[Liquor License Transfer, 1092 Post Street]

Resolution determining that the transfer of a Type 48 on-sale general public premises liquor license from 1028 Geary Street to 1092 Post Street (District 6) to Mark Aloiau for M K Aloiau LLC, dba Mark's Bar, will serve the public convenience or necessity of the people of the City and County of San Francisco, in accordance with Section 23958.4 of the California Business and Professions Code, with conditions.

WHEREAS, Mark Aloiau is seeking a transfer of a Type 48 on-sale general public premises liquor license from 1028 Geary Street to 1092 Post Street for M K Aloiau LLC, dba Mark's Bar; and,

WHEREAS, The Planning Department has verified that the area is properly zoned and recommends approval; and,

WHEREAS, The Police Department recommends that the liquor license application be approved with conditions; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That in accordance with Section 23958.4 of the California Business and Professions Code, the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby determines for the foregoing reasons that the transfer of a Type 48 on-sale general public premises liquor license from 1028 Geary Street to 1092 Post Street to Mark Aloiau for M K Aloiau LLC, dba Mark's Bar, will serve the public convenience or necessity of the people of the City and County of San Francisco.

Conditions: (1) Sales, service and consumption of alcoholic beverages shall be permitted only between the hours of 12 noon – 2:00 a.m. each day of the week. (2) Noise ("noise is defined as any raucous sound that is produced in such a manner or to such a degree as

to disturb the peace, quiet, and comfort of persons in the neighborhood") shall not be audible beyond the area under the control of the licensee. (3) The sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption off the premises is strictly prohibited. (4) The interior lighting maintained therein shall be sufficient to make easily discernible the appearance and conduct of all persons and patrons in that portion of the premises where alcoholic beverages are sold, served, delivered or consumed. (5) Petitioner shall not make structural changes in the premises interior without prior written approval from the Department. (6) The petitioner shall utilize electronic surveillance and recording equipment that is able to view inside and outside the premises and that is actively maintained and recorded. This electronic surveillance shall be in place during operating hours. Said electronic recording shall be kept up to (72) hours and shall be made available to the Department or Police Department upon demand.
