AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH, POPULATION HEALTH AND PREVENTION DIVISION, TO ACCEPT RETROACTIVELY AND EXPEND GRANT FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$46,816 FROM THE OFFICE OF EMERGENCY SERVICES FOR THE Y2K HAZARDOUS MATERIALS PROJECT AND TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WHICH DOES NOT INCLUDE PATENT INFRINGEMENT INDEMNIFICATION AND FALSE CLAIMS CLAUSES; WAIVING INDIRECT COSTS AND PROVIDING FOR RATIFICATION OF ACTION PREVIOUSLY TAKEN.

WHEREAS, The Department of Public Health has applied for and been awarded a grant from the Office of Emergency Services in the amount of \$46,816 to fund the participation of San Francisco in the Y2K Hazardous Materials Project; and,

WHEREAS. As a condition of receiving the grant funds, the Office of Emergency Services requires the City to enter into an agreement (the "Agreement"); a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 991765; and,

WHEREAS. The Office of Emergency Services has indicated that it will not agree to any modification to the form of the Agreement; and,

WHEREAS. The Agreement does not contain certain provisions described below, which are required under the Administrative Code unless waived by the Board of Supervisors; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Health is hereby authorized to accept retroactively retroactively and expend/the grant funds pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code Section 10.170-1; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the Agreement in behalf of the City; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives the requirement contained in Sections 6.21 and 21.19 of the Administrative Code that the Agreement include an indemnification of the City for the infringement of patent rights; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives the requirement contained in Section 6.57 (c) of the Administrative Code that the Agreement include a paragraph reciting the false claim provisions contained in Section 6.57 (a) of the Administrative Code; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Director of Public Health to enter into similar agreements with the Office of Emergency Services if the grant recurs or is renewed; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors does hereby waive indirect costs; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That although the City has incurred no legal obligation, the Board of Supervisors does hereby ratify the action previously taken.
