

1 [Police Department Permit Fees]

3 **Ordinance amending the San Francisco Police Code, Article 1, by amending Section 2.1**  
4 **to include a definition of “service fee” and amending Sections 2.26 and 2.27 to increase**  
5 **or establish certain Police Department permit filing, service and license fees and to**  
6 **delete duplicative or obsolete language, and making environmental findings.**

10 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

11 Section 1. Environmental Findings. The Planning Department has determined that the  
12 actions contemplated in this Ordinance are in compliance with the California Environmental  
13 Quality Act (California Public Resources Code sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is  
14 on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. \_\_\_\_\_ and is  
15 incorporated herein by reference.

17 Section 2. The San Francisco Police Code is hereby amended by amending Section  
18 2.1, to read as follows:

19 SEC. 2.1. - DEFINITIONS.

20 (a) Filing Fee. A filing fee is a fee levied by the Department to reimburse it for all costs,  
21 direct and indirect, including an allocatable portion of fixed overhead costs, incurred in  
22 processing any permit application or application for amendment to a permit, and in conducting  
23 any investigation connected therewith.

24 (b) License Fee. A license fee is a fee levied by the Department on behalf of the City to  
25 reimburse the City for the costs incurred by the City in engaging in regulatory, inspection, and

1 police activities in connection with the type of activity, business, profession, calling or event  
2 authorized by each type of permit approved by the San Francisco Police Department or  
3 Entertainment Commission.

4 (c) Service Fee. A service fee is a fee levied by the Department to reimburse it for services  
5 providing in processing or investigating any permit application or application for amendment to or  
6 renewal of a permit, which amount is not included in the filing fee, and includes fees for fingerprinting,  
7 criminal history background checks, and advertising and notices.

9 Section 3. The San Francisco Police Code is hereby amended by amending Section  
10 2.26, to read as follows:

11 SEC. 2.26 - SCHEDULE OF PERMITS AND SERVICES; FILING AND SERVICE FEES.

12 The following filing fees, payable in advance to the City and County of San Francisco,  
13 are required when submitting applications for permits to the Police Department or  
14 Entertainment Commission:

Section 4. The San Francisco Police Code is hereby amended by amending Section 2.27 to read as follows:

SECTION 2.27. SCHEDULE OF LICENSE FEES FOR PERMITS ISSUED BY THE POLICE DEPARTMENT OR ENTERTAINMENT COMMISSION.

The following license fees are payable to the Tax Collector for permits issued by the Police Department or Entertainment Commission and, when applicable, for their renewal:
