[EDGEHILL WAY CONTROLS - FINDINGS]

ADOPTING FINDINGS AS TO THE LOCAL CONDITIONS REQUIRING AMENDMENTS TO THE STATE BUILDING CODE FOR BUILDINGS, AS REQUIRED BY THE CALIFORNIA HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE, IN CONJUNCTION WITH CREATION OF THE EDGEHILL MOUNTAIN SLOPE PROTECTION AREA.

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors, concurrent with this resolution, adopted certain amendments to the San Francisco Building Code creating the Edgehill Mountain Slope Protection Area ("EMSPA") and imposing more stringent documentation and review standards for certain permits within the EMSPA then would otherwise be required under the Building Code; and,

WHEREAS, The above-referenced EMSPA amendments are found in Board of Supervisors File Number 991768; and,

WHEREAS, The aforesaid San Francisco Building Code amendments differ in part from the State Building Code for buildings; and,

WHEREAS, California Health and Safety Code Section 17958.5 requires the City to furnish to the California Building Standards Commission reasons for amending the State Building Code based upon local conditions; and,

WHEREAS, Topographic and geologic conditions exist in the EMSPA such as steep hills, slide areas and other geologic features, such that there is an increased likelihood of landslides, earth movement, ground shaking and subsidence in the EMSPA which may threaten new structures or structural additions; and

WHEREAS, Such unique conditions present special dangers to the public health, safety and welfare unless special provisions are added to the State Building Code to require more stringent documentation and review of permit applications in the EMSPA for

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors has reviewed the above statement of reasons for the amendments; and,

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors finds and determines that these amendments to

(1) construction of new buildings or structures or (2) alterations that involve a substantial

increase in the envelope of existing buildings or structures; and

the State Building Code are necessary because of the local conditions set forth above; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors finds and determines that these amendments to the State Building Code are necessary because of local conditions for the reasons set forth above; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors is hereby directed to transmit this resolution together with a copy of the amendments to the San Francisco Building Code creating the Edgehill Mountain Slope Protection Area ("EMSPA") and imposing certain requirements within the EMSPA, adopted in conjunction with these findings in Board of Supervisors File No. 991768, to the California Building Standards Commission for filing, pursuant to the applicable provisions of law.
