3	Resolution supporting AB 117 which concerns community aggregation of power by
4	local agencies.
5	
6	WHEREAS, The primary purpose of the San Francisco Local Agency Formation
7	Commission (San Francisco LAFCo or Commission) under the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg
8	Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 is to review public service needs,
9	including utility service, and to determine whether new government entities should be
10	created or changes in existing governments should be made to address the needs of its
11	citizens; and
12	WHEREAS, The Commission adopted by resolution its Energy Services Study
13	and Recommendations for Electric Utility Service, and recommended that the
14	Commission pursue the feasibility of implementing the provisions of AB 117 (Chapter
15	838, Statutes of 2002) by the City and County of San Francisco; and
16	WHEREAS, A copy of the AB 117 Assessment Report for the City and County of
17	San Francisco is in the LAFCo file.
18	WHEREAS, The Commission selected R. W. Beck to prepare such a study; and
19	WHEREAS, The Commission adopted a resolution accepting the report, and
20	recommends that the City and County of San Francisco perform the following to
21	improve the power supply, transmission, and distribution to the city and County of San
22	Francisco:
23	The San Francisco Local Agency Formation Commission hereby recommends that the
24	City and County of San Francisco perform the following to improve the power supply,
25	transmission, and distribution to the City and County of San Francisco:

1	1.	Request that	the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) implement the
2		provisions of	AB 117 by taking those steps required under the legislation for
3		implementat	on of community aggregation including identifying financial assistance
4		to local comm	munities to develop Implementation Plans for Community Aggregation
5		Programs. T	The City and County of San Francisco may not proceed under AB 117
6		until the CPU	JC has adopted rules for implementing community choice aggregation.
7	2.	Determine w	hether an Implementation Plan should be filed with the CPUC and
8		develop app	ropriate staffing levels and revenue sources as necessary to prepare
9		the Impleme	ntation Plan for Community Aggregation. If approved, the City and
10		County of Sa	an Francisco would adopt an Ordinance to implement Community
11		Aggregation	in compliance with AB 117 and CPUC rules and regulations.
12	3.	Prepare an I	mplementation Plan for submittal to the California Public Utilities
13		Commission	consistent with the requirements of AB 117 Community Choice
14		Aggregation	legislation (Chapter 838 Statutes of 2002) to include the following
15		information of	consistent with the AB 117 Assessment Report:
16		a.	An organizational structure of the program, its operations and its
17			funding.
18		b.	Rate setting and other costs to the participants.
19		C.	Provisions for disclosure and due process in setting rates and
20			allocating costs among participants.
21		d.	The methods for entering and terminating agreements with other
22			entities.
23		e.	The rights and responsibilities of program participants, including, but
24			not limited to, consumer protection procedures, credit issues, and

shutoff procedures.

1	f. Termination of the program.
2	g. A description of the third parties that will be supplying electricity under
3	the program, including, but not limited to, information about financial,
4	technical, and operational capabilities.
5	4. Continue to monitor and support legislative and regulatory activities that provide
6	Direct Access and Community Aggregation; and
7	WHEREAS, The San Francisco Local Agency Formation Commission determines that
8	it is advisable for the Board of Supervisors to express its support for the implementation of AB
9	117; now therefore, be it
10	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors support the recommendations outlined in
11	the AB 117 Assessment Report for the City and County of San Francisco.
