Shelters Across All Districts]

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Housing (HSH) to explore and implement a fair distribution of new homeless shelters 5 across all districts in the City and County of San Francisco.

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco continues to face a homelessness crisis, with an estimated 7,175 individuals and 405 families experiencing homelessness as of the 2024 Point-in-Time Count; and

Resolution urging the Mayor and the Department of Homelessness and Supportive

WHEREAS, Addressing homelessness continues to be a top priority for the city, requiring a comprehensive and balanced approach to provide shelter, services, and long-term housing solutions; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing (HSH) has made efforts to expand shelter capacity and provide supportive housing, however, the inequitable distribution of shelters across the City geography persists; and

WHEREAS, The burden of addressing homelessness has disproportionately fallen on certain districts, particularly District's 10, 9, 6 and 5, which have consistently borne the brunt of shelter and service sites; and

WHEREAS, According to data from HSH, as of September 2023, San Francisco had approximately 3,140 homeless shelter beds across 50 active sites - excluding confidential locations - with the majority concentrated in District 6, while Districts 1, 2, 4, and 7 on the city's west side had only seven combined; and

WHEREAS, The districts most impacted by this inequitable distribution of shelters and services are predominately home to communities of color and lower-income residents, further

exacerbating systemic inequities and disproportionately impacting those already marginalized; and

WHEREAS, The lack of equitable distribution of shelters and services across the city places undue strain on specific communities while leaving other areas underutilized in addressing this citywide crisis; and

WHEREAS, Addressing homelessness is a shared responsibility that requires collective action and resource allocation across all neighborhoods so that no single district or a few districts are overburdened; and

WHEREAS, In 2017, Supervisors Jane Kim, Hillary Ronen, and Malia Cohen introduced Board of Supervisors File No. 170568, urging the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing to create an approval process and criteria for establishing new homeless services and facilities that account for citywide geography equity and distribution of appropriate services; and

WHEREAS, It is critical for the City to consider potential shelter sites in districts that currently have fewer facilities and to ensure that all residents have equitable access to resources and services; and

WHEREAS, The Mayor and HSH have the authority and resources to lead the city to adopt equitable, citywide strategies to address homelessness and ensure that all districts contribute fairly to housing and shelter solutions; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urge the Mayor and HSH to explore and implement a fair distribution of new homeless shelters across all districts in San Francisco; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urge the Mayor and HSH to engage in transparent and inclusive community outreach and planning processes to ensure

that new shelter sites are fairly distributed, sustainable, and supported by their respective neighborhoods; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urge the Mayor and HSH actively work to address the disproportionate impacts of homelessness and services siting on communities of color and lower-income neighborhoods by prioritizing equity and fairness in their planning and decision-making processes; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Resolution affirms the City's commitment to addressing homelessness as a shared responsibility, ensuring that every district contributes to the solutions necessary to uphold the dignity and safety of all San Franciscans, while prioritizing equity and justice for the communities most affected and impacted by the current distribution of service and shelter sites.
