3 Describing and setting forth a proposal to the voters at an election to be held on November

4 5, 2019, to amend the Charter of the City and County of San Francisco to create the

5 Homelessness Oversight Commission to oversee the Department of Homelessness and

6 Supportive Housing; to require the Commission to review and approve, disapprove, or

7 modify: criteria to be used to ascertain eligibility or priority for programs and/or services

8 operated or provided by the Department; the opening or closing of homeless shelters,

9 navigation centers, or other facilities that provide shelter to unsheltered persons; and

10 contracts and grant agreements with an annual value exceeding \$200,000; and to authorize

11 the Commission to conduct public education and outreach concerning programs and

12 services for homeless persons in San Francisco, and issues concerning homelessness.

18 Section 1. The Board of Supervisors hereby submits to the qualified voters of the City

19 and County, at an election to be held on November 5, 2019, a proposal to amend the Charter of

20 the City and County by adding Section 4.133, to read as follows:

21

22 **SEC. 4.133. HOMELESSNESS OVERSIGHT COMMISSION.**

23 (a) There shall be a Homelessness Oversight Commission ("Commission") to

24 oversee the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing ("Department"). The

25 Department shall, to the extent prescribed by ordinance, manage and direct housing programs,

1 and services for persons experiencing homelessness in the City, including, but not limited to,
2 street outreach, homeless shelters, transitional housing, and permanent supportive housing.

3 (b) The Commission shall consist of seven members, appointed as follows:

4 (1) Seats 1, 2, and 3, shall be appointed by the Mayor subject to confirmation
5 by the Board of Supervisors. Each nomination shall be the subject of a public hearing and vote
6 within 60 days. If the Board of Supervisors fails to act on a nomination within 60 days of the
7 date the nomination is transmitted to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, the nominee shall be
8 deemed confirmed. Seat 1 shall be held by a person who has personally experienced
9 homelessness. Seat 2 shall be held by a person with significant experience providing services to
10 or engaging in advocacy on behalf of persons experiencing homelessness. Seat 3 shall be held
11 by a person with expertise in mental health service delivery or substance abuse treatment.

12 (2) Seats 4, 5, and 6 shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Seat 4
13 shall be held by a person who has personally experienced homelessness. Seat 5 shall be held by
14 a person with significant experience providing services to or engaging in advocacy on behalf of
15 persons experiencing homelessness. Seat 6 shall be held by a person with significant experience
16 in financial management and oversight, accounting, or auditing.

17 (3) Seat 7 may be appointed by the San Francisco Unified School District's
18 Board of Education, subject to confirmation by the Board of Supervisors, and held by a person
19 with significant experience working with homeless families with children and/or homeless youth.
20 Each nomination shall be the subject of a public hearing and vote within 60 days. If the Board
21 of Supervisors fails to act on a nomination within 60 days of the date the nomination is
22 transmitted to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, the nominee shall be deemed confirmed. If
23 the Board of Education fails to make an initial appointment by March 1, 2020, or to fill a
24 vacancy within 60 days, the Board of Supervisors shall fill the seat by appointing a person
25 meeting the qualifications for Seat 7.

1 (4) Section 4.101 shall apply to these appointments, with a particular
2 emphasis on diversity in ethnicity, race, age, sexual orientation, and types of disabilities.

3 (c) Commission members shall serve at the pleasure of their respective appointing
4 authorities. Vacancies shall be filled by the respective appointing authorities as prescribed in
5 subsections (b)(1), (2), and (3).

6 (d) Commissioners shall serve four-year terms, beginning at noon on March 1, 2020;
7 provided, however, the term of the initial appointees in Seats 1, 4, and 6 shall be a two-year
8 term, expiring at noon on March 1, 2022.

9 (e) The Commission shall have the following powers and duties.

10 (1) With respect to the Department, the Commission shall exercise all of the
11 powers and duties of boards and commissions as set forth in Sections 4.102, 4.103, and 4.104,
12 including but not limited to, approving applicable departmental budgets and formulating goals
13 consistent with the overall objectives of the City and County.

14 (2) The Commission shall review and approve, disapprove, or modify:

15 (A) All criteria determined by the Director of the Department
16 ("Director") to be used to ascertain eligibility or priority for programs and/or services operated
17 or provided by the Department, except criteria that are established by federal, state, or City law
18 or as a condition of the receipt of funding;

19 (B) All determinations by the Director to open or close homeless
20 shelters, navigation centers, or other facilities that provide shelter to unsheltered persons, except
21 shelters provided in response to a public emergency;

22 (C) All contracts and grant agreements entered into by the Department
23 with an annual value exceeding \$200,000.

1 The Commission's powers and duties prescribed in this subsection (e)(2) shall not
2 override or be in derogation of the powers of the Board of Supervisors and Mayor as set forth in
3 other provisions of this Charter.

4 (3) The Commission may conduct public education and outreach concerning
5 programs and services for homeless persons in San Francisco, and issues concerning
6 homelessness.

7 (f) The Mayor and the Board of Supervisors shall make their initial appointments to
8 Seats 1-6, respectively, on the Commission by no later than noon, March 1, 2020, and the
9 Commission shall come into existence upon the appointment and confirmation, where required,
10 of four members. The Commission shall have its inaugural meeting within 30 days of its
11 establishment. The inaugural meeting shall be announced on the Department's website at least
12 ten days in advance of the inaugural meeting.

LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Charter Amendment - Homelessness Oversight Commission]

Describing and setting forth a proposal to the voters at an election to be held on November 5, 2019, to amend the Charter of the City and County of San Francisco to create the Homelessness Oversight Commission to oversee the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing; to require the Commission to review and approve, disapprove, or modify: criteria to be used to ascertain eligibility or priority for programs and/or services operated or provided by the Department; the opening or closing of homeless shelters, navigation centers, or other facilities that provide shelter to unsheltered persons; and contracts and grant agreements with an annual value exceeding \$200,000; and to authorize the Commission to conduct public education and outreach concerning programs and services for homeless persons in San Francisco, and issues concerning homelessness.

Existing Law

The Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing (“HSH”) was established in 2016. Under the supervision and direction of the department’s Director, HSH is charged with managing and directing all housing, programs, and services for homeless persons in the City including, but not limited to, street outreach, homeless shelters, transitional housing, and permanent supportive housing, as well as certain designated functions set forth in Chapter 20 of the municipal code. The Mayor appoints and may remove the head of HSH. HSH is not subject to direct oversight by a City Commission.

Chapter XXXI of the Administrative Code establishes the Local Homeless Coordinating Board (“LHCB”), which serves as the governing body of the Continuum of Care and advises HSH on homeless policy and budget allocations. With respect to HSH, the LHCB is a purely advisory body, and its advice is not binding on the department.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposed Charter amendment would create the Homeless Oversight Commission. The Commission would have seven members, three appointed by the Mayor, three appointed by the Board of Supervisors, and one appointed by the San Francisco Unified School District’s Board of Education. The Mayor’s nominees and the Board of Education’s nominee would be subject to approval by the Board of Supervisors within 60 days of appointment. If the Board of Education fails to make an appointment, the seventh seat would be appointed by the Board of Supervisors.

One of the Mayor’s appointees and one of the Board of Supervisors’ appointees would be required to be a person who has personally experienced homelessness. One of the Mayor’s

appointees and one of the Board of Supervisors' appointees would be required to be a person with significant experience providing services to or engaging in advocacy on behalf of persons experiencing homelessness. One of the Mayor's appointees would be required to be a person with expertise in mental health service delivery or substance abuse treatment. One of the Board of Supervisors' appointees would be required to be a person with significant experience in financial management and oversight, accounting, or auditing. And the Board of Education's appointee would be required to be a person with significant experience working with homeless families with children and/or homeless youth.

The appointing authorities would be required to make their initial appointments by March 1, 2020 and the Commission would come into effect once four members are appointed. Commissioners would serve four-year terms (except for three commissioners serving initial two-year terms).

The Commission would oversee HSH, and would have all of the powers and duties of commissions set forth in the Charter, including but not limited to formulating, evaluating, and approving goals, objectives, plans and programs, and setting policies consistent with the overall objectives of the City, approving applicable departmental budgets, nominating to the Mayor candidates for department head, removing a department head, and conducting investigations into any aspect of governmental operations within its jurisdiction.

In addition, the Commission would be required to review, and approve, disapprove, or modify:

- 1) criteria to be used to ascertain eligibility or priority for programs and or services operated or provided by HSH, except criteria established by law or imposed as a condition of funding;
- 2) determinations by the Director to open or close homeless shelters, navigation centers, or other facilities that provide shelter to unsheltered persons; and
- 3) contracts and grant agreements entered into by the Department with an annual value exceeding \$200,000.

The Commission also would be authorized to conduct public education and outreach concerning programs and services for homeless persons in San Francisco, and issues concerning homelessness.

Dear Ms. Calvillo,

Should the proposed Charter amendment be approved by the voters, in my opinion, it would have a minimal impact on the cost of government.

The proposed Charter amendment would create the Homelessness Oversight Commission to oversee the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing (HSH). The Commission would consist of seven appointed members, three appointed by the Mayor, three appointed by the Board of Supervisors, and one appointed by the San Francisco Unified School District's Board of Education.

The Commission's duties would include reviewing and approving HSH's budget, program eligibility criteria, shelter openings and closings, and contracts and grants exceeding \$200,000 annually. The Commission may conduct public education and outreach of homelessness programs and issues. Annual salary and operating costs for the Commission would be approximately \$250,000.


