Ordinance amending the Municipal Elections Code to remove the requirement that the Department of Elections publish the legal text of ballot measures in the Voter Information Pamphlet sent to voters before each election, and to allow the Director of Elections to determine the format of the Voter Information Pamphlet without the Ballot Simplification Committee's approval.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Article V of the Municipal Elections Code is hereby amended by revising Sections 500 and 501 to read as follows:

SEC. 500. VOTER INFORMATION PAMPHLET; CONTENTS; FORMAT.

With respect to any election to be held in the City and County, the Director of Elections shall prepare a voter information pamphlet. The voter information pamphlet shall contain, in addition to any other material required by the Charter or by general law, the following materials:

* * * *

(c) Contents as to measures:

- (1) The identification of each measure by letter and title;
- (2) The City Attorney's statement or question for each measure;

1 (3) The digest of each measure prepared by the Ballot Simplification Committee;

2 (4) The Controller's financial analysis of each measure;

3 (5) An explanation of how the measure qualified for submission to the voters;

4 (A) If the measure was submitted to the voters by the Board of Supervisors, the
5 explanation required by Subsection (c)(5) of this Section shall identify those Supervisors who
6 voted for submission of the measure and those Supervisors who voted against submission of
7 the measure,

8 (B) If the measure was submitted to the voters by four or more members of the
9 Board of Supervisors, the explanation required by Subsection (c)(5) of this Section shall
10 identify those Supervisors who submitted the measure,

11 (C) If the measure was submitted to the voters by initiative petition, the
12 explanation required by Subsection (c)(5) of this Section shall include the number of valid
13 signatures of registered San Francisco voters that were required to qualify the measure for
14 the ballot, and the date on which the Director of Elections certified that the measure qualified
15 for the ballot;

16 (6) The opponent, proponent, rebuttal and paid arguments, if any, for or against
17 each measure;

18 (7) ~~For each measure, the Department of Elections shall full legal text of each Charter~~

(98) The following statement for each measure that would approve a development project or substantial land use or zoning changes on land transferred in trust to the City, acting by and through the Port Commission, under the Burton Act, Chapter 1333 of the Statutes of 1968, as it has been amended and may be amended in the future: "Measure _____ involves the San Francisco waterfront, which includes sovereign lands that the State of California has legislatively granted to the City. These waterfront lands and their resources are protected by the common law public trust doctrine and the City holds them in trust on behalf of all the People of California."

~~Measures, and t~~The material specified in this Section relating to ~~said~~ measures, shall be printed in the voter information pamphlet in the same order in which designated upon the ballot.

If space allows, the items specified in subsections (c)(1) to (c)(5) shall be printed together on the same page of the voter information pamphlet. This page shall be known as the "ballot measure title page." The ballot measure title page shall also indicate: the page number at which the arguments for or against the measure are printed; and, if applicable the page number at which the definitions of terms appearing on ballot measure title page are printed.

~~The item specified in subsection (c)(9) shall be printed immediately preceding the legal text for the measure.~~

The format of the voter information pamphlet shall be determined by the Director of Elections, ~~subject to the approval of the Ballot Simplification Committee.~~

12 Section 2. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors
13 intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,
14 numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal
15 Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
16 additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the “Note” that appears under
17 the official title of the ordinance.

1 Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective on the 31st day after
2 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
3 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
4 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

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LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Municipal Elections Code - Voter Information Pamphlets]

Ordinance amending the Municipal Elections Code to remove the requirement that the Department of Elections publish the legal text of ballot measures in the Voter Information Pamphlet sent to voters before each election, and to allow the Director of Elections to determine the format of the Voter Information Pamphlet without the Ballot Simplification Committee's approval.

Existing Law

The Municipal Elections Code requires the Department of Elections ("Department") to prepare a Voter Information Pamphlet ("VIP") in advance of every municipal election. The VIP includes information about candidates and local ballot measures to be voted on at the election, as well as general election information. The Department provides the VIP to every registered San Francisco voter.

Section 500 of the Municipal Elections Code specifies the material that must be printed in the VIP. The VIP must include the full legal text of each ballot measure amending the Charter. The VIP must include the full legal text of all other local ballot measures unless the text exceeds 100 pages. In that event, the VIP must contain the first 20 pages of the legal text. When the full legal text of a ballot measure is not included in the VIP, the Department posts the legal text of that measure on its website, provides the legal text to the San Francisco Public Library, and mails a copy of the legal text to any voter upon request. The VIP also includes notices explaining how voters can access the full legal text.

The Director of Elections determines the format of the VIP, subject to the approval of the Ballot Simplification Committee ("BSC").

Section 501 of the Municipal Elections Code specifies the format for printing the legal text of ballot measures and requires that Charter Amendment proposals submitted to the electors by the Board of Supervisors be published in the official newspaper of the City.

Amendments to Current Law

This ordinance would amend Section 500 of the Municipal Elections Code by removing the requirement that the legal text of all local ballot measures be printed in the VIP. The ordinance would also remove the BSC's authority to approve the VIP format. The ordinance also amends Section 501 of the Municipal Elections Code to remove related printing specifications for legal text and makes other clarifying and non-substantive amendments.

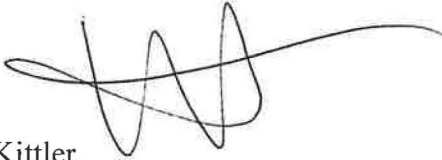
