

The mission of the SF-Marin Food Bank is to end hunger in San Francisco and Marin. Last year we distributed 48 million pounds of food to those in need through our extensive food pantry network (over 200 farmers' market-style pantries each week in San Francisco) and through partnerships with over 400 community organizations that utilize food in their programs for low-income San Franciscans. The SF-Marin Food Bank touches the lives of over 25,000 households each week through food. Our programs span every neighborhood and Supervisorial District in San Francisco, and we are committed to meeting people where they are: in their communities, close to home. We have programs that meet the specific needs of households across the age spectrum, from Healthy Children's Pantries for families with children, to Brown Bag Pantries that are designed for low-income older adults. We continue to expand our Home-Delivered Groceries program citywide to support better health, reduce isolation, and increase self-sufficiency for seniors and adults with disabilities who are unable to visit a pantry. We provide staff support in many languages (Spanish, Cantonese, Mandarin, Russian, Portuguese) so that we can provide inclusive and approachable programs for our diverse communities. Training and outreach materials are all translated into at least three languages, and our Food Locator food access tool can be accessed in six different languages. We strive to make our programming as inclusive and accessible as possible to support the food needs of the communities we serve. My role is focused on strengthening the safety net programs that are the collective responsibility of a compassionate society, namely effective, efficient, and well-funded public assistance programs. With a background in city planning and food systems, I work with partners across the food system to advocate for policies and budgets that reflect our collective goal of ending hunger.

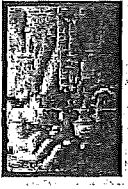

The mission of the San Francisco-Marin Food Bank is to end hunger in San Francisco and Marin counties. We believe that the path to ending hunger requires that the non-profit sector find innovative ways to seek out and serve clients, and that existing government programs fulfill their mission to provide a baseline of security for everyone in need. We share with the City and County of San Francisco a common goal of eradicating hunger and food insecurity in our neighborhoods and we believe in promoting the availability of wholesome, nutritious food for individuals and families in need. Last year we distributed over 48 million pounds of food to those in need through our extensive food pantry network (over 200 farmers' market-style pantries each week in San Francisco) and through partnerships with over 400 community organizations that utilize food in their programs for low-income San Franciscans.

Seat 9, Karen Gruneisen, must be a representative of community-based organizations that provide nutritional support and increase the food security of San Francisco residents, including but not limited to a representative from an organization serving food in the following program types: home-delivered meals, congregate meals for seniors, food bank, free dining room, multi-service agency serving families and youth, shelter meals, faith-based organizations, food retail (farmers markets, grocery stores), and hospital and health clinics - no organization shall have more than one representative; nominated by the Food Security Task Force and appointed by the Board of Supervisors, for an indefinite term.

Seat 10, Anne Quaintance, must be a representative of community-based organizations that provide nutritional support and increase the food security of San Francisco residents, including but not limited to a representative from an organization serving food in the following program types: home-delivered meals, congregate meals for seniors, food bank, free dining room, multi-service agency serving families and youth, shelter meals, faith-based organizations, food retail (farmers markets, grocery stores), and hospital and health clinics - no organization shall have more than one representative; nominated by the Food Security Task Force and appointed by the Board of Supervisors, for an indefinite term.

Seat 11, Chester Williams, must be a representative of community-based organizations that provide nutritional support and increase the food security of San Francisco residents, including but not limited to a representative from an organization serving food in the following program types: home-delivered meals, congregate meals for seniors, food bank, free dining room, multi-service agency serving families and youth, shelter meals, faith-based organizations, food retail (farmers markets, grocery stores), and hospital and health clinics - no organization shall have more than one representative; nominated by the Food Security Task Force and appointed by the Board of Supervisors, for an indefinite term.

Seat 12, Hilary Seligman, must be a representative of community-based organizations that provide nutritional support and increase the food security of San Francisco

residents, including but not limited to a representative from an organization serving food in the following program types: home-delivered meals, congregate meals for seniors, food bank, free dining room, multi-service agency serving families and youth, shelter meals, faith-based organizations, food retail (farmers markets, grocery stores), and hospital and health clinics - no organization shall have more than one representative; nominated by the Food Security Task Force and appointed by the Board of Supervisors, for an indefinite term.

Vacant Seat 13, new appointment, must be a representative of community-based organizations that provide nutritional support and increase the food security of San Francisco residents, including but not limited to a representative from an organization serving food in the following program types: home-delivered meals, congregate meals for seniors, food bank, free dining room, multi-service agency serving families and youth, shelter meals, faith-based organizations, food retail (farmers markets, grocery stores), and hospital and health clinics - no organization shall have more than one representative; nominated by the Food Security Task Force and appointed by the Board of Supervisors, for an indefinite term.

Vacant Seat 14, new appointment, must be a representative of community-based organizations that provide nutritional support and increase the food security of San Francisco residents, including but not limited to a representative from an organization serving food in the following program types: home-delivered meals, congregate meals for seniors, food bank, free dining room, multi-service agency serving families and youth, shelter meals, faith-based organizations, food retail (farmers markets, grocery stores), and hospital and health clinics - no organization shall have more than one representative; nominated by the Food Security Task Force and appointed by the Board of Supervisors, for an indefinite term.

Vacant Seat 15, new appointment, must be a representative of community-based organizations that provide nutritional support and increase the food security of San Francisco residents, including but not limited to a representative from an organization serving food in the following program types: home-delivered meals, congregate meals for seniors, food bank, free dining room, multi-service agency serving families and youth, shelter meals, faith-based organizations, food retail (farmers markets, grocery stores), and hospital and health clinics - no organization shall have more than one representative; nominated by the Food Security Task Force and appointed by the Board of Supervisors, for an indefinite term.

