in least 10 different night clubs growing up and frequented the Ice Cream Parlor and Variety Store on the corner of Third St. and Palou, my family also owned a very lucrative business in the Fillmore "Johnson and Johnson Locksmith" and the Bus Stop Soup Shop on the corner of Divisadero and McAllister. I witnessed the Dot.com boom and the Dot.com bust and the subsequent manifestation of being the Hub of Technology. But worse than all I witnessed first hand - the term called "Homelessness".
My experiences working with many agencies in San Francisco gained me firsthand knowledge of "cause and affect". As the start of my experiences working in the Non profit sector found me the arduous task of leasing up the replacement housing for the former Geneva Towers residents and also building community in a neighborhood desperate for revitalization (no services, no grocery stores, few restaurants, and community violence, etc.). As a sixth-generation Black San Franciscan born and raised in Bayview-Hunters Point, and a proud Immaculate Conception Academy alum with deep ties to my community through my work and life experience, I am uniquely qualified for the Seat 2 position. My community is San Francisco's Black community; my life and my career have focused on uplifting myself, my family, and my community. By serving on this commission, I will be able to bring my experience as a passionate Black community advocate who has been pushed out of San Francisco due to gentrification and safety concerns for my loved ones.

As a San Francisco native and mother of four Black men, I have seen the beauty of the Black community in San Francisco - and, just as surely, the barriers the community faces. Relocating my family's home base to the suburbs was an extremely difficult yet necessary choice. Even with an advanced college degree and a career in the nonprofit field, gentrification made it impossible for me and my family to thrive in the community I love. More importantly, I was perpetually concerned for the safety of my sons, as we witnessed firsthand the growing violence in our Bayview - exemplified by such tragedies as the murder of my son's best friend in front of Thurgood Marshall High School (which they attended). I had no choice but to raise my sons in a safer environment, even though it meant the heartbreaking decision to end to a six-generation family legacy of SF (San Francisco) residence.

The reality is that many Black San Franciscans are forced to decide between living in dangerous neighborhoods, where city services do not meet citizens' needs, or leaving our beloved home communities for a safer environment. I represent a growing population of Black San Franciscans who have been pushed out of our community despite our hearts still residing in the Bayview. All Black San Franciscans, including those of us who have been pushed out, deserve a seat at the table to ensure that our city's Black population remains vibrant and viable. I often think about moving back to SF, but the costs of homes are too prohibitive at the present time.

Business and/or professional experience:

My career experience has revolved around improving the quality of life the Bayview community. I started my work in the Young Community Developers (YCD) summer programs from ages 14-21, gaining experience that would soon guide me into the world of non-profit administration. My career began at Head Start, after which I rose through the ranks of the San Francisco YMCA to become District Vice President, overseeing three branches serving 15,000 families. I raised over \$8.5 million for the Bayview YMCA Capital Campaign to complete the building of the Bayview Hunters Point YMCA. More recently, I was CEO (Chief Executive Officer) of the San Francisco Education Fund, where I directed community volunteer programs, educator grants, and student scholarships designed to help public school students succeed. Prior to that, I served as the California State Director at The Trust for Public Land, where I oversaw the creation of new parks in park-poor neighborhoods in Los Angeles and San Francisco, while protecting landscapes across the state.

I currently serve as Chief Executive Officer of Children's Council of San Francisco, where I manage a staff of 120. I spearhead the organization's partnership with the San Francisco Office of Early Care and Education and work in collaboration with a host of other city and state agencies and community-based organizations. Quality early education is a basic human right. At Children's Council, our innovative Child Care Business Incubator program recruits and trains community members to start their own home-based childcare businesses, fulfilling a critical need for families in their neighborhoods.

In addition to my professional experience, I earned a B.S. in Psychology Organizational Leadership from Dominican University of California and an M.S. in Psychology/Organizational Leadership from the University of Phoenix. I am currently pursuing my PhD from University of Arizona Global Campus in Organizational Development and Leadership. I graduate in January 2022.

Even following my residential transition, I have remained an extremely active San Francisco community member. I grew up attending Our Lady of Lourdes Parish in the Bayview and I continue to give back to my community through the church. I founded and have overseen the Parish's food pantry program for more than sixteen years. In addition to my service work through the church, I am involved in numerous community advocacy groups.

I currently sit on the Southeast Community Commission, where I work on improving socioeconomic outcomes for the citizens of our community. I am also an active member of MegaBlack SF and sit on the organization's SF Education subcommittee. I work closely with MegaBlack SF leadership and the Human Rights Commission, recently having secured a half-million dollars to improve the learning outcomes of San Francisco Black children ages 0-5.

