

[SAN FRANCISCO SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM]

AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO RETROACTIVELY, ACCEPT AND EXPEND A GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF TWENTY SEVEN THOUSAND, FOUR HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$27,400.00) FROM THE CALIFORNIA INTEGRATED MANAGEMENT BOARD FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPLEMENTING "FOOD SCRAP DIVERSION AT SCHOOLS."

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Recycling Program will implement the "Food Scrap Diversion at High Volume Site Project" with the assistance of the California Integrated Waste Management Board. The California Integrated Waste Management Board's Greening Team has identified decreased waste of commercial and institutional food waste as a target for helping local jurisdictions achieve their mandated 50 percent diversion requirement and established a goal by 2000; and,

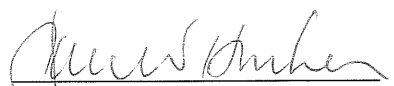
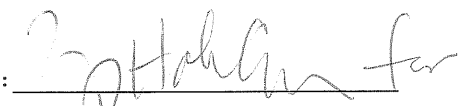
WHEREAS, Based upon the evaluation of the CIWMB Request for Proposals, The City and County of San Francisco, Solid Waste Management Program was the recipient of funds to be used for an award of \$27,400 in "Food Scrap Diversion at High Volume Sites Project" (IWM-C9061); and,

WHEREAS, The Solid Waste Management Program proposes to maximize use of available funds on program expenditures by not including indirect costs in the grant budget; and,

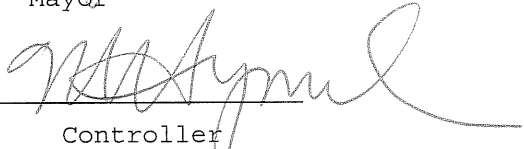

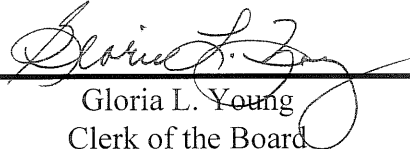

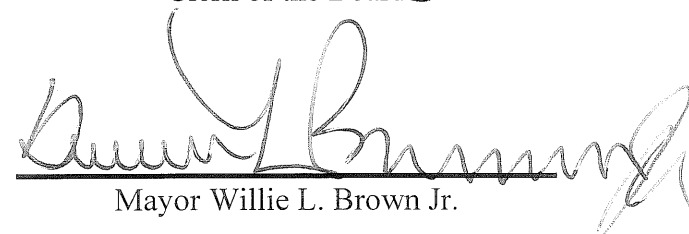