Vacant Seat 16, new appointment, must be a representative of community-based organizations that provide nutritional support and increase the food security of San Francisco residents, including but not limited to a representative from an organization serving food in the following program types: home-delivered meals, congregate meals for seniors, food bank, free dining room, multi-service agency serving families and youth, shelter meals, faith-based organizations, food retail (farmers markets, grocery stores), and hospital and health clinics - no organization shall have more than one representative; nominated by the Food Security Task Force and appointed by the Board of Supervisors, for an indefinite term.

Vacant Seat 17, new appointment, must be a representative of community-based organizations that provide nutritional support and increase the food security of San Francisco residents, including but not limited to a representative from an organization serving food in the following program types: home-delivered meals, congregate meals for seniors, food bank, free dining room, multi-service agency serving families and youth, shelter meals, faith-based organizations, food retail (farmers markets, grocery stores), and hospital and health clinics - no organization shall have more than one representative; nominated by the Food Security Task Force and appointed by the Board of Supervisors, for an indefinite term.

Vacant Seat 18, new appointment, must be a representative of community-based organizations that provide nutritional support and increase the food security of San Francisco residents, including but not limited to a representative from an organization serving food in the following program types: home-delivered meals, congregate meals for seniors, food bank, free dining room, multi-service agency serving families and youth, shelter meals, faith-based organizations, food retail (farmers markets, grocery stores), and hospital and health clinics - no organization shall have more than one representative; nominated by the Food Security Task Force and appointed by the Board of Supervisors, for an indefinite term.

Vacant Seat 19, new appointment, must be a representative of community-based organizations that provide nutritional support and increase the food security of San Francisco residents, including but not limited to a representative from an organization serving food in the following program types: home-delivered meals, congregate meals for seniors, food bank, free dining room, multi-service agency serving families and youth, shelter meals, faith-based organizations, food retail (farmers markets, grocery stores), and hospital and health clinics - no organization shall have more than one representative; nominated by the Food Security Task Force and appointed by the Board of Supervisors, for an indefinite term.

Seat 20, Geoffrey Grier, must be a member of the public, nominated by the Food Security Task Force and appointed by the Board of Supervisors, for an indefinite term.

Reports: The Food Security Task Force shall prepare an annual assessment to the Board of Supervisors of the state of hunger and food insecurity in San Francisco. The report may include recommendations for funding, programs, and policy.


Sunset Date: The Task Force shall expire by operation of law on July 1, 2021, unless extended by the Board of Supervisors.

Board Qualifications:

The Food Security Task Force was established to recommend legislative action and city-wide strategies to the Board of Supervisors that would increase participation in federally funded programs such as CalFresh (known nationally as SNAP and formally as food stamps), Summer Food Service, the Child and Adult Care Food Program, the Homeless Children Nutrition Program, the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC), the School Lunch Program, and the National School Breakfast Program. The Task Force shall also provide general advice and assistance to the Board of Supervisors with regard to funding priorities, legislative action, and city policies on addressing hunger and enhancing the food security of San Francisco residents, in addition to any other issues within the Task Force's expertise.

The Food Security Task Force shall consist 20 members appointed by the Board of Supervisors, City department heads, or the San Francisco Unified School District. Members shall serve at the pleasure of their respective appointing authorities.

Seat 1: Shall be an employee of the Department of Human Services, appointed by the Executive Director of the Human Services Agency.

Seat 2: Shall be an employee of the Department of Public Health-Nutrition Services, appointed by the Director of Health.

Seat 3: Shall be an employee of the Department of Aging and Adult Services, appointed by the

Executive Director of the Human Services Agency.

Seat 4: Shall be an employee of the Department of Public Health-Food Security, appointed by the Director of Health.

Seat 5: Shall be an employee of the Department of Children, Youth and Their Families, appointed by the Director of the Department of Children, Youth and Their Families.

Seat 6: Shall be an employee of the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing, appointed by the Director of the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing.

Seat 7: Shall be an employee of the Recreation and Park Department's Urban Agriculture Program, appointed by the General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department.

Seat 8: Shall be an appointee of the San Francisco Unified School District, if the District chooses to appoint a member.

The Board of Supervisors shall appoint:

Seats 9 through 19: Shall be representatives of community-based organizations that provide nutritional support and increase the food security of San Francisco residents, including but not limited to representatives from organizations serving food in the following program types: home-delivered meals, congregate meals for seniors, food bank, free dining room, multi-service agency serving families and youth, shelter meals, faith-based organizations, food retail (farmers markets, grocery stores), and hospital and health clinics - no organization shall have more than one representative; nominated by the Food Security Task Force and appointed by the Board of Supervisors.

Seat 20: Shall be a member of the public, nominated by the Food Security Task Force and appointed by the Board of Supervisors.

The Department of Public Health shall provide clerical assistance and logistical support to the Task Force and its committees.

Reports: The Food Security Task Force shall prepare an annual assessment to the Board of Supervisors of the state of hunger and food insecurity in San Francisco. The report may include recommendations for funding, programs, and policy.

Sunset Date: The Task Force shall terminate on July 1, 2021.

(Ordinance No. 173-18 reauthorized and redesignated the Food Security Task Force, and modified the membership of the Task Force.)

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
