

1 [Accept and Expend Grant - Retroactive - Centers for Disease Control and Prevention -  
2 PS20-2010: Integrated Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) Programs for Health  
3 Departments to Support Ending the HIV Epidemic in the United States - \$3,090,288]

4 **Resolution retroactively authorizing the Department of Public Health to accept and**  
5 **expend a grant increase in the amount of \$350,000 for a total amount of \$3,090,288**  
6 **from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for participation in a program,**  
7 **entitled “PS20-2010: Integrated Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) Programs for**  
8 **Health Departments to Support Ending the HIV Epidemic in the United States,” for the**  
9 **period of August 1, 2021, through July 31, 2022.**

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11 WHEREAS, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has agreed to  
12 fund the Department of Public Health (DPH) a grant increase in the amount of \$350,000 for a  
13 total amount of \$3,090,288 for the period of August 1, 2021, through July 31, 2022; and

14 WHEREAS, San Francisco (SF) has implemented a data-driven high impact prevention  
15 (HIP) strategy over the last decade, and human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) surveillance  
16 data has shown significant reductions in new HIV diagnoses and increasing linkage to care  
17 and number of people living with HIV who are virally suppressed; and

18 WHEREAS, Most new infections continue to occur at high rates among people of color,  
19 trans-women, people experiencing homelessness (PEH), and people who use and inject  
20 drugs (PWU/ID); and

21 WHEREAS, SF proposes to reduce new HIV infections by 75% by 2025 and by 90%  
22 by 2030; and

23 WHEREAS, SF’s Component A proposal will address overlapping vulnerabilities,  
24 health disparities and inequities, and use a community and individual approach to address the  
25 root causes, thereby increasing access to treatment and prevention; and

1           WHEREAS, SF's Component C proposal will address more timely identification of HIV  
2 status, increasing capacity through expansion of express visits, and reducing HIV disparities  
3 by increasing the proportion of patients who are most vulnerable to HIV; and

4           WHEREAS, A grant increase of \$350,000 from \$2,740,288 was approved for the  
5 period of August 1, 2021, through July 31, 2022; and

6           WHEREAS, The grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance Amendment; and

7           WHEREAS, A request for retroactive approval is being sought because DPH received  
8 the revised award agreement on October 13, 2021, for a project start date of August 1, 2021;  
9 and

10          WHEREAS, The grant budget includes a provision for indirect costs in the amount of  
11 \$183,304; now, therefore, be it

12          RESOLVED, That DPH is hereby authorized to retroactively accept and expend a grant  
13 in the amount of \$3,090,288 from the CDC; and, be it

14          FURTHER RESOLVED, That DPH is hereby authorized to retroactively accept and  
15 expend the grant funds pursuant to Administrative Code, Section 10.170-1; and, be it

16          FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the  
17 Agreement on behalf of the City; and, be it

18          FURTHER RESOLVED, That within thirty (30) days of the Grant Agreement being fully  
19 executed by all parties, the Director of Health shall provide a copy to the Clerk of the Board of  
20 Supervisors for inclusion in the official file.
