COMMENDING SAN FRANCISCO COUNTY JUVENILE PROBATION DEPARTMENT FOR THE SMOOTH AND EFFICIENT OPERATION OF THE SAN FRANCISCO LOG CABIN RANCH AND PASSING ALL INSPECTIONS WITH SATISFACTORY RESULTS; AND FURTHER URGING THE SAN FRANCISCO COUNTY JUVENILE PROBATION DEPARTMENT TO DEVELOP A PLAN TO ADDRESS SHORTAGE OF THE AMOUNT OF EMERGENCY VEHICLES AND THE SHORTAGE OF THE NUMBER OF SEATS CURRENTLY AVAILABLE THAT IS NEEDED TO EVACUATE STAFF AND CLIENTS IN THE EVENT OF A FIRE OR OTHER NATURAL DISASTERS.

WHEREAS, On May 25, 1999, the Board of Corrections (BOC) conducted its biennial inspection of the San Francisco County Log Cabin Ranch which is minimum security camp for males operated by the San Francisco County Juvenile Probation Department located in La Honda in the Santa Cruz mountains; and

WHEREAS, The biennial inspection is done in conjunction with annual medical inspection of clients conducted on march 23, 1999, environmental conditions inspection on February 26, 1999, nutritional health inspection conducted on March 18, 1999, building safety inspection on April 29, 1999, a Juvenile Justice Commission hearing held on April 28, 1999, and a Juvenile Court hearing held on November 12, 1998; and

WHEREAS, The results of the past inspections and the biennial inspection complete in May indicate that the Log Cabin Ranch is a safe environment to house minors; and

WHEREAS, The inspection indicated that the dormitory grounds were clean and without graffiti and well maintained, and an adjacent pond was cleared and stocked with fish so that the young men could fish in pond; and

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WHEREAS, Review of the curriculum indicate that the programs and therapeutic group sessions offered are responsive to the educational, medical, and vocational needs of the minors and their families such as violence reduction, family reunification, teen fathers, Bible study, substance abuse, victim impact, social survival skills, health awareness, environmental focus and multi-ethnic diversity and awareness and elective courses which include computer literacy, woodshop and drafting, drama and art, and music; and

WHEREAS, Morale amongst staff is very positive in which members take pride in the work they do; and

WHEREAS, Interactions between staff and minors were also congenial in which the minors appeared relaxed and comfortable, the minors liked the food and found the food to be ample and tasty; and ;

WHEREAS, However, the Fire Safety Plan under Section 1325 of the Policy and Procedure Manual requires that the facility to have a written evacuation plan in which both staff and minors and transported away from the facilities in case of a fire and other natural disasters; and;

WHEREAS, Inspection results indicate that because the facilities are located in a densely located wooded remote area and the potential for forest fires is very high, the facility needs to address the lack of emergency vehicles and the shortage of seats currently available to evacuees; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco commends the San Francisco County Juvenile Probation Department for the smooth and efficient operation of the San Francisco Log Cabin Ranch and passing all inspections with satisfactory results; and

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors urges the San Francisco County Juvenile Probation Department to develop a plan to address shortage of the amount of emergency vehicles and the number of seats currently available needed to evacuate staff and clients in the event of a fire or other natural disasters.
