7 WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors wishes to authorize the listed Board Member(s)
8 supporting the following ballot measure(s) to prepare and submit a written proponent ballot
9 argument(s) and proponent rebuttal argument(s) for submittal to the Director of Elections:

- 11 • Charter Amendment (Fourth Draft) to amend the Charter of the City and County of
12 San Francisco to require an annual baseline appropriation for the Park, Recreation
13 and Open Space Fund based on City spending for park and recreation purposes in
14 FY2015-2016, extend the annual set-aside and the baseline appropriation for 15
15 years to FY2045-2046, and modify the Recreation and Park Department’s planning
16 obligations to include equity analysis and Board of Supervisors review, at an
17 election to be held on June 7, 2016. (Supervisors Farrell, Mar, Wiener, Yee, Breed,
18 Cohen, Avalos)

 - 20 • Charter Amendment (First Draft) to amend the Charter of the City and County of
21 San Francisco to authorize the Board of Supervisors to update the inclusionary or
22 affordable housing obligations for housing development projects, and setting forth
23 increased interim requirements; and affirming the Planning Department’s
24 determination under the California Environmental Quality Act, at an election to be
25 held on June 7, 2016. (Supervisors Kim, Peskin, Mar, Avalos, Campos)

- 1 • Motion ordering submitted to the voters an Ordinance amending the Administrative
2 Code to revise the City’s Paid Sick Leave Ordinance (PSLO) to include protections
3 for employees under the PSLO that largely parallel recent State law enactments
4 pertaining to paid sick leave, primarily the Healthy Workplaces, Healthy Families
5 Act of 2014, as amended, at an election to be held on June 7, 2016. (Mayor,
6 Supervisors Breed, Mar, Farrell, Peskin, Tang, Kim, Yee, Wiener, Campos, Cohen,
7 Avalos)

- 9 • Motion ordering submitted to the voters an Ordinance amending the Administrative
10 Code to require the Office of Citizen Complaints to investigate all officer-involved
11 shootings, at an election to be held on June 7, 2016. (Supervisors Cohen, Breed,
12 Campos)

- 14 • Ordinance calling and providing for a special election to be held in the City and
15 County of San Francisco on Tuesday, June 7, 2016, for the purpose of submitting to
16 San Francisco voters a proposition to incur the following bonded debt of the City
17 and County: \$350,000,000 to finance the construction, acquisition, improvement,
18 seismic strengthening and betterment of critical community and mental health,
19 emergency response and safety, and homeless shelter and service facilities and
20 related costs necessary or convenient for the foregoing purposes; authorizing
21 landlords to pass-through 50% of the resulting property tax increase to residential
22 tenants in accordance with Administrative Code, Chapter 37; finding that the
23 estimated cost of such proposed project is and will be too great to be paid out of the
24 ordinary annual income and revenue of the City and County and will require
25

1 expenditures greater than the amount allowed therefor by the annual tax levy;
2 reciting the estimated cost of such proposed project; fixing the date of election and
3 the manner of holding such election and the procedure for voting for or against the
4 proposition; fixing the maximum rate of interest on such bonds and providing for the
5 levy and collection of taxes to pay both principal and interest; prescribing notice to
6 be given of such election; adopting findings under the California Environmental
7 Quality Act ("CEQA"), CEQA Guidelines, and Administrative Code, Chapter 31;
8 finding that the proposed bond is in conformity with the eight priority policies of
9 Planning Code, Section 101.1(b), and with the General Plan, consistency
10 requirement of Charter, Section 4.105, and Administrative Code, Section 2A.53;
11 consolidating the special election with the general election; establishing the election
12 precincts, voting places and officers for the election; waiving the word limitation on
13 ballot propositions imposed by Municipal Elections Code, Section 510; complying
14 with the restrictions on the use of bond proceeds specified in California Government
15 Code, Section 53410; incorporating the provisions regarding the citizens' bond
16 oversight committee in Administrative Code, Sections 5.30-5.36; and waiving the
17 time requirements specified in Administrative Code, Section 2.34. (Mayor,
18 Supervisors Breed, Farrell, Mar)