I have taken my voice to the state level to share my passion for my community with California leaders. I am the chair of the California Alternative Payment Program Association (CAPPA) Public Policy committee. CAPPA is a statewide advocacy organization that shapes early care and education policy to expand access and improve the quality of childcare for California families. I have worked and participated in the life of the City for two decades. I have participated in numerous community-based activities, from volunteering to moderate events for the Human Rights Commission; including townhalls on youth in the city, and at three public forums concerning SFPD use of Tasers to solo-authoring the report "Violence in Our City" for the Human Rights Commission. Under Mayor Newsom, I helped author the City's existing reparations ordinance, on the books and directed by the City Attorney, known as "The Slavery Disclosure Ordinance". With Mr. Al Williams and others from the African American Historical Society at the African American Art and Culture Complex, I authored the SDO for the Mayor's Office. The SDO established a voluntary fund, should any entities or corporations disclose ties to historical slavery.

I served as a member of the Board of Directors of the San Francisco based, San Francisco Acheivers College Bound Scholarship for eight years. SF Acheivers provides scholarships, mentoring and networking for college bound African American males from SFUSD.

I have volunteered and partnered with the Fillmore/Western Addition based organization, New Community Leadership Foundation (NCLF), which is committed to community preservation, development,

At the University of San Francisco I have encouraged, mentored, and directed a vast diversity of students to participate in community engagement in city offices and agencies through internships, and in community based service and engagement.

Many former students currently work in city agencies and offices, and on the front lines of community based activism and engagement with the city and people of San Francisco.

I wrote, "Black Americans in San Francisco: A Paradigm for Civil Rights in California" in The Argonaut: Journals of the San Francisco Historical Society, Vol. 31 No. 2 Winter 2021.

I have provided social science and political science knowledge to San Franciscans, Bay Area residents, Californians, and many Americans concerning political and social developments through participation in local media like KPOO, KTVU, KRON 4, CBS 5, KNBC LA, NBC Bay Area, the SF Chronicle, among many others for more than a decade.

In part, as an extension of my current research, I have partnered with the Fillmore-based NCLF, and have been a key figure in the Fillmore District's attempts to resuscitate the community business, economic, social and cultural life of the black community, across the City. The Fillmore Heritage Center and the attempts to make reconciliation with the 1978 tragedy that devastated the City and world, in Jonestown, Guyana. I have played the key role, through media, for instance in an important article written by Chronicle Staff writer Kai Milner, concerning unresolved histories and sites in the City, in the aftermath of the removal of the monument "First Days". The report discussed the Jonestown tragedy. My current research is on this topic, given my place in the city as a university scholar in the City and community, most impacted.

Like reparations, Jonestown and Peoples Temple, even today, are unwelcome discussions in circles. Yet despite their vast disconnections as phenomenon, Black San Francisco continues to seek resolution, recovery, healing, from extant realities, the facilitated the social justice claims of the movement, before its horrific ending. I have played a vital role, in helping heal many in the Black community of San Francisco and Los Angeles, who were most affected and misunderstood. I have helped NCLF in its efforts to bring reconciliation in the community's a launching point for future community development programs and efforts at sustaining the remnant Fillmore/Western Addition.

I have moderated numerous high profile political debates in the City, most recently District 5 Board of Supervisors, and California State Senate District 11.

Under Dep. Chief David Lazar and invited by SFPD Chief Bill Scott, I have recently served as a community member representative of two SFPD task forces; SFPD Staffing Task Force, and SFPD Task force for Community Engagement. These task forces were aimed at addressing the 282 items which the Obama Department of Justice identified with SFPD.

I have moderated a townhall meeting with the immediate past OPD Chief and Oakland Mayor Libby Schaff on the occasion of a townhall between OPD and Oakland residents.



I'm a 30-year-old Black woman who moved to the city in the summer of 2015. Sports has always been my passion and I've been fortunate to work in the industry, which led me to SF. Despite having an undergraduate and graduate degree in my field, I spent four and a half years freelancing in the industry here, where about 40-45k was a great year for me. I have lived in four different apartments in San Francisco, where I slept in living rooms, fought landlords who were trying to skirt basic maintenance repairs, and even getting my lease "dissolved" by a failed housing startup (look up HomeShare) and struggled to find immediate housing.

When the pandemic hit, 20 days after the shelter-in-place order went into effect, my employer laid me off. Even when my department head told me the day before that my job was safe and I didn't need to worry. Not having stability shook me to my core. The biggest reason I've remained in San Francisco is the community. There's not many other places where natives support transplants. The City is truly a special place. And in my five years here the gentrification is appalling. Every day I wake up grateful to have landed a position that provides me stability. And I wouldn't have gotten here if it weren't for the support of my neighborhood. We deserve atonement. We deserve justice. And I want to help fight for it.

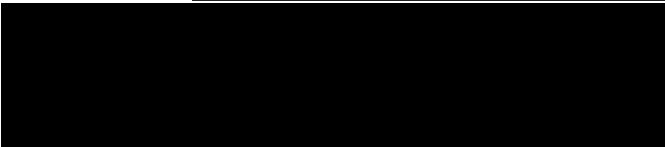

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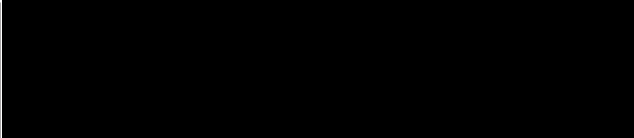

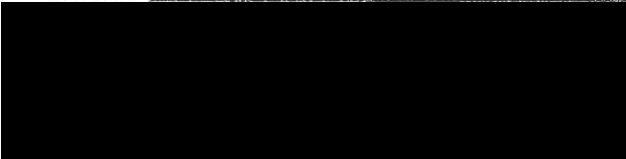

Over the past 5 years, I've led the transition at Urban Ed Academy from Saturday school program for Black and Brown boys in San Francisco to a racial equity-based nonprofit serving the same boys and their neighborhood. We've scaled the annual budget from \$250,000 to \$3.1M in those 5 years by being bold in our approach: stabilizing San Franciscan Black homeowners as a means of stabilizing new Black male teachers to live in the neighborhood in which they serve. Our team, board, and volunteers are almost exclusively BIPOC—this is a "for us, by us" operation. We are unabashedly focused on accelerating outcomes for the Black community, period.

Prop 47 expunges), and served as a law clerk in DC Superior Court.

The African American Reparations Advisory Committee (the "Committee") was established to advise the Board of Supervisors, Mayor, Human Rights Commission, and the public on the development of a San Francisco Reparations Plan.

The Committee shall consist of 15 voting members, appointed by the Board of Supervisors, as follows:

- > Seat 1: Shall be a person who works for a media outlet that principally serves the African American community, is a storyteller of African American stories, or is a historian with expertise in African American history.
 - > Seat 2: Shall be a person who has been displaced from San Francisco due to gentrification and shall not be required to reside in the City and County of San Francisco during their participation on the Committee.
 - > Seat 3: Shall be an individual with expertise in private equity, venture capital, or fundraising in the financial industry.
 - > Seat 4: Shall be an individual who is 65 years of age or older and who has lived in a predominantly African American community.
 - > Seat 5: Shall be an individual who has been incarcerated.
 - > Seat 6: Shall be an individual who has experienced discrimination in the workplace.
 - > Seat 7: Shall be an individual who has experienced or is experiencing homelessness.
 - > Seat 8: Shall be an individual with expertise in the impact of redevelopment activities in the Fillmore District and the Wester Addition on Black communities.
 - > Seat 9: Shall be an individual with experience as a small business owner principally serving

- > Seat 10: Shall be a person who is employed by or in a leadership position in a charitable, social service, or religious organization principally serving the African-American community.
- > Seat 11: Shall be a person who works in the technology industry with experience in the field of technological equity.
- > Seat 12: Shall be a person who is between the ages of 14 and 24, inclusive, with experience working with community groups serving the African American community.
- > Seat 13: Shall be a person representing the sectors served by the Office of Economic and Workforce Development (construction, building and trades, hospitality, and medical sectors) with experience working in predominantly African American communities.
- > Seat 14: Shall be an individual with experience as a parent or caregiver of a child or children experiencing barriers to or disparate treatment in education.
- > Seat 15: Shall be an individual who has lived or is currently living in public housing.

The Board of Supervisors shall also consider - in addition to the required qualifications for each seat - appointing members who 1) are willing to perform work in service of the Committee outside of Committee meetings; 2) bring diverse skills and experience to the Committee; 3) have experience living or working in predominantly African American neighborhoods or communities in San Francisco; 4) appreciate the diversity of viewpoints and experiences that exists within San Francisco's black communities; and 5) have personally experienced discrimination in employment, access to healthcare, or access to social services.

Members shall serve indefinite terms until the termination of the Committee, unless removed by the Board.

The Human Rights Commission shall provide administrative support for the Committee.

Reports: No later than six months after its inaugural meeting, the Committee shall submit to the Board of Supervisors, Mayor, and Human Rights Commission a report summarizing the research, outreach, and other efforts it intends to undertake in support of its preparation of a San Francisco Reparations Plan (the "Plan"). No later than 18 months after its inaugural meeting, the Committee shall submit to the Board of Supervisors a draft Plan. No later than 24 months after its inaugural meeting, the Committee shall submit to the Board of Supervisors a final Plan.

Sunset: The Committee shall sunset on January 18, 2024.
