Resolution declaring October 13, 2011, as Mission Hiring Hall Day in the City and County of San Francisco to commemorate the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary and to acknowledge its contributions to community based employment services and honoring Mission Hiring Halls commitment to the creation, preservation, and advocacy of economic justice for our San Francisco workers and communities.

WHEREAS, The relationship between the City of San Francisco and its residents is a vital and interdependent one, deriving its strength from the quantity and quality of civic involvement and public spirit generated by such organizations as Mission Hiring Hall; and

WHEREAS, Mission Hiring Hall is celebrating its fortieth anniversary of service to San Francisco, and it is appropriate at this time to highlight its many achievements and to underscore the positive impact it has made in the local community; and

WHEREAS, Mission Hiring Hall is a nonprofit community-based organization that was created in 1971 to expand general and construction employment opportunities in San Francisco's Mission District, and since its creation Mission Hiring Hall has stood firm to its mission, and in 1990 Mission Hiring Hall established the South of Market Employment Center to address the immediate and long term employment needs in the South of Market; and

WHEREAS, With a dedicated staff that reflects the diversity of the population it serves, the organization has been successful in recruiting, screening, orienting, counseling, referring, and placing thousands of San Franciscans in its history; and

WHEREAS, Mission Hiring Hall continues to operate under the fundamental principles that any person willing and able to work is entitled to a job at a livable wage and that local
