AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH, POPULATION HEALTH AND PREVENTION, TO ACCEPT RETROACTIVELY AND EXPEND A GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$25,000 FROM THE OPEN SOCIETY INSTITUTE, THE LINDESMITH CENTER, FOR THE "BRIDGING THE GAP" CONFERENCE AND TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WHICH DOES DOES NOT INCLUDE PATENT INFRINGEMENT INDEMNIFICATION AND FALSE CLAIMS CLAUSES; PROVIDING FOR RATIFICATION OF ACTION PREVIOUSLY TAKEN.

WHEREAS. The Department of Public Health has applied for and been awarded a grant from the Open Society Institute, the Lindesmith Center, in the amount of \$25,000 to fund the "Bridging the Gap" Conference; and,

WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the grant funds, the Open Society Institute, Lindesmith Center, requires the City to enter into an agreement (the "Agreement"), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 990257; and,

WHEREAS, the Open Society Institute, Lindesmith Center, has indicated that it will not agree to any modification to the form of the Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, The Agreement does not contain certain provisions described below, which are required under the Administrative Code unless waived by the Board of Supervisors; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Health is hereby authorized to accept retroactively and expend the grant funds pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code section 10.170-1; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the Agreement in behalf of the City; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives the requirement contained in Sections 6.21 and 21.19 of the Administrative Code that the Agreement include an indemnification of the City by for the infringement of patent rights; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives the requirement contained in Section 6.57 (c) of the Administrative Code that the Agreement include a paragraph reciting the false claim provisions contained in Section 6.57 (a) of the Administrative Code; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Director of Public Health to enter into similar agreements with the Open Society Institute, Lindesmith Center, if the grant recurs or is renewed; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That although the City has incurred no legal obligation, the

Board of Supervisors does hereby ratify the action previously taken; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Controller should be urged to designate the position created under the grant as an "L" or Limited-Tenure position, which RECOMMENDED: would terminate when the grant APPROVED: expires.