21 inclusionary affordable housing fee requirement. (Supervisor Kim, Peskin, Campos,

1 WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors wishes to authorize the listed Board Member(s)
2 opposed to the following ballot measure(s) to prepare and submit a written opponent ballot
3 argument(s) and rebuttal ballot argument(s) for submittal to the Director of Elections:

5 of San Francisco to require an annual baseline appropriation for the Park,
6 Recreation and Open Space Fund based on City spending for park and
7 recreation purposes in FY2015-2016, extend the annual set-aside and the
8 baseline appropriation for 15 years to FY2045-2046, and modify the Recreation
9 and Park Department’s planning obligations to include equity analysis and Board
10 of Supervisors review, at an election to be held on June 7, 2016. (Supervisors
11 Peskin, Tang)

- 12 • Ordinance calling and providing for a special election to be held in the City and
13 County of San Francisco on Tuesday, June 7, 2016, for the purpose of
14 submitting to San Francisco voters a proposition to incur the following bonded
15 debt of the City and County: \$350,000,000 to finance the construction,
16 acquisition, improvement, seismic strengthening and betterment of critical
17 community and mental health, emergency response and safety, and homeless
18 shelter and service facilities and related costs necessary or convenient for the
19 foregoing purposes; authorizing landlords to pass-through 50% of the resulting
20 property tax increase to residential tenants in accordance with Administrative
21 Code, Chapter 37; finding that the estimated cost of such proposed project is
22 and will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue
23 of the City and County and will require expenditures greater than the amount

1 allowed therefor by the annual tax levy; reciting the estimated cost of such
2 proposed project; fixing the date of election and the manner of holding such
3 election and the procedure for voting for or against the proposition; fixing the
4 maximum rate of interest on such bonds and providing for the levy and collection
5 of taxes to pay both principal and interest; prescribing notice to be given of such
6 election; adopting findings under the California Environmental Quality Act
7 ("CEQA"), CEQA Guidelines, and Administrative Code, Chapter 31; finding that
8 the proposed bond is in conformity with the eight priority policies of Planning
9 Code, Section 101.1(b), and with the General Plan, consistency requirement of
10 Charter, Section 4.105, and Administrative Code, Section 2A.53; consolidating
11 the special election with the general election; establishing the election precincts,
12 voting places and officers for the election; waiving the word limitation on ballot
13 propositions imposed by Municipal Elections Code, Section 510; complying with
14 the restrictions on the use of bond proceeds specified in California Government
15 Code, Section 53410; incorporating the provisions regarding the citizens' bond
16 oversight committee in Administrative Code, Sections 5.30-5.36; and waiving the
17 time requirements specified in Administrative Code, Section 2.34. (Supervisor

22 economic feasibility studies.
 - 23 • Declaration of Policy submitted by the Mayor to the voters at the June 7, 2016,
24 Election entitled "Declaration of Policy declaring it official policy of the City and

1 County of San Francisco to invest in the future of transportation by prioritizing
2 investment in Muni infrastructure and vehicles, including buses and light rail; road
3 repaving and pothole repair; "Vision Zero" safety projects and other bicycle and
4 pedestrian safety improvements; and investment in regional transportation
5 infrastructure and vehicles that serve San Franciscans such as BART and Caltrain
6 in the expenditure of revenues from future revenue ballot measures."

9 WHEREAS, The Board Member(s) authorized by this motion to submit the ballot
10 arguments will submit the proponent or opponent argument to the Director of Elections no
11 later than the deadline of noon, March 17, 2016, and the respective rebuttal ballot argument
12 no later than noon, March 21, 2016; now, therefore, be it

13 MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Board Member(s) listed
14 above, under the provisions of Elections Code, Sections 530 and 550, to prepare and submit
15 written proponent and opponent ballots argument and respective rebuttal ballot arguments on
16 the listed measures; and, be it

17 FURTHER MOVED, That the Board Member(s) who are authorized by this motion to
18 prepare and submit arguments, may authorize or assign to any other person(s) under the
19 provisions of Elections Code, Sections 530 and 550 (c) and (d), the right to prepare and
20 submit the proponent or opponent's ballot arguments and/or respective rebuttal arguments.
